A Message from the Pastor

Let's continue some reflection points on Bishop Scharfenberger's pastoral letter as it refers to this week's Second Sunday of Advent readings:

The Isaiah readings come from a situation of exile. People have seen the collapse of Judah, the fall of Jerusalem and the ruin of the temple. They were either led away to live as exiles in Babylon or had to live in the rubble of their city. They could not worship as they had ("How can we sing the songs of Zion in a foreign land?") They no longer lived in a land they believed God had given them. God had fled his own temple and given it over to destruction.

Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11: a joyful, hopeful message --Comfort to the people of Israel: the exile is come to an end; her guilt is over. The way home will be made plain; the rough country a broad valley. The glory of the Lord will be revealed in the return of the people to their land. Like a Shepherd God will lead them.

Mark 1:1-8: an urgent message -- Someone is coming even greater than John the Baptist. John's message echoes Isaiah's, but with greater urgency. One is coming greater than John the Baptist. The prophecies of old are coming to fruition and God is outdoing himself: (The Christmas Story). John baptizes with water; John baptizes with the Holy Spirit.

Our own moment of exile, COVID-19 -- We cannot worship as we used to. We cannot gather, sing, shake hands, embrace. We cannot show our face to each other. We cannot fill our churches. It is a source of worry and maybe of personal loss.

Diocese of Buffalo -- We are a Church that is in pain: bankruptcy, wake of scandal, mistrust, mismanagement, missed opportunities, a sense of betrayal, anger, abandonment.


Our own times -- We are a divided society that is experiencing economic uncertainty, political rancor and racial tension.

What are we to do? -- Listen to the letter of Peter --**2 Peter 3:8-14:** The Lord does not delay His promises. Conduct yourselves in holiness and devotion, waiting for and hastening the coming of the Day of the Lord.

What might that mean for us in the practical order? Bishop Scharfenberger is directing us in his letter to this opportune moment for Renewal, in holiness, devotion, and as the Church of Buffalo. We are a poorer Church, a chastened Church, but a Church that is now called back to the basics: the Word preached, the faith taught; the Sacrament celebrated; the people cared for, especially those most in need.

Our confidence in the possibilities of a renewal for our Church is based on the promise that God is with us, always renewing us and the Church. It is based on hope, not just optimism for a brighter day, but hope that God is steadfast in His love and mercy, as God has always been. but one faith, one baptism, one Lord.

Such a renewal requires that we open our vision to see not parishes or partisans, not ideologies or division, but one faith, one baptism, one Lord. Listen for the Spirit in the signs of the times and in each other to discern where the Spirit is leading us.

Have courage to move beyond current models, outside of what we are used to, outside of our comfort zones, in order to grow. Celebrate the sacraments, which make us one, especially the Eucharist where we become what we receive, the Body of Christ. Assess our resources and needs. Ask the question the scribe asked Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" And then meet our neighbor's needs.

This is the Second Sunday of Advent and the beginning of the Liturgical year. We begin again celebrating the great story of our salvation. It begins with the great hope that Isaiah had in God who can do marvelous deeds, and leads us like a shepherd beyond our imagining, for a fallen Jerusalem, for shepherds in Bethlehem, and for us in Buffalo.

Attending Mass

MPB has Masses on Saturday at 4:00 p.m. and on Sunday at 8:30 a.m. Please note the following regulations:

- Masks are required.
- Hand sanitizers are suggested. We have sanitizers at the door.
- Please enter the church through the center front door.
- Exiting the church will be through the front side doors and through the doors near the sanctuary.
- Handicap entering and exiting is through the Garden door.
- Trained ushers and greeters will seat everyone, using every third pew (as marked).
- Do not share books. If you bring one from home, you must take it with you.
- There will be no holy water in church.
- Touch as few things as possible.

If you are over the age of 65 and/or have any medical conditions that could compromise breathing or the heart, you should be very careful about being in public settings. The bishop has left in place the relief from the obligation of attending Mass.
