Father Bob's Ramblings

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist. It is not often that we celebrate this feast on a weekend. So, I think it is a good opportunity to reflect on John the Baptist and his life and ministry outside of the Advent Season.

Today's celebration is near the summer counterpart of Christmas, the Summer Solstice—the longest day of the year in the Northern Hemisphere. On the day after the solstice, however, the days begin to shorten, for as John prophesied, "He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30). When the days are shortest, at the winter solstice, we celebrate Christmas, the birth of the Light of the World, to whom John pointed.

Although we observe John's birth, the liturgy points to the adult John's message. He is God's "sharpedged sword" and "polished arrow" who reveals divine glory (first reading), who was sent "to make ready a nation fit for Christ the Lord." Jesus called John the greatest of all those who had preceded him: "I tell you, among those born of women, no one is greater than John...."

The greatness of John, his pivotal place in the history of salvation, is seen in the great emphasis Luke gives to the announcement of his birth and the event itself—both made prominently parallel to the same occurrences in the life of Jesus. John attracted countless people ("all Judea") to the banks of the Jordan, and it occurred to some people that he might be the Messiah. But he constantly deferred to Jesus, even to sending away some of his followers to become the first disciples of Jesus.

John challenges each of us to the fundamental attitude of Christianity—total dependence on the Father, in Christ. As we move closer to our merger with Saint Rocco Parish, we need to remember John's message of always living our lives by pointing out the Christ by what we say and do. Although many of John's disciples found it hard to move from John to Jesus, I realize that many of you also find it hard to move from Saint Brigid's to Saint Rocco's. But if one keeps his or her eyes on Christ, John will help you find the way to Jesus no matter where you worship.

May we pray to Saint John this weekend, asking him to help us see the Way.

Next Sunday we will celebrate not only my retirement, but we also celebrate who we are and have been as a Parish Community. There will be a mass on Saturday at 5:00 PM, however our principal mass will be at 9:00 AM. I look forward to celebrating the Great Prayer of Thanksgiving to God (Mass) as I thank God for all of you and for my many blessings and years in ministry.
