## ST. JOSEPH CEMETERY — CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The St. Joseph Cemetery Commission is pleased to announce that construction work has been completed and all the main roads have been repaved. This includes the main road at the Pecks Road entrance all the way to the Cross in the upper section. Travel in and out of the cemetery is now much easier and is greatly improved.

In addition, the Cemetery carried out extensive drainage improvements last fall to correct long standing flooding issues. All catch basins were cleaned, repaired and/or replaced, and additional ones added. Broken and collapsed drain lines were replaced and 1,700 feet of new drain lines were installed.

Volunteers from the Knights of Columbus Council #103 stepped forward and cleared out an old 700 foot drainage ditch that had been blocked for years. They along with the cemetery staff cleared brush, trees and debris and completed erosion control and seeding. The total project cost was estimated at 1.8 million. The capital campaign feasibility study recommended 1.2 million. Therefore all roads were not able to be repaved at this time. Additional roads will be repaved in the next 2 years, as the balance of pledges are paid. The Cemetery Commission is continuing to seek other donations in order to complete the work. Contributions would be appreciated and should be made to the Cemetery office at 222 Pecks Road.
