FOOD FROM HEAVEN

God sustained the people of Israel for forty years in the desert with manna sent down from heaven, and Moses doesn't want them to forget it. God brought forth water from stone for them to drink, and Moses doesn't want them to forget this, either. And Moses tells them—twice—that the food that God sent was a food that neither they nor their ancestors before them had ever experienced before.

Jesus too speaks of food come down from heaven, food that the Jewish people had never experienced before. Recalling the manna in the desert, Jesus doesn't want them to forget it either, explaining that he is the food and drink of eternal life. Reopening of Public Worship!

Bishop Barres and the Diocese of Rockville Centre have been in close contact with County Executives Steven Bellone and Laura Curran over the past several weeks.

Both County Executives have been tremendously supportive and understanding of our deep desire to return to the celebration of public worship, for which we are grateful.

This past week, Bishop Barres informed our civil officials that the Diocese of Rockville Centre had decided to move forward with a date for reopening public worship with a percentage of our church's capacities, while observing reasonable and proper safety precautions.

On Saturday, June 6, Governor Cuomo announced that Houses of Worship in State Regions that have reached Phase 2 of his reopening plan may begin to host worship in churches at 25 percent of their capacity. Long Island will begin Phase 2 on Wednesday, June 10, 2020.

We are most grateful to Bishop Barres for taking the lead in promoting the right of the faithful to gather for public worship, and we deeply appreciate the support of our Long Island County Executives.

Directives are being distributed to all parishes throughout the Diocese along with supplies, in order to assist them in safely welcoming the faithful back to public Masses.

From Administrator's Desk: Letter to parishioners on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi

While celebrating the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, popularly known as *Corpus Christi*, we are reminded of one of the basic truths we believe as Catholics. Namely, that Jesus Christ is truly present with us under the appearance of bread and wine. We are reminded that the Eucharist is not a merely human action, nor it is a communal gathering, but a Real Presence during which people are united with God in the most intimate way. We find this especially in the reception of the Body and Blood of Christ, which we call Holy Communion, which ultimately leads us to union with God. Thus, the Eucharist is not a mere symbol! When we go to Mass it is Jesus Christ Himself whom we receive and are united too through the species of bread and wine. It is an awesome reality of God's presence.

St. John Paul II wrote: "the Eucharist is the central sacrament by which the whole Church lives." However, many today have a problem with accepting the doctrine of <u>THE REAL PRESENCE</u> of Christ in the Eucharist. This feast helps us to emphasize this truth, that although we still see the bread and wine, even after the words of the consecration, it is no longer bread and wine, but Christ Himself in the sacrament of the Eucharist.

The Eucharist is primarily God's action; it is Jesus' sacrifice made present again in a purely spiritual way but expressed in a bodily form of bread and wine transformed (consecrated) into Christ's Body and Blood. The fact that it is spiritual, however, does not mean that it is not real. It is real as it can be. God is mysteriously present in the sacramental signs of bread and wine in such a way as He became present in Jesus, God-Man, who lived and walked on this earth. And He is present differently. In a way, He is present "more" in the consecrated bread and wine than in the nature, the trees, the animals or even the people. He is present humbly so that all who believe might have an easy access to Him without fear.

If it is all true, we must prepare ourselves in order to receive the Eucharist worthily. We must remember: The Eucharist is not a cookie! It is the *mysterium tremendum*, an awesome and terrible mystery beyond human comprehension—an encounter with The Living God. Thus, we must be prepared, otherwise it becomes sacrilegious or a mockery of our faith. No one can truly appreciate the Eucharist if he/she does not want to repent. Thus those who live in a state of mortal sin should not receive Holy Communion until they are reconciled with the Church in the sacrament of penance. Of course, one may say that Jesus came to all people, so everybody should have "a right" to receive communion. It is true that Jesus came to everyone, but not everyone was ready to accept Him even when He was still walking on earth. Only those who repented and accepted His teaching were able to enjoy the graces He bestowed upon them. So it is today.

As we open the churches after long months of pandemic, let us pray for greater appreciation of the gift of the Eucharist. Let ask the Blessed Mother to help us to better understand this great mystery and truly prepare our hearts, minds, and bodies for worthy reception of the Christ in Holy Communion.

Persecution of Churches Continues in America

Prohibiting the reception of Holy Communion was one condition for churches to reopen according to a May 26 Executive Order in Howard County, Maryland. "There shall be no consumption of food or beverage of any kind ... including as part of a religious service," the order stated. "If singing takes place, only the choir or religious leaders may sing." ⁽¹⁾

This order coincided with statements from Dr. Anthony Fauci who recommended churches should stop distributing communion. "I think for the time being, you just gotta forestall that," Fauci said.⁽²⁾

Days later, the Maryland county reversed this Executive Order. "For the Catholic community, the reception of Communion is central to our faith lives and to our public worship." ⁽³⁾ "We are pleased to hear that Howard county will be lifting restrictions on faith institutions" said the Archdiocese of Baltimore. ⁽⁴⁾

A family of 12 in **Virginia**, has filed a First Amendment lawsuit against VA Gov. Northam over his COVID-19 Executive Order barring residents from freely assembling for religious worship and forbidding public gatherings of more than 10 people.

The Center for American Liberty (CAL) is representing the family in its case against the restriction - which, in addition to stopping them from frequenting secular establishments as a group, bars them from "going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), receiving the Sacrament of the Eucharist (Holy Communion), and praying on their private property with their priest and other believers." ⁽⁵⁾

"The Executive Orders wrongly and unconstitutionally classify the exercise of religion as non-essential," said a CAL attorney. "Gov. Northam's restrictions on religious expression are overly broad, discriminatory, and unconstitutional. Our plaintiffs have been blessed with 10 children. (This Order) discriminates against them because of the size of their family - ... while smaller families do not face such a prohibition." ⁽⁶⁾
