ENTHUSIASM AND GRAMMAR

There is a good reason that the writings of St. Paul don't show up as examples in grammar textbooks. Today's reading is a case in point. It begins with one of those long Pauline run on sentences that leave lectors gasping for breath. So what? Take a closer look at how Paul's fervor for his subject matter derails the grammar. There is something admirable about being so caught up in his convictions that the words cannot come fast enough to express them, much less in an orderly fashion. Scripture scholars usually take this grammatical ineptness as a sign of a passage's early importance in the Christian community, something they were so ardent about that their language never got refined.

What leaves us in this condition? Re-telling the plot line of an action movie or the play-by-play of a sporting event? When was the last time any of us was so excited by our faith in Christ that we were left grasping for words, stumbling over our own errors in speech? It may be bad grammar, but it is an excellent way to inspire others with the message of Christ!

Reopening of Public Worship!

Bishop Barres and the Diocese of Rockville
Centre have been in close contact with
County Executives Steven Bellone and
Laura Curran over the past several weeks.
Both County Executives have been
tremendously supportive and understanding
of our deep desire to return to the celebration
of public worship, for which we are grateful.

This past week, Bishop Barres informed our civil officials that the Diocese of Rockville Centre had decided to move forward with a date for reopening public worship with a percentage of our church's capacities, while observing reasonable and proper safety precautions.

On Saturday, June 6, Governor Cuomo announced that Houses of Worship in State Regions that have reached Phase 2 of his reopening plan may begin to host worship in churches at 25 percent of their capacity.

Long Island will begin Phase 2 on Wednesday, June 10, 2020.

We are most grateful to Bishop Barres for taking the lead in promoting the right of the faithful to gather for public worship, and we deeply appreciate the support of our Long Island County Executives.

Directives are being distributed to all parishes throughout the Diocese along with supplies, in order to assist them in safely welcoming the faithful back to public Masses.

From Administrator's Desk:

Letter to parishioners on 12th Sunday of Ordinary Time, Year A

There is so much anxiety and turmoil in the world lately. People are unhappy and they blame each other without even looking into the details of a specific situation. Many think if they change this or that institution the world will be a better place. It is a great delusion. The civil unrest in our society only reflects much deeper reality of human soul. It is the restless of the divided heart, of which wrote St. Augustine spoke in his diary: "Our heart is restless until it rests in you, [God]" (Confessions, I.1.).

The restlessness of human heart is ultimately a lack of God in our lives. Most likely it is also a consequence of original sin and of the sins we tend to commit on a daily basis. However, the reality of sin is so difficult to face that we tend to project it on others. We just want to get it out of us, but we only go round and round without facing real problem in us, namely, the conversion of our heart. Hence, it all results in more anxiety, fear, and strife. St. John Paul II addressed this issue clearly in his encyclical letter *Centesimus Annus* (par. 25):

"Man, who was created for freedom, bears within himself the wound of original sin, which constantly draws him towards evil and puts him in need of redemption. Not only is this doctrine an integral part of Christian revelation; it also has great hermeneutical value insofar as it helps one to understand human reality. Man tends towards good, but he is also capable of evil. He can transcend his immediate interest and still remain bound to it. The social order will be all the more stable, the more it takes this fact into account and does not place in opposition personal interest and the interests of society as a whole, but rather seeks ways to bring them into fruitful harmony. In fact, where self-interest is violently suppressed, it is replaced by a burdensome system of bureaucratic control which dries up the wellsprings of initiative and creativity. When people think they possess the secret of a perfect social organization which makes evil impossible, they also think that they can use any means, including violence and deceit, in order to bring that organization into being. Politics then becomes a "secular religion" which operates under the illusion of creating paradise in this world. But no political society — which possesses its own autonomy and laws— can ever be confused with the Kingdom of God."

