Fifth Sunday of Lent

THE NEW COVENANT

Today's first reading is an enormously important passage, not only in the history of the Jewish people, but also for us as disciples of Jesus, who see in it a foreshadowing of the Christian dispensation. The prophet announces that God has chosen to forgive the people, and that as a sign of divine forgiveness a new covenant will be established. Contrasting the new covenant with the one made with Moses on Mount Sinai. Jeremiah says that the new covenant will be written on the people's hearts rather than on tablets of stone. No longer will the community's tradition be the sole bearer of the covenant; henceforth, God will speak directly and personally to each individual, forgiving sin and calling for a return to God in faithfulness. No longer will mere outward compliance with the dictates of the Law suffice; henceforth, God asks for an obedience that springs from the depths of one's heart.

Precisely that kind of obedience is highlighted in today's second reading, where the author of the Letter to the Hebrews describes Jesus as the mediator of the new covenant whose obedience has made him the source of salvation for all who, in turn, obey him. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

Dear Sisters and Brothers of Saint Therese Parish,

I have missed writing these bulletin letters to you while we were in quarantine these last couple of weeks. But here we are back again and I hope you are all well. This year has certainly been full of ups and downs, and we are not out of the woods of the pandemic yet. As far as the church and our services go, we will continue to do everything we can to keep things simple, safe and prayerful. Hopefully we will soon all be fully vaccinated and able to greet one another in peace.

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. Of course this holiest of weeks in the church calendar is always special, but perhaps more so this year because of all that we have been through individually and as a community. There are some restrictions on what we can do liturgically during these days - no palms, washing of feet, live outdoor Passion, or Easter sunrise service - but we also have the wonderful opportunity for simple, shortened services this week that truly reflect both our pain and our hope. I encourage you to enter as fully as you can, in whatever way you are able.

On Palm Sunday we will have four Masses - two Vigil Masses on Saturday evening, (as usual one in English and one in Spanish), and two Sunday Masses in English, one at 8:30 and the other at 10:30. In place of palms we will be offering each person a beautiful pocket cross to carry with them during Holy Week and beyond.

On Holy Thursday the Mass of the Lord's Supper will be offered at 7 P.M. with a very special "washing of the feet". We have invited 12 "essential workers" who have "given their lives for their friends" to stand barefoot in the sanctuary while we the assembled community, with outstretched arms, bless their feet. These will include representatives of police, fire, medical, school, grocery, delivery, ambulance workers and others who have served us unselfishly throughout this pandemic.

On Good Friday we will gather in the church at 3 P.M. to commemorate the Lord's Passion with prayers of intercession, a reading of the Passion from the Gospel, veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion.

The Easter Vigil will begin at 8 P.M. on Holy Saturday evening with a lighting of the new fire and the new Paschal Candle; then our own individually held candles in the darkness of the church. We will renew our own baptismal commitment with the newly blessed Easter water with two members of our Saint Therese faith community receiving Confirmation. All the lights of the church will then be lit and the bells inside and out will ring out that Christ is Risen as we continue with our Mass.

We are planning that each of these services will last only an hour (perhaps the Vigil slightly more because of the lighting of the fire) and will include both Spanish and English languages. Easter morning Masses will be at 8:30 and 10:30.

Let us look forward in hope as together we celebrate new life in Christ.



If you serve me, my Father will honor you."





Abstinence and Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat/ poultry on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the age of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting yourself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.

Free Tax Preparation

Covid19 virus restrictions require that full Inperson tax preparation will not be available. A minimum contact model will involve scanning your tax documents and completing the return offsite. A new appointment will be required to pick-up and approve the completed return for electronic filing. Schedule appointments in person at the Library or by calling 631-668-3377. Intake/Interview sheets must be completed and a 'what to bring' sheet will be provided. Walk-in service will not be available.

Both Religious Leaders and Feminists Alarmed About Threats to Religious Freedom

The Equality Act has garnered criticism from both feminists and faith leaders who called it "flawed, hateful, and unthinking extremism." (1) "The act is essentially an all-out assault on religious freedom...,"said Paul Jonna, counsel for the Thomas More Society. (2)

"(This) Act has been advertised as a fight against bigotry. In truth, it's a fight against freedoms guaranteed in the Constitution - (a fear) shared by both radical feminism and traditional religion," wrote Rabbi Yaakov Menken, director of Coalition for Jewish Values and Natasha Chart, chair of Women's Liberation Front. (3) "We agree entirely that the Equality Act is a fatally flawed and even hateful piece of legislation... Congress is prepared to declare anyone who follows the Bible's definition of marriage or who believes women's sports, prisons and shelters should be reserved for biological women, to be in violation of civil rights law." (4)

The Coalition for Jewish Values (CJV), representing over 1500 traditional, Orthodox rabbis in matters of public policy, calls the Equality Act "a direct attack on Jewish religious values and practices." ⁽⁵⁾ In a letter to the House of Representatives, the CJV wrote:

"The Equality Act expressly declares that the Book of Genesis 2:24, and all Jewish laws pertaining to marriage as a sanctified union between a man & woman, are nothing more than engaged in discriminatory stereotypes. This is a disgraceful attack upon Jewish Biblical beliefs, rendered no more excusable by the fact that other traditional religious groups have similar tenets" (6)

"Simply put, the Equality Act as written insults our nation's foundational commitment to the rights of religious believers.... (It) would aid those who seek to deny America's religious heritage and who seek to portray religious Americans as bigots and haters. Such hostility toward religion should not be promoted, even unwittingly, by federal law," wrote Rabbi Avi Shafran. (7)
