## Meditation for the 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday


"If your brother should sin against you, go and point out his sin." Matt 18:15 (our translation)

"We proclaim that human life is a precious gift from God; that each person who receives this gift has responsibilities toward God, self and others; and that society, through its laws and social institutions, must protect and nurture human life at every stage of its existence." - USCCB

The destruction of innocent human life, nowhere occurring more frequently than in abortion, are sins against God. To re-define marriage, abandon law and order, erase borders, allow violent criminals to run free in our communities, and make the US Court system unrecognizable, will harm all of us and our posterity. Prayers of reparation are urgently needed. Please join people across our nation in doing so.

### National Day of Prayer and Fasting, September 24, 2020

The Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary: It was of her that Jesus who is called the Messiah was born. (Matt. 1:16) We are Christians. We love Jesus. We love everything about Jesus. We love what he loves and treasure what he treasures. We love his mother Mary, his foster-father Joseph, his grandparents, and all his ancestors. We love all Jesus' adopted brothers and sisters, because Jesus loves them.

Because we are Christians, we are born again, "begotten from above". We received a new birth through the waters of baptism. We are "born of the Spirit". We've been reborn through the Word of God.

This love for birth and for what Jesus treasures leads us to joyfully celebrate the birth of Mary (this Tuesday, September 8), Jesus' mother and our mother. Her birth is "a birth unto hope" for all of us. "And this hope will not leave us disappointed, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us".

Nine months ago we celebrated the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. Today, we recall the joy of her birth. Happy Birthday, Mary, mother of Hope!

The Gospel of Life must be proclaimed, and human life defended, in all places and all times. The arena for moral responsibility includes not only the halls of government, but the voting booth as well. Laws that permit abortion, euthanasia and assisted suicide are profoundly unjust, and we should work peacefully and tirelessly to oppose and change them. Because they are unjust they cannot bind citizens in conscience, be supported, acquiesced in, or recognized as valid" (US Bishops, *Living the Gospel of Life*, 1998, n. 33).

### **Pope Francis: Church Cannot Abandon Human Life**

"Reason alone is sufficient to recognize the inviolable value of each single human life, but if we also look at the issue from the standpoint of faith, "every violation of the personal dignity of the human being cries out in vengeance to God and is an offence against the creator of the individual" (John Paul II, Christifideles Laici, 37). Precisely because this involves the internal consistency of our message about the value of the human person, the Church cannot be expected to change her position on this question. I want to be completely honest in this regard. This is not something subject to alleged reforms or 'modernizations'"—Pope Francis, Apostolic Exhortation "The Joy of the Gospel," November 24, 2013.
