**LOW GLUTEN HOSTS** - for those who require a low gluten host, please proceed down the center aisle to receive communion and make your request known to the priest or Eucharistic minister. One or the other will have a special ciborium with low gluten hosts and will be able to accommodate you. **REFLECTION OF THIS WEEK'S READING—** What does it mean to be worthy? There are a few different ways to approach this question. Today's Gospel highlights two: the way of the Pharisees and the way of John the Baptist. Our faith values good works and discipleship. Perhaps, then, we "earn" our worth by adhering to the right doctrines and following the right pious practice. The Pharisees thought they were worthy. Due to their religious pedigree and proper procedures, they were selfsatisfied. John the Baptist's words to them are strong. "Do not resume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.'" Of course, Jesus (and John) don't omit the responsibility for moral behavior. John gives the Pharisees quite a strong warning in that regard. "Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance ... every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire."

It's a question of attitude. Of disposition. It's a matter of the heart. If anyone would be worthy in this scenario, it's John the Baptist. Jesus himself will name him the greatest of prophets and a great man. John, however, recognizes his own lowly place in the grand scheme of things. *"The one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals."* The Pharisees take pride in being "better" than others. John embraces humility in Christ being "better" than him. We don't self-generate our own worthiness. We receive it as a gift from God.

In a few short weeks, we'll celebrate the birth of Christ. Bishop Ven. Fulton Sheen wrote about the Nativity in his "Life of Christ": "Because [Jesus] was born in a cave, all who wish to see Him must stoop. To stoop is the mark of humility. The proud refuse to stoop and, therefore, they miss divinity." God invites us to prepare our hearts this Advent. When you consider your own life, where are you looking for your worth? This Christmas, are you prepared to stoop?

What a picture the Gospel paints today. John the Baptist is preaching in the desert wearing camel's hair and a leather belt. His food is desert food, grasshoppers and wild honey. He does not have anything sophisticated in his desert life. Yet this man, living a primitive lifestyle, lacking proper food

and clothes, has become an attraction and a magnet. Why? The sophisticated needed God and did not find God in their lifestyles. We heard in the Gospel that the whole of the Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to John in the desert. Nothing like this had ever before happened. Previously if you wanted to meet God you went to the temple in Jerusalem. Now those in Jerusalem literally turned their backs to the temple and went out into the desert to John. He was preparing for Jesus who would replace the temple as the way to the Father. A second strange thing is that they were all baptized by John. Previously, only those converting to Judaism and becoming Jews were baptized to symbolize leaving their old way of life behind. Now the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were being baptized by John for forgiveness of their sins. This also shows there is something new occurring and an old way of life is being left behind. Who is coming? John explains:

### "One more powerful than I is coming after me. I am not even fit to carry his sandals. He it is who will baptize in with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Matthew 3)

We receive a different grace during every season of the Church year and there is a grace for us also this Advent. I think by looking at the Scripture readings this weekend we can see the graces for us. A grace for us this Advent is to make more room for Jesus in our lives.

John the Baptist prepared the whole of Judea and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem to receive Jesus. During Advent, the Church, like John the Baptist, encourages us to prepare for Jesus. Like them, we can only prepare properly for Jesus by freeing up time in our lives to spend with Jesus. It is good to remember that this time before Christmas is to be for us a holy time, a holy season. The greatest prayer is the Mass so praying at daily Mass, if it were possible to attend daily, would be a great way to make room in our lives for Jesus. We want to pray in other ways every day. Prayer should be an important part of every day. Prayer doesn't just fall out of the trees, prayer needs to be fed. We feed our prayer by reading Scripture just as when you talk to a friend you talk about what is on your mind. Read a passage from the Bible and then pray. Also the Rosary is a great prayer. As we spend time in prayer it is good to remember that God wants us to be intimate with him. The first reading today reminded us that God is like a shepherd who wants to take us up into his arms. When you pray allow God to take you up into his arms.

Advent then, is a grace for us to think about and long for the End and the Second Coming of Jesus when all of God's plans will finally be realized just as Jesus was the realization of Old Testament hopes. John the Baptist prepared the people for Jesus who would replace the temple as the way to the Father and a grace for us this Advent is the new Roman Missal whose prayers are expressed much more accurately to reflect our faith and feed our faith. Advent is a time of grace, it comes around just once before this Christmas. **~FR. BOB**



Ready your Heart for Christmas - Our Advent Penance Service will take place on Monday, December 16th at 7:00PM in the church.

**Taizé Prayer Service –** Are you thinking about the mountain of holiday preparations ahead of you? Are you wondering how you can put Christ back in to Christmas? Our Advent Taizé prayer service might be just what you need to center your mind and heart on the im-

portance of the season. Please join us on December 12th at 7:00 in the chapel.

**Taizé prayer** is a meditative form of prayer. Through the repetition of musical phrases over and over, the body and mind slow down enough to be able to listen to the voice of God that is planted deep within you.

**Taizé prayer** is traditionally held in a darkened church lit by candles. One aspect of the prayer involves icons, pictures painted by artists while in prayer, role models of greatness the church has highlighted for centuries. We see icons of Jesus, Mary, the prophets, and the saints displayed during Taizé prayer, but it is important to note that we do not worship these icons. They are merely reminders to us that we can shape our lives to reflect the sacred majesty of God. They speak to us of dying and rising in our daily lives through their living example.

The monastery at Taizé, France, has become popular, especially for young adults around the world, and as many as 10,000 people at a time gather to participate in Taizé prayer.

ADULT ALTAR SERVER TRAINING: Saturday December 14th, 10AM Meet in Room 108 of the Parish Center. Altar servers are men and women who assist the priest at the altar for the daily 9 AM Mass (Monday through Saturday) and Funerals in the Chapel and the Church. 
