**WHAT TO EXPECT**

Seating is limited to maintain 6' between households, we have about 15% of our normal capacity. We clean and sanitize after every Mass. Masks must be worn by all over 2 years of age. Doors open 20 minutes before Mass, please maintain the 6' spacing as you wait. We close our doors when Mass begins.

Please follow the instructions regarding Communion:

- Wearing your mask over your nose and mouth, approach the altar in a single file using the tape on the floor for space,
- Cup your hands to give the presider or Eucharistic minister a wide space to lay the Blessed Sacrament
- Step to the side, 6' away from the Eucharistic minister, and move your mask, to consume the host.
- Replace your mask properly covering your nose and mouth.

## FR. PAOLO'S COLUMN



Nearly four years ago Hurricane Harvey brought unprecedented rainfall to Houston. My parents live four blocks from Buffalo Bayou, and as the water was gradually rising with no end in sight, they moved everything they could to the attic, grabbed their most essential documents, and left on foot, wading through the water. They were going to the home of a friend, and a stranger with a tall pick-up truck saw my parents walking and generously offered them a ride. When my parents arrived at the other neighborhood away from the flooding, they saw a homeowner casually mowing his lawn on that late-August day. My mom told me that it was so strange to have just evacuated their home while seeing someone else go about his life completely unaffected by the floods.

Our recent ice storm here in Texas brought us similar experiences. Many lost power, heat, and water for days on end while others didn't suffer any interruptions. The pandemic has likewise been felt unevenly across the country. Some families have seen multiple loved ones die while other families haven't had anyone fall ill.

In his recent book "Let Us Dream" about the ongoing pandemic, Pope Francis writes that "To enter into crisis is to be sifted. Your categories and ways of thinking get shaken up; your priorities and lifestyles are challenged. ... The basic rule of a crisis is that you don't come out of it the same. If you get through it, you come out better or worse, but never the same." Pope Francis doesn't presume that crises will always make us more compassionate and selfless, and trauma can naturally make people more defensive, self-centered, or in denial about the reality of the situation. But with faith, hope, and love, crises can make us more intentional about our daily choices and compassionate towards others.

As Catholics, we strive to take a universal perspective beyond our own narrow experiences. I have often thought about my mother's experience of evacuating the house in Houston when I see stories of refugees on the news. The past decade has been a time of strong economic growth and prosperity for many in our city and country, so I want to imagine that everyone is doing well. Yet I know that many people continue struggling both here in Austin and around the world.

I hope that we can all embrace the crises of the past month and year as an opportunity to grow and come out of this with more compassionate and generous hearts. The limitations of the past year have made me very grateful for the countless small blessings that I have received through your ongoing support of us priests and each other. In return, please know that we are praying for everyone who has suffered significant losses during the past month.

### Online EIM Training Explained

Beginning Jan. 1, the Online EIM Training fulfills the EIM compliance/training requirement only for applicants who have an existing EIM account and have previously attended an EIM Workshop. As of Jan. 1, new applicants, and existing applicants who have never attended an EIM Workshop, must attend an in-person EIM Workshop to fulfill their initial EIM compliance requirement.

### Adventures in the Archives

Back in 1985, the Boy Scouts of St. Austin's Troop 34 came together for sports, crafts and service activities. The 17 boys of the Scout Troop came from all over Austin. Scoutmaster Tim Graham and Assistant Scoutmaster Steve Stovall directed the troop's many different projects.

Past service projects include cleaning up the area around Town Lake (now Lady Bird Lake) and the school grounds, and ushering at UT football games. The Scout activities were geared to developing leadership skills, with a senior patrol leader guiding each meeting. In the mid 1980s, Troop 34 camped 10 days and nights each year. There were also activities the Scouts could complete for their merit badges. Parents were required to attend one monthly meeting, and they also got a newsletter of scouting activities.

For a time, Pack 34 lay dormant until revived in the 90s through the efforts of Phillip Eastman and Paula Pratte. Fast forward to 2021 with two groups of Scouts that St. Austin's sponsors. Derek Giesler, Cubmaster in 2020, explains they operate separately. Cub Scout Pack 34 is for grades K – 5 and Boy Scout Troop 34 is for grades 6 – 12.

The Cub Scout Pack gathers about once a month. They have done a weekend camping trip, a fishing and swimming trip, and worked with model rockets. In March they will participate in the Pinewood Derby, a long-standing tradition dating back to the Scouts' founding. One big change in this Pack is that girls are accepted, with four girls in the Pack now.

The Boy Scouts meet weekly on the Blacktop. Future activities include a mountain biking trip, a 5-day backpacking trip over spring break, and a week-long campout in Colorado this summer. Last year, two scouts in Troop 34 earned their Eagle Scout rank. Denver Lamberth is 2021 Cubmaster and Keith Zieglerman is Scoutmaster.
