# **ACTION ALERT: TWO-WAY BIKE LANE PROPOSAL**

At the time of the writing of this column, the public information meeting on Tuesday, January 28th, which I urged you to attend in an announcement at last weekend's Masses, has not yet taken place. I encourage all of you to continue to be vigilant in opposing this proposal which would adversely affect church parking for Masses (daily, weekend and funerals), increase traffic "cutting though" the adjoining side streets and jeopardize the public safety of our community. including the children who attend our parish school, sporting and social events and religious education. It is an illconceived concept which has already been shown to be a foolishly implemented public safety nightmare on neighboring Eaton Street which, after public outcry and tremendous expense, was eventually dismantled. Like that attempt, the two-way bike lane does not fit with the use and needs of Mount Pleasant Avenue. # From the Office of the Vicar General of the Diocese of Providence:

On January 16, 2020, the Diocese of Fall River notified the Diocese of Providence that it was revoking the faculties of Fr. Edward Byington, a retired priest of the Fall River Diocese, for an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor alleged to have occurred decades ago. Fr. Byington has previously assisted at Masses in the Diocese of Providence, including St. Augustine, where he was in residence until 2015. Upon learning the information from the Diocese of Fall River, the Diocese of Providence immediately removed him from any further participation or duties within the diocese. Fr. Byington is no longer serving in any capacity.

The Diocese urges anyone who has been the victim of sexual abuse, or with credible knowledge of such abuse, by any member of the church, to report the information to RI State Police Major Crimes Unit at 401-444-1000 or the diocesan Office of Compliance at 401-941-0760.
