

We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You; by Your holy cross, You have redeemed the world. Fellow Christians, since I wrote in this bulletin just a week ago, our world has changed. I write today as your Pastor: reflecting on this moment; giving resources for sustaining faith; and suggestions on living faith in a time of crisis.

• **St. Gregory Nazianzen:** "If you are a Simon of Cyrene, take up your cross and follow Christ. If you are crucified beside him like the thieves, now, like the good thief, acknowledge your God...If you are a Joseph of Arimathea, go to the one who ordered his crucifixion, and ask for Christ's body. Make your own the expiation for the sins of the whole world. If you are a Nicodemus, like the man who worshipped God by night, bring spices and prepare Christ's body for burial. If you are one of the Mary's, or Salome, or Joanna, weep in the early morning. Be the first to see the stone rolled back, and even the angels, and perhaps Jesus himself."

He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High and abides in the shade of the Almighty Says to the Lord: "My refuge, my stronghold, my God in whom I trust."

It is he who will free you from the snare of the fowler who seek to destroy you;

Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting System:

The new Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting (CBAR) service became operational Monday, March 16. The Bishops of the US approved the national reporting system following Pope Francis' May 2019 apostolic letter Vos estis *lux mundi (You are the light of the world),* to address the issue of sexual abuse and bishop accountability in the global Catholic Church. CBAR is one way to report allegations, operated by Convercent, Inc., an independent, third party entity that provides intake services to private institutions for reports of sensitive topics such as sexual harassment, through a secure, confidential, and professional platform. Individuals may make a report by accessing ReportBishopAbuse.org or calling (800)276-1562. Reports are taken 24 hours a day in English and Spanish. More in-
