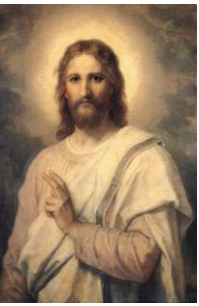

- ✓ **Weekend Mass Intentions:** will not take any newly requested weekend Mass intentions until further notice



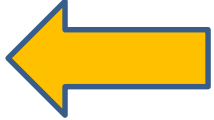

A Lesson in Justice: From the Catechism of the Catholic Church, #'s 2407, 2411, & 2412

Respect for human dignity requires....the practice of JUSTICE to preserve our neighbors' rights and render him what is his due. COMMUNICATIVE JUSTICE regulates exchanges between persons in accordance with a strict respect for their rights. Communicative Justice *obliges* strictly; it requires safeguarding property rights, paying bills, and fulfilling obligations freely contracted. Without Communicative Justice no other form of justice is possible. In virtue of Communicative Justice REPARATION for injustice committed requires *restitution*.

PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL: met on August 25 and reviewed the 2019-20 Finance Report that must be submitted to the diocese every year. FYI: A) In the 4 months March 1 – June 30 the category of Sunday offertory was 7% lower than the same time period last year. B) Obviously the only extra fund raising event of the season was held last Sunday **while currently every other fund raising activity is cancelled** due to the pandemic. C) The 2020-21 proposed budget is unbalanced/underfunded in the range of \$70,000.00. D) The diocesan school assessment as of 9/1/20 is \$77,744.00 in arrears.