On the twelfth Sunday of ordinary time our Lord Jesus encourages us to trust in Him while facing evil around us. His words, "do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul," are also addressed to us, people of the 21st century, who are looking for peaceful solutions of internal and external conflicts. We must remember that Jesus knows each human heart through and through. He knows how much we are anxious about lives. However, He wants us to think more about eternal life, not only about our temporal earthly existence: "Fear no one... Rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna" (Matthew 10:28). Our Lord warns us against the evil and sin resulting from it that can lead us to perdition.

The evils that people face are not only external but also internal. The early Church experienced that from the beginning. For that reason, St. Paul was admonishing the Christians in ancient Rome to avoid sin and to focus on Christ: "For if by the transgression of the one the many died, how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ overflow for the many" (Romans 5:15). St. Paul stresses the faith in Christ. God's grace is abundant through Jesus who conquered sin and death so that we may live in peace and harmony already here on earth. The only thing we must do is to turn away from sin and to trust in His Mercy. For us Catholics, it means a few practical things. We need to pray more instead of blaming each other; we need frequent confession and communion; and we need to practice the works of mercy that is charity and kindness towards each other in daily life.

Although we may feel powerless in front of evil, let us remember that we have a great Savior, Jesus Christ. He showed us He loved us from the Cross. He assured us of His love so many times as He did also in today's gospel passage: "Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows" (Matthew 10:31).

As we celebrate the Father's Day, let us turn to the Heavenly Father and thank Him for His Love and Mercy. Let us also pray for all our fathers, living and deceased, so that God's Love may be reflected in our families.

Happy Father's Day to all the fathers and God bless!

Celebrating "Religious Freedom Week" June 22 - 29

Beginning June 22, the Feasts of Saints Thomas More and John Fisher, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) celebrates religious freedom and urges Catholics to pray, reflect and take action on religious liberty. Please join *Catholics for Freedom of Religion* (CFFOR) in praying to Mary Immaculate, Patroness of America, for the healing of our Nation and full restoration of religious freedom. The text of the *Rosary for America* can be printed from the home page of www.CFFOR.org.

Freedom of religion is critical to our nation. In 1887, Baltimore Archbishop Gibbons explained the American heritage of religious liberty during his visit to Rome by attributing it to the "civil liberty we enjoy in our enlightened republic" and "in the general atmosphere of liberty (the Church) blossoms like a rose." (1)

The Church has been a staunch defender of religious liberty in the past and has a solemn duty to discharge that duty today. "As Catholic bishops and American citizens, we address an urgent summons to our fellow Catholics and fellow Americans to be on guard, for religious liberty is under attack, both at home and abroad." (2)

Pope Benedict XVI spoke about his worry that religious liberty in the United States is being weakened. "Of particular concern are certain attempts being made to limit that most cherished of American freedoms, the freedom of religion. (There is) a tendency to reduce religious freedom to mere freedom of worship without guarantees of respect for freedom of conscience." (3)

Religious Liberty is about the freedom to contribute to the common good of all Americans. "Can we do the good works our faith calls us to do, without having to compromise that very same faith? Without religious liberty properly understood, all Americans suffer, deprived of the essential contribution in education, health care, feeding the hungry, civil rights, and social services that religious Americans make every day, both at home and overseas." Regaining Religious Freedom After Covid-19

Attorney General Barr has made it clear by his words and actions that civil liberties are "not suspended in times of crisis." (5) He recently wrote in a memo titled, "Balancing Public Safety with the Preservation of Civil Rights" that a DOJ priority is defending people of faith against potential dangers of government overreach and discriminatory policies.

have witnessed this discrimination in Americans numerous places including Virginia, Kentucky, Tennessee, Missouri, California and beyond. N.Y. Gov. Cuomo's irreverent statement at a press conference concerning flattening the curve in NY, "God did not do that. Faith did not do that. Destiny did not do that...." demonstrates that some in government cannot understand why their self-imposed orders closing churches can be seen as antagonistic to people of faith. (6) It appears that to some governors, faith is not existential or necessary and religious practice is a novelty. "For people of faith, defending religious liberty and free religious exercise in the ultimate sense is a matter of life and death. Just ask the early apostles," wrote Ryan Helfenbein, Liberty University. (
