Meditation for Palm Sunday

"In His anguish He prayed with all the greater intensity, and His sweat became like drops of blood falling to the ground. Then He rose from prayer and came to His disciples." —Luke 22:44-45

Jesus prayed always. He even prayed while He was hanging on the cross and dying. He prayed: "Father, forgive them; they do not know what they are doing". With His last breath, He prayed: "Father, into Your hands I commend My spirit". These two prayers are related. To give ourselves totally to the Lord, we must forgive. When Jesus taught us to pray, He taught us to ask our Father in heaven to give us our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses. If we do not give forgiveness, we are not giving our "all." Therefore, we are not giving as Jesus gives. Thus, we must forgive in order to give our lives to the Lord.

During Holy Week, we are encouraged to accept the grace to forgive all those who have sinned against us. Jesus forgave us for participating in His crucifixion through our sins. We have been forgiven the unimaginable sin of being involved in crucifying God (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, 598). In thanksgiving for being forgiven, we should pass on the Lord's forgiveness to those who have sinned against us. Jesus died forgiving His enemies. May we live forgiving our enemies and thereby give our lives to Him as a total, unblemished sacrifice.

Prayer: Father, make this week holy through miracles of forgiveness. May I decide to accept these miracles now on the first day of Holy Week.

Our Lenten Journey is reaching its end and we now approach the holiest days of the year, the holiest days of all time - the Sacred Triduum (three days). We are called to prayerfully enter into the last days of our dear Savior's life. To cheer him with our palms as the expectant Messiah, dine with him as He gives us the great gift of the Eucharist and Priesthood on Holy Thursday, to suffer with Him on Calvary's cross on Good Friday and finally to celebrate the greatest event in the history of the world - the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ! Let us commit ourselves to enter fully into the gift and mystery of Holy Week by preparing ourselves through prayer, confession, good works and participation in our Triduum services.

HOLY THURSDAY, April 18 7:00 pm - The Mass of the Lord's Supper

The memorial of the institution of the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist and of Holy Orders. The Lord's Supper preludes the passion, but also prefigures it. The Eucharist, given to us "the night before he was betrayed," commemorates the death and resurrection of Jesus. Celebrating the Jewish Passover with his disciples for the last time, he gave this command: "Do this in remembrance of me." The Lord gave us the priesthood at the first Eucharist. So, we must center our life on our Eucharistic Lord and desire to receive Him daily and deeply in the covenant love of Holy Communion. "The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself". Try to go to Mass daily. Make frequent visits to Church to adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Pray a Holy Hour as often as possible before our Eucharistic Lord. Receive your full heritage. **Adoration to follow until about 9:15 pm.**

GOOD FRIDAY, April 19th 3:00 pm

The celebration of the Lord's Passion, Liturgy of the Word, Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. **This is a day of <u>fasting</u>**.

Jesus was executed in our place. "The Lord laid upon Him the guilt of us all". "It was our infirmities that He bore, our sufferings that He endured". "He was pierced for our offenses, crushed for our sins". If we realized how great are our sins against the all-holy God Who is Love and how great is the salvation Jesus has given us by dying in our place, we would love Jesus with all our hearts, repent completely, worship Him forever, keep thanking Him publicly, and be willing to do anything for Him, even to suffer and die. "Look on Him Whom" we "have pierced". Our sins are great. His love is perfect and crucified. So, we come together to gratefully commemorate the Lord's supreme love for us.

EASTER VIGIL - SATURDAY, April 20th 8:30 pm

The Easter Vigil is an Ancient tradition which stretches to the earliest years of the Church. It is the <u>high point</u> of the Easter Triduum and a celebration of the climax of Salvation History. In the Easter Vigil we celebrate the fulfillment of the promises of our salvation in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This is truly a meaningful and beautiful liturgy where we recall the mysteries of Christ's redeeming love and mercy. As we participate in faith we can lay hold of and be filled with the saving graces of our Lord's Death and Resurrection. The Easter Vigil is a time to celebrate the Joy of our salvation. Let us not absent ourselves from this gathering of the assembly.
