

- Bulletin Submission Deadline: Wednesday, 12:00 pm





How can you make an impact now?

If you are currently not contributing in the parish offering and/or Maintenance Reserve Fund, prayerfully consider supporting the parish with a weekly or monthly gift. Currently, only 32.8% of our registered families support the church financially. If the remaining non-participating families contributed just \$6 per week--the cost of a McDonald's Big Mac Value Meal--it would result in an additional \$39,000 in revenue for our parish.

If you are already contributing in the parish offering, first of all, thank you! Secondly, please consider increasing your gift by just \$6 per week. Doing so would result in up to \$19,344 in new income.

Consider contributing through Electronic Funds Transfers (EFT) to easily and automatically draft your monthly donation in lieu of using weekly envelopes. Funding tends to fluctuate monthly based on attendance at mass. Donations received through EFT can be consistently relied upon to help meet monthly expenses.

The key to understanding how God wants us to give to the Church is found in 1 Corinthians 16:2, "On the first day of the week [Sunday] each of you should set aside whatever he can afford," and again in 2 Corinthians 9:5-8, "So I thought it necessary to encourage the brothers to go on ahead to you and arrange in advance for your promised gift [donation], so that in this way it might be ready as a bountiful gift and not as an exaction. Consider this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each must do as already determined without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. Moreover, God is able to make every grace abundant for you, so that in all things, always having all you need, you may have an abundance for every good work."

Actively volunteer within the parish. Currently, 20.6% of our active registered parishioners volunteer in some capacity with many individuals volunteering in multiple ministries.

Participate in parish fundraising activities such as SummerFest. This event last year returned \$7,500 to the repair and maintenance fund. All funds raised remain for the direct benefit of the parish. Your assistance selling raffle tickets to your friends and family and inviting them to attend adds to the success of this parish.

"Children, let us love not in word or speech, but in deed and truth." 1 John 3:18

Bring a friend with you to Mass and talk to your non-Catholic friends about the blessings of your faith and walk with Christ. More members in our parish family is a mutually beneficial blessing.

"So we are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God." 2 Corinthians 5:20

Committing to a parish is much like a commitment to a family, sports team, school or community organization. Just like you want the parish to be there to provide Masses, Sacraments, education programs and ministries, the parish needs to be able to count on you to help and assist in their mission; to be an active member.

By registering in the parish, you made a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of our parish. As parish members, we are all here to help each other on our spiritual journey; we don't want to do this alone. As much as you need your parish, you parish needs you too!

We buy insurance for our homes, cars, and even our cell phones to protect us against an emergency. Your contributions of time, talent and treasure to our parish is insurance for our parish's future to help sustain our parish for generations to come.




MOCAN
