Celebrate All Saints' Day: The Church celebrates holy men and women throughout the year on various saint days, but the Solemnity of All Saints is when the Church honors every saint: those officially known and honored on the Church calendar, and saints known only to God. There are many unknown or unsung saints, who

may have been forgotten, or never been honored specifically. On All Saints Day, we celebrate these holy individuals, and ask for their prayers and intercessions.

All Souls' Day: The commemoration of all the faithful departed is celebrated by the Church on Saturday, November 2. The Church, after rejoicing on All Saints' Day with those of her children who have entered the glory of heaven, today prays for all those who, in the purifying suffering of purgatory, await the day when they will be joined to the company of saints. The theological basis for the feast is the doctrine that the souls which, on departing from the body, are not perfectly cleansed from venial sins, or have not fully atoned for past transgressions, and therefore cannot yet see God, and that the faithful on earth can help them by prayers, alms, deeds and especially by the sacrifice of the Mass. Mass will be celebrated Saturday, Nov. 2 at 8:00 am.

<u>Friday November 1 is First Friday</u> and will once again be a <u>Day of Prayer</u> for the whole parish. Please come and spend time with Jesus in Adoration praying for the needs of members of the parish. Mass will be at 8:00 am (Holy Day) follow by Exposition. Adoration will close with Benediction at 8:15 pm. Confessions will be at 7:00 pm until people stop coming.

Be a part of the family: Let Fr. Bill know when you are hospitalized or scheduled for a serious surgery or bed ridden or can't get to Mass because of an illness. The Bread of Life can be brought to you. Or if you would like to receive the *Sacrament of the Sick*, please call Fr. Bill at 845-5212.
