

Dear Sisters and Brothers of Saint Therese Parish Community,

On October 4th, the feast day of Saint Francis of Assisi, our Holy Father Pope Francis issued an encyclical (a pastoral message to the Church and the world) entitled “Fratelli Tutti”. For those of you who speak Italian you know that means “we are all brothers and sisters”. Pope Francis obviously labored in love writing this encyclical over a very long time. I began reading it this week and, like many of our Holy Father’s writings, I found it to be inspiring and filled with food for thought. If you have a chance, give it a read. Pope Francis writes a great deal about “social friendship”, those bonds of caring that inspire us to reach out to one another, to care for each other, feed each other and keep each other safe emotionally and physically. He also encourages us to befriend nature, caring for our Mother Earth in order that many generations to come might have good food, clean water and a place to live safely. Remember when Jesus said “I call you my friends”? It is how Pope Francis sees all of us and how he encourages us to be Church - a community of friends.

I have been very blessed in my life with friends - that close group of people with whom I can say anything, be myself, even fail. It doesn’t matter to them how many trophies I have, or what I have (or don’t have) in the bank, or who I’m going to vote for. The love of a friend comes from a deeper place and I know I can count on them well into old age. Friends are there for each other, no matter what. It’s where the word “companion” comes from (“com pan”): the “one with whom I share my bread”.

One clear sign of friendship is how we are trying to protect each other during this pandemic, keeping each other safe and healthy. I know my hands are raw sometimes from washing, and my glasses stream up from the mask, and I miss hugs, and I sure would love to get to know what all of you look like! But that can wait. The important thing is that as a community of friends we give each other a safe space and the right to life.

It is also about continuing to create a welcoming community here at Saint Therese. Most of us gather here on weekends for one or another Mass. Besides creating a safe environment we also want to create a welcoming one, a community of friends who gather to support and encourage one another. Pope Francis says that “the Eucharist is not a prize for the perfect but is nourishment and medicine for those on the journey”. So we welcome you, wherever on the journey you are. If you feel so moved, please make Saint Therese Parish your spiritual home.

These next weeks before the Presidential election are a time of discernment for each of us who are eligible to vote. In the quiet of our own hearts and minds we will choose to vote for that person whom we believe is best for the common good of our country and its citizens in the next four years. We vote not only for ourselves but for our children and grandchildren, and those most vulnerable in our society. Let us respect and pray for each other in this process and for the candidates which each political party has chosen to stand for election.

What's new from the desk of the Religious Education office...

It was no wonder that Jesus lost many of his followers, including some of His disciples who understandably so, would have been confused and perhaps angry when he said "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink" (Jn 6:54-55). What could He possibly have meant by this?

Yet losing followers didn't stop Jesus from being very clear in His teaching of the Eucharist in the synagogue, as we read in John's Gospel chapter 6, that the bread and wine are more than symbols; they are His true body and His true blood! For those disciples whose faith enabled them to stay with Jesus, even though they too didn't understand this difficult teaching, it would not be until the last meal they shared with Jesus and His death on the cross that the true meaning would be revealed to them.

As we the Church have celebrated Mass each and every day across the globe for the past two thousand years re-presenting the Last Supper with Jesus, we too participate in this Eucharistic sacrifice of thanksgiving and praise. The Real and living Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is at the very heart of who we are as Catholic Christians; it is the source and summit of our lives so that, although as human beings it can be very difficult at times, in everything we do in our day-to-day lives we strive to keep God at the center.

And so today, as together we celebrate one of the biggest celebrations for a Catholic family, the first time a child will become one with Jesus as they receive the Eucharist, we pray that over time these children will develop a deep and meaningful relationship with Jesus – a relationship that please God, will continue to grow deeper in love throughout their lifetime.

Congratulations kids and many blessings to all of you and your families on this very special day.







Embracing Goodness & Truth

"Woe to you that call evil good, and good evil; that put darkness for light, and light for darkness; that put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter." Isaiah 5:20

"Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship" from USCCB

Political and social questions require citizens to develop a well-formed conscience. "Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a 'feeling' about what we should or should not do. Rather, conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good and shunning evil."⁽¹⁾ "There are some things we must never do, as individuals or as a society, because they are always incompatible with love of God & neighbor and are called 'intrinsically evil' actions. These actions must always be rejected and opposed."⁽²⁾

In "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship" the US Conference of Catholic Bishops states, "The threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed."⁽³⁾

"As we all seek to advance the common good - by promoting religious freedom, by defending human life from the moment of conception until natural death, by defending marriage, by feeding the hungry and housing the homeless - it is important to recognize that not all possible courses of action are morally acceptable."⁽⁴⁾ The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Some things are always wrong and no one may deliberately vote in favor of them. Citizens support these evils indirectly if they vote in favor of candidates who propose to advance them."⁽⁵⁾

Pope Francis said, "We are living in an information driven society which bombards us indiscriminately with data - which leads to superficiality in the area of moral discernment. We need to develop critical thinking and encourage development of moral values."⁽⁶⁾

Happening Now: San Francisco Archbishop Denounces Draconian Restrictions
