"We are very grateful for the generosity of you all. With your help, St. Vincent de Paul continues to provide help for many families.





FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



You will probably not be surprised to find this out, that many of the people you see at Mass, here at All Saints, have been divorced. Because so many married couples do not endure "until death do us part"

today, it's a mathematical probability that every Sunday, you may be sitting just a few feet from someone who has been divorced, or is going through a divorce now. Two weeks ago, I talked about divorce in my weekend homily. Many people have gone out of their way to tell me how much they appreciated it, so I thought I'd use my weekly column to say a few more things about it.

Of course, so not to confuse anyone, let me make clear; I fully support the Catholic Church teaching on marriage and divorce. Our teaching on Marriage is sacramental, stable, hopeful, and beautiful. Above all, it's rooted in love and God. On the other hand, every couple I have known to break up, have found the divorce process painful, shame-filled, and depressing. However, like so many of our Church teachings, there is more to the story. When talking about marriage and divorce, one cannot simply make the pronouncement, "marriage is good and divorce is bad," and consider this a satisfactory assessment. That phrase is true, but doesn't tell the whole story. And where I come from, a "half truth"... is not the truth!

reminds us that sometimes couples find themselves in a toxic or even dangerous relationship, and separation (even a permanent one!) might be the only path to safety and better emotional and spiritual health.


Judging by how many lives are touched by divorce, it won't be surprising to hear that the divorce rate is anywhere from 50 percent for first marriages to almost 80 percent for subsequent marriages. There is a lot of misunderstanding about divorce and the Catholic Church. It's common for people to get bad information about Church teaching from those who don't understand it themselves. The Church is forced to walk a very fine line. Our efforts to support married life and to uphold the indissolubility of the Marriage Sacrament, often gets interpreted as a harsh judgment against those whose marriages didn't work out.

I've had several people over the years tell me that they understood Catholics who get divorced are excommunicated. This is just not true. Divorced Catholics are full members of the Church and are encouraged to participate in its activities, including the reception of the Eucharist. Divorced Catholics in good standing with the Church, who have not remarried or who have remarried following an annulment, may receive the sacraments. When a divorced person (or any Catholic for that matter) gets remarried outside the Church – that's when things get more complicated. A marriage annulment is

A more complete understanding of our Faith necessary for remarriage because the Catholic Church always gives an attempted marriage bond the benefit of the law. The Church assumes that an indissoluble sacramental bond has formed until it is proven otherwise. It is at that time that the Church is needed to step in, and take a good look at the marriage, to see if that sacramental bond had indeed been forged. If not, that's when an annulment can be declared by the Church.

> Let me also say this clearly... if you are divorced, you are welcome at All Saints! If you have remarried civilly or in another church tradition, without an annulment of a previous marriage, please speak with me. Or even if you've never been married before, but got married in a park, or on a beach, or in someone's back yard, please give me a call. I've helped many couples sort out their situation, and helped them get back into full communion with the Church. No parish is perfect, but here at All Saints, we try to appreciate the pain suffered by people caught in this situation. And we understand that the difficulties resulting from divorce often continue for years. We know that, like Jesus, love and support must be our response to those whose marriages have not endured. No matter who you are or where you've been, there's a place for you in our parish family.
