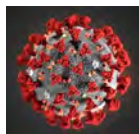

COVID—19 Response



**This is what we are planning.
Everything is subject to change.**

Although our West Entrance Doors are Open, we are only open for personal prayer, and no more than 10 people at a time.

Please stay up to date by visiting our website and receiving Flocknote emails/texts from our Parish Staff members.

- **First, the Church has been thoroughly sanitized and we will continue to re-sanitize daily!**
- **The Church will be open for limited prayer.** We are limiting those praying to no more than ten at a time. You are asked to spread out as far as possible from others except for family members that are presently living together.
- **Scheduled times for the Church to be open are as follows:**
 - Every day from 12:00pm-8:00pm
 - Only one door will be open on the West side of the Church under the car port entrance. It is the electronic door and so please bump the wheelchair door opener with your elbow to avoid touching the door handle.
- **Outdoor Confessions**
 - **There will be extended confession times to stretch out the lines through the day and in fact you can line up in your cars.** (Weather permitting) We will have confessions outside behind the Church by the Columbarium (don't worry, right now, only your sins will be laid to rest there). Should the weather not permit, we will have alternate instructions for confessions in the Church on any day of inclement weather.
 - The confession schedule for present is
 - **Wednesday 4:30 pm—6:00 pm.**
 - **Saturday 12:00 pm—2:00 pm**
 - **The offices will be operational on a limited basis but not opened.** We are asking everyone to *not* come into the office. Please handle all matters by phone, email, or other form of electronic communication.
 - **We will continue to record Mass at 9:00am (Sunday-Friday) and hope to upload to our Website by 11:00am each day**

A couple of weeks ago, **Father John and Deacon Doug asked that we organize a group of parishioners to start a system of on-going phone outreach to the members of our St. Andrew parish family who are over the age of 65.**

The purpose of the phone calls is simply to check in, see how they are doing, and find out what they might need help with. While we cannot promise anything, we have many parishioners at St. Andrew who would happily lend a hand to these folks.

However, we can't provide assistance if we don't know what's needed!

This is where we could use your help. We already have people who have been making calls, but we could use more volunteers in order to be able to call everyone weekly.

To be one of our callers, you will need access to a computer. We provide a script for you to follow with each call, and there is an online form to complete after each call so that we can track how the calls are going and who needs assistance.

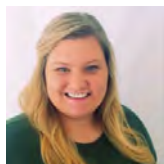

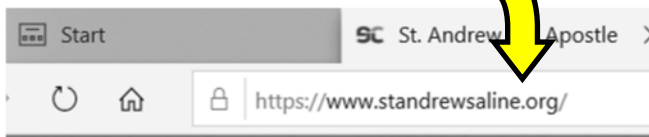

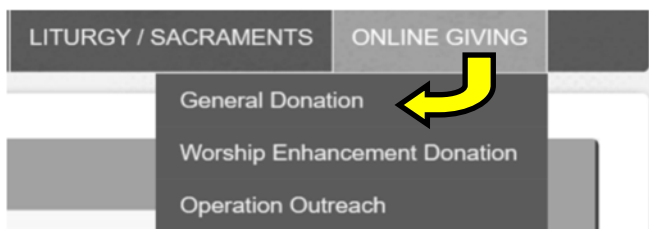
2. This is our home page.

NOTE-WORTHY NEWS

Greetings from the Music Ministry!

Today in our joyful Season of Easter we celebrate the Sunday of Divine Mercy. God imparts Divine Mercy upon us throughout our lives! An important way we also receive God’s tremendous mercy is through works of love and care of holy people here among us.

I would like to share with you some experiences of that love and mercy that I have been privileged and graced with in my life. In 1972 I decided to come to Ann Arbor to study organ under the great organist and teacher, Marilyn Mason, at the University of Michigan School of Music, Theatre and Dance. She knew that I was a trained Catholic organist and conductor and introduced me to the Dean of U of M School of Music, Dr. James Brevard Wallace. Dr. Wallace was head of the Church Music Department at the Music School. His background as a college student was formation at Westminster Choir School at Princeton, and there was one of the students selected to study conducting under Toscanini. Then, during World War II, James Wallace was in charge of all the chaplains and musicians in Europe for our military. He was a great conductor and organist. Dr. Wallace became my Mentor in Church Music, and especially, in conducting; and I was appointed a Graduate Teaching Fellow under his tutelage. His wonderful leadership and guidance have helped me as an important part of my career as conductor and organist. Both he and the great world-renowned organist Marilyn Mason gave me so much fine guidance, teaching and love – I am so thankful and appreciative of their mercy and care!

