

### What Does the Catholic Church Teach About....?

#### **Question:**

I was asked, "How long should I keep my Christmas decorations up?"

#### My Answer:

I guess, until you are tired of them.

I think the question really is about the Christmas Season. So, Christmas related items, Not a Christmas Tree, but things like a Manger Scene or other decorations that might point to the birth of Jesus should remain in place throughout the Christmas Season. So the real question would be, what is the Christmas Season?

Here is an excerpt that all clergy receive before we enter into the Advent/Christmas Season regarding times and suggested celebration aids that come directly from the Office of Liturgy and Worship in our Diocese.

#### **CHRISTMAS**

Christmas offers the Church an opportunity to engage in its task of evangelization. Many people and families come to the Church to celebrate the birth of Christ who may ordinarily never come to our doors. It is important that we welcome them as the world welcomes our God becoming incarnate. Pope Francis reminds us that "The Church must be a place of mercy freely given where everyone can feel welcomed, loved, forgiven, and encouraged to live the good life of the Gospel." (Evangelii gaudium, 114)

The Church celebrates Christmas from the evening of December 24to January 13. The environment and hymnody should reflect this understanding. For the Church, Christmas last longer than one day.

As you can see, the Christmas Season starts on December 24<sup>th</sup>, not the day after Thanksgiving, and lasts to January 13<sup>th</sup>. In other words, through the feast of the Baptism of Jesus.

It is appropriate and suggested that items celebrating the birth of Christ be left in place until after the Baptism of Jesus. And yes, if you want to include your secular decorations, Christmas Tree, Snowman, Lights and Garland, you can leave these up or take them down at your will.

Remember, we are not of this world. We are in a life of Christ Jesus through our Baptism and thus we attend to the things of Christ and to those things that lead us to Christ.

New Year's Resolution. Be more attentive to what I am being called to do in the name of Jesus the Christ.
