
ST. TERESA OF JESUS-FEAST DAY OCT. 15

Saint Teresa of Avila was a Spanish Carmelite nun, reformer, mystic and now a saint and doctor of the Church. She was born Teresa Sánchez Cepeda Davila y Ahumada in Avila, Spain in 1515. She had a normal childhood but at the age of seven she convinced her older brother, after reading books about Catholicism, that they should run away to become martyrs. They got about as far as the road leading out of the city before an uncle found them and brought them back home. Teresa entered the Carmelite order and took vows at the age of 20. When she was about 40, Sister Teresa found herself dramatically called to the practice of contemplative prayer and would write, "All trials I endure cannot be compared to the interior battles of not wanting to pray." She started to pray again and was overwhelmed by God's presence in her senses and experiencing ecstasy while meditating on God. Sometimes her body would be raised from the ground. Sister Teresa felt that the best evidence of her delights from praying came from God because she experienced great inner peace, inspiration and encouragement. However, there was great hostility and gossip

around her by the other sisters, and she would complain to her closest friend, Jesus. He would answer her in prayer, "Teresa, that is how I treat my friends. She answered, "No wonder you have so few friends." Together with her close friend, St. John of the Cross, she founded the Order of the Discalced Carmelites. St. Teresa of Avila died on October 15, 1582. She was canonized on March 22. In 1970 Pope Paul VI proclaimed St. Teresa of Jesus one of the first two women Doctors of the Church (a title given to a saint recognized as having given a significant contribution to theology or doctrine through research, study or writing.) along with the 14th century Dominican St. Catherine of Siena.
