

# From the Pastor on the zoth Sunday in Ordinary Time Theme: God Hears a Humble Prayer

The first reading today is from the book of Sirach, one of the Wisdom books. This book teaches us among other things: God has no favorites, the prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds and will reach its goal.

We can compare this to the Gospel today from Saint Luke which presents us with two people, both praying. The first person tells God all that he has done that is good. The other simply tells God that he is a sinner. The sinner is heard.

There is so much fear today of admitting that we are sinners or about defining ourselves as sinners. We would rather be known as children of God, as those loved by God. Both ways of looking at us are true. On the other hand, although we are children of God and loved by God, we are not faithful to Him and do not respond to His love. He never rejects us. Both descriptions of us are true and yet from our side, truly we are only sinners and merit nothing and that is a truth from which we should not hide.


We can always rejoice that He loves us, that He invites us to share His life, that He constantly reaches out to us no matter how many times we turn away. We need to have that confidence in Him. Yet we should never be ashamed to admit: I am a sinner and unworthy of His love.

What a miracle that He loves us! What infinite compassion He has towards us! What tender mercy He shows to us!

The second Letter to Timothy gives us the perspective of Saint Paul: I have kept in the race, I have persevered, I trust in the Lord. The race is simply to live our life here on earth with this total trust in God, no matter how often we fail or turn aside. We know the truth of this life: God loves us. We know the path of this life: love of God and love of our neighbor, especially our enemy. We know that He will always give us the strength to believe if we only ask Him.

Today, God invites us to see ourselves as we are. The more humbly we live, the more confidence we have in His love and compassion. Let us take the time today to pray as did the tax collector:

"Jord, be merciful to me, a sinner."





# a Family of Ministries

The St. Joseph Finance Committee has analyzed our current status for the ongoing vision of maintaining our ministry services offered to our parishioners and our aging church and parish school/hall. As we head into 2020 and beyond, it is important we manage our finances well to ensure our parish remains viable for future generations.

This, however, may prove to be a difficult task given that in the last ten years our parish has only seen 1% growth in membership. Current registration is 189 families and 407 members. Additionally, as previously shared in the bulletin, 2019 parish operational income was \$201,972 and operational expenses of \$194,513. If not for a one-time bequest of \$10,633 received, we would have ended FY 2019 with a \$3,174 shortfall.

In reviewing expenses, no major outstanding expenses were deemed to be out of control. In fact, with respect to payroll and benefits, we pay less having a missionary priest than if we had a diocesan priest which would require our parish to pay for his health benefits, car, cell phone, etc. Should this change, we could easily expect to see an increase in expenses of up to an additional \$10,000.

We do have an established trust fund with the diocese for use on major repairs for the church. This was the case with the necessary replacement of the air conditioning unit in 2018. The trust fund saw its highest balance of \$97,450 in 2011. However, constant repairs to the church since then leaves the fund at \$43,931. None of the withdrawals have been replenished.

In doing projections out, there are more costly projects for the parish on the horizon namely, a new roof for the school/hall, kitchen repairs/upgrade, furnace repairs/replacement, basement flooding repairs, and parking lot repairs. This is what we are aware of now, but we must be ever ready for other unexpected surprises like we experienced with the August storm resulting in significant rectory damage and expenses not covered by insurance.

# How can we work together to proactively prepare to live our vision of sustaining and preserving our parish's legacy for the future?

The answer is stewardship! While we usually only speak of stewardship in terms of Time, Talent and Treasure, the truth is that stewardship involves all of life—body, mind and spirit, our material possessions, friendships, etc. All we are and have is a gift from our Creator for us to use wisely to build up God's kingdom here on earth.




Father Rahab served as Parochial Administrator at this parish from 2009-2010.



We prepare for eternal life by choosing to love and follow God. Our journey with Christ includes equipping our




