Meditation for the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time "Lo, the day is coming." —Malachi 3:19

<u>Next Sunday is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe:</u> This Feast was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as an antidote to secularism, a way of life which leaves God out of man's thinking and living and organizes his life as if God did not exist. The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.

Titles for Christ's royalty over men:

1) Christ is God, the Creator of the universe and hence wields a supreme power over all things; "All things were created by Him";

2) Christ is our Redeemer, He purchased us by His Precious Blood, and made us His property and possession;3) Christ is Head of the Church, "holding in all things the primacy";

4) God bestowed upon Christ the nations of the world as His special possession and dominion.

The qualities of Christ's kingdom. This kingdom is:
1) supreme, extending not only to all people but also to their princes and kings;

2) universal, extending to all nations and to all places;

3) eternal, for "The Lord shall sit a King forever";

4) spiritual, Christ's "kingdom is not of this world."

Almighty ever-living God, whose will is to restore all things in your beloved Son, the King of the universe, grant, we pray, that the whole creation, set free from slavery, may render your majesty service and ceaselessly proclaim your praise. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.
