

He has risen! He has risen indeed!

They all thought they had lost him. No three days were ever harder to handle for the first disciples than the three days of darkness beginning Holy Thursday evening and ending on Easter Sunday morning. This will never be lost on us ever again. Not three days, but three weeks and counting – we have lost him! "They have taken the Lord...and we don't know where they put him." This was the cry of Mary Magdalene when she came to the tomb.

The Lord heard her ache. Her love for him was proven in the actions of both her heart and her body during the loss that she experienced. While all the others were hiding and despairing, there she was on her feet going to find and be with any part of him as early as was possible. This she did even if she only expected to find his cold dead body in the tomb. But that is not what she found. She would eventually find him again, and in greater form than she had ever known him, in his resurrected glory!

We have lost him in bodily participation in the Mass, in the Eucharist, in the parish community! What are we doing? Are we hiding and despairing, or are we looking for him elsewhere; maybe in a form that we never knew him so well, such as in our family, in nature, in song, in deepened prayer? He has always been in Scripture and I never needed to go to Church to find him there. Have I cracked the Bible even once in these past three weeks?

Mary was the first allowed to see him again (Jn 20:16). Was this just because she was lucky? Or was it his response to her love? Is not having an opportunity to be with Jesus at Mass or receive Jesus in the Eucharist making my heart desire and love him more? If not, why?

May my Easter joy be greater than ever before, because my love for HIM for whom my heart aches has risen, like never before.

A Sacred Space in Your Home

What does a sacred space look like?

A Sacred space is a designated space in your home where it is easy to sit in the presence of God. It is a very simple, quiet place with either a few or many religious items. It should be distinctly different from the rest of the house so that it is "set apart". However, different does not mean expensive. The sacred space is typically a table-top, like a small table set against a wall, possibly in a corner. You could include a few religious items.

Possible Items to Include

- Catholic Bible (picture Bible or board book or very little kids)
- Crucifix (small one to pass around for very little kids)
- Prayer Cards
- Sacred art (cutouts from previous year's calendar or Christmas Cards)
- Rosaries
- Candles
- Statue of Mary or other saints
- Holy Water
- Intercessory Prayer Basket
- Pillows for sitting on the floor
- Prayer journals for each family member (remember these are private)

COVID—19 Response

This is what we are planning. Everything is subject to change.

Although our West Entrance Doors are Open, we are only open for personal prayer, and no more than 10 people at a time.

Please stay up to date by visiting our website and receiving Flocknote emails/texts from our Parish Staff members.

- First, the Church has been thoroughly sanitized and we will continue to resanitize daily!
- The Church will be open for limited prayer.
 We are limiting those praying to no more than ten at a time. You are asked to spread out as far as possible from others except for family members that are presently living together.
- Scheduled times for the Church to be open are as follows:
 - Every day from 12:00pm-8:00pm
 - Only one door will be open on the West side of the Church under the car port entrance. It is the electronic door and so please bump the wheelchair door opener with your elbow to avoid touching the door handle.
- Outdoor Confessions
 - There will be extended confession times to stretch out the lines through the day and in fact you can line up in your cars. (Weather permitting) We will have confessions outside behind the Church by the Columbarium (don't worry, right now, only your sins will be laid to rest there). Should the weather not permit, we will have alternate instructions for confessions in the Church on any day of inclement weather.
 - The confession schedule for present is
 - Monday, Wednesday, Friday 4:30 pm—6:00 pm.
 - Saturday 12:00 noon—2:00 pm
- The offices will be operational on a limited basis but not opened. We are asking everyone to *not* come into the office. Please handle all matters by phone, email, or other form of electronic communication.
- We will continue to record Mass at 9:00am (Sunday-Friday) and hope to upload to our Website by 11:00am each day

To be one of our callers, you will need access to a computer. We provide a script for you to follow with each call, and there is an online form to complete after each call so that we can track how the calls are going and who needs assistance.

We've got food and are working hard to ensure it stays that way!


Thank you for your partnership in this.

Rites of Initiation to be held at end of Easter Season


Bishop Boyea has moved the Sacraments of Initiation from the Easter Vigil to the **Pentecost Vigil (May 30).**

Pro Life Ministry News


The St. Andrew Pro-Life Ministry supports Respect for Life at all ages and stages, from conception to natural death.

What if I'm unable to go to Confession?

If your desire to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation is in tension with your need to stay home to protect yourself or others, the following is a very important insight into the Sacrament of Reconciliation

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

'Among the penitent's acts contrition occupies first place. Contrition is "sorrow of the soul and detestation for the sin committed, together with the resolution not to sin again." (#1451)

When it arises from a love by which God is loved above all else, contrition is called perfect" (contrition of charity). Such contrition remits venial sins; it also obtains forgiveness of mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to have recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible" (#1452)



Pope Francis referenced this section of the Catechism in his homily on March 20, 2020, as reported by Cindy Wooden on *CruxNow.com*:

"But many people today would tell me, 'Father, where can I find a priest, a confessor, because I can't leave the house? And I want to make peace with the Lord, I want him to embrace me, I want the Father's embrace.'"

The pope said his response would be, "Do what the Catechism (of the Catholic Church) says. It is very clear: If you cannot find a priest to confess to, speak directly with God, your father, and tell him the truth. Say, 'Lord, I did this, this, this. Forgive me,' and ask for pardon with all your heart."

Make an act of contrition, the pope said, and promise God, "I will go to confession afterward, but forgive me now.' And immediately you will return to a state of grace with God."