Dr. James Wallace, as Dean of The School of Music, sat in on all the student auditions who were seeking admission to the Music School. When he heard Jessye Norman sing at her audition – he could not believe her beautiful God given voice and her tremendous potential – he took her under his wing – and provided her with a full scholarship to study at the U of M School of Music in Ann Arbor. She became renowned as one of the greatest sopranos ever! Because of James Wallace’s superb work, leadership, wisdom, love and care – her career sky-rocked. She was born in Augusta, Georgia, who began singing spirituals in her church as a very young child – and became one of the finest vocal artists of all times.

I hope that my sharing these little vignettes may help us reflect and be thankful for of God’s graces poured out on us by the love and mercy of others, and hopefully, our love and mercy to others in return.

So, in celebration of Jessye Norman (1945-2019), please be so kind as to listen to the great soprano perform YOU’LL NEVER WALK ALONE on this 2002 YouTube recording: [Youtube.com/watch?v=709TjFmoKAS](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=709TjFmoKAS). I hope that listening to this extraordinary performance enriches your life in the great beauty of God’s gift of music and the profound artistry of the Jessye Norman!

An Act of Contrition

My God, I am sorry for
my sins with all my heart.

In choosing to do wrong and
failing to do good,
I have sinned against you
whom I should love
above all things.

I firmly intend,
with your help,
to do penance,

to avoid
whatever leads me to sin.

Our Savior Jesus Christ

If your desire to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation is in tension with your need to stay home to protect yourself or others, the following is a very important insight into the Sacrament of Reconciliation

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

'Among the penitent's acts contrition occupies first place. Contrition is "sorrow of the soul and detestation for the sin committed, together with the resolution not to sin again." (#1451)

When it arises from a love by which God is loved above all else, contrition is called perfect" (contrition of charity). Such contrition remits venial sins; it also obtains forgiveness of mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to have recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible" (#1452)

Pope Francis referenced this section of the Catechism in his homily on March 20, 2020, as reported by Cindy Wooden on *CruxNow.com*:

"But many people today would tell me,
'Father, where can I find a priest, a confessor,
because I can't leave the house?
And I want to make peace with the Lord,
I want him to embrace me, I want the Father's embrace.'"

The pope said his response would be,

"Do what the Catechism (of the Catholic Church) says.

It is very clear: If you cannot find a priest to confess to, speak directly with God, your father, and tell him the truth.

Say, 'Lord, I did this, this, this.

Forgive me,' and ask for pardon with all your heart.'

Make an act of contrition, the pope said,
and promise God,

"I will go to confession afterward, but forgive me now.'

And immediately you will return to a state of grace with God."

Divine Mercy!

"In this you rejoice, although now for a little while you may have to suffer through various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith, more precious than gold that is perishable even though tested by fire, may prove to be for praise, glory, and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ."

(Second Reading from St. Peter for the Divine Mercy Sunday Mass)

On this weekend, when we turn to the Lord in trust of his mercy for us, I find deep peace in these words that Jesus said to St. Faustina in her diary, "Those who need my mercy most, deserve it least" (emphasis added by me). This is incredible, literally, unbelievable! That God would say that the worst of sinners deserve anything, particularly mercy, is counter to our weak human understanding! And that they deserve it more than others who have not sinned as bad is just too much to handle!

But two things come to mind. First, for all I know, that means me! If I'm so arrogant as to place myself in a different category from "the worst sinners," then I am in a separate category indeed – the category of the self-righteous. Nobody is self-righteous, nobody is without sin nor are they able to redeem themselves. We're all in need of a merciful redeemer.

Instead of complaints, I should be shouting from the roof tops about how merciful God is and how the trials he lets me go through are meant to teach me to love as he loves and understand as he understands. I believe in the depths of my heart that God is truly just and so there must be some justice in the statement that "those who need mercy most, deserve it most." My heart and my experience tell me that those who sin the most in this world often are the ones who have been dealt the toughest hands and who have born some of the greatest trials. How often do we hear that those who so greatly offend others were once innocent victims themselves?

God is a God who not only can forgive all sins, he can heal all wounds! I need to start with believing that. When Jesus appeared after the Resurrection, Thomas asked to see, and saw, his wounds. The same wounds inflicted by anger, abuse, and misunderstanding were nevertheless born with love and became glorious wounds.

It is no coincidence that in the Divine Mercy image, the grace poured out from Jesus leaves him by way of his glorious, yet, wounded heart. That same merciful grace enters you and me in only one way – through our wounded hearts. It doesn't have any other way in. Your trials will not only be for the praise, glory and honor of God, they will be your glory!

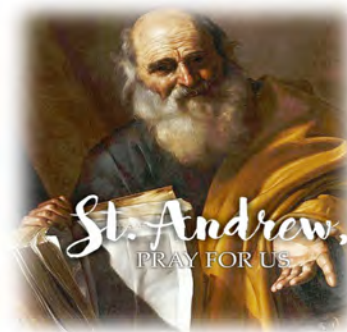
