What to Expect - Masks Stay On!

Seating is limited to maintain 6' between households, we have about 15% of our normal capacity. We clean and sanitize after every Mass. Masks must be worn by all over 2 years of age. Doors open 20 minutes before Mass, please maintain the 6' spacing as you wait. We close our doors when Mass begins.

Please follow the instructions regarding Communion:

- Wearing your mask over your nose and mouth, approach the altar in a single file using the tape on the floor for space,
- Cup your hands to give the presider or Eucharistic minister a wide space to lay the Blessed Sacrament
- Step to the side, 6' away from the Eucharistic minister, and move your mask, to consume the host.
- Replace your mask properly covering your nose and mouth.

Parish Mission Statement

St. Austin Catholic Parish, guided and served by the Paulist Fathers, is a dynamic, urban, Roman Catholic faith community of the Diocese of Austin.

FROM FR. CHUCK



A long time ago, back when I was a seminarian, a wise priest told me, "Don't show me your mission statement, show me your parish financial report. That will tell me what your real goals are." And since then I have seen that that is very true. Here at St. Austin Parish we are in the final stages of an outside, independent audit. As far as I know,

we are the only parish in the Diocese that pays to have an outside, independent audit. This is our second one, both conducted by Atchley & Associates LLP. Such an independent audit does not come cheap (\$11,000 for the parish and \$10,000 for the school) but it is the best and surest way to provide financial accountability to all of our parishioners and donors. And in this day and age, involved and committed parishioners both deserve, and demand, financial transparency.

We will make available the results of the audit, once it is completed, and accepted by our parish Finance Council.

Meanwhile, there has been a lot of talk on the national news about an effort to raise the Federal Minimum Wage to \$15 an hour. Also, I see that one local business with ties to St. Austin Parish and School, P. Terry's, has decided on their own to initiate a \$15 per hour minimum wage.

Here at St. Austin Parish back in July of 2016, the parish Finance Council adopted a policy of a minimum wage of no less that \$14 per hour for all of our parish hourly employees. Right now, due to natural pay increases over time, we have NO employees of the parish making less than \$15 per hour. Also, St. Austin School has adopted a \$15 minimum wage for all hourly employees. Perhaps the Parish should update its pay policy, since it is now almost five years old.

Jesus in the Gospels talks more about money than He does about sex. How we get money, how we use it, how it influences our lives, are all moral issues. And that goes for the Church just as it does for each of us as individuals. *Here at St. Austin Parish* and school we try to take that seriously, and use the funds you have given us both wisely and morally.

Exciting News from Outreach Team



Adventures in the Archives

Fr. Dave O'Brien, St. Austin pastor 1984-1990, attended the General Assembly of the Paulist Community in New Jersey in 1986. The Paulists had adopted three central goals at that Assembly and Fr. O'Brien wanted to share them with St. Austin parishioners and, so he wrote, "we hope to involve the lay people among whom we work in the goals of our community."

The three central goals adopted for the Paulist contemporary mission were: Evangelization, Reconciliation and Ecumenism. Here is how Fr. O'Brien described them.

Evangelization, the preaching of the Gospel to those who have not heard it, invites all people to hear the Word of God and share in our Church life together.

Reconciliation, the work of Christian healing and compassion, calls us to reach out to our Catholic brothers and sisters, alienated from the Church community, and calls us to respond to the wounds of society and the hunger for peace and justice.

Ecumenism, the search for the unity God wills for the Church, opens us to the spiritual riches and Gospel traditions of other Christian churches and urges us to work with one another for unity in life and mission.

The Missionary Society of St. Paul the Apostle continues to affirm these three central goals today.
