Ideally, a family is a little community of love. The atmosphere in the home is all important. The atmosphere is determined by the quality of the relationships. Parents and children both contribute to the making of the atmosphere.

Today let's pray in thanksgiving for the gift of the Holy Family and for the gift of our own families. Let's pray for those families who struggle. Let's pray that families can become closer in both hard times and good times.

I believe that there is a greater depth to relationships that have weathered some storms. Holiness is the fruit of sacrifice and struggle. Hopefully, we can all come to say, "there is no place like home." Have a blessed week, Fr. Brian

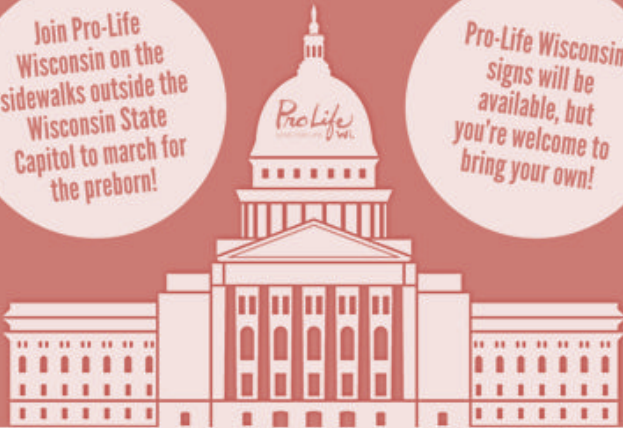
Despite the cold temperatures, work continues on the framing of the church. The brick structures on the outside of the church are also being finished by Kraemer Brothers Construction.
