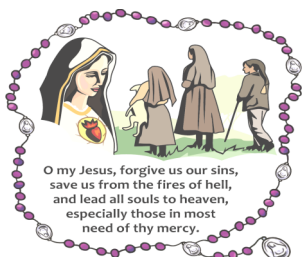


Sixth Sunday of Easter May 26, 2019

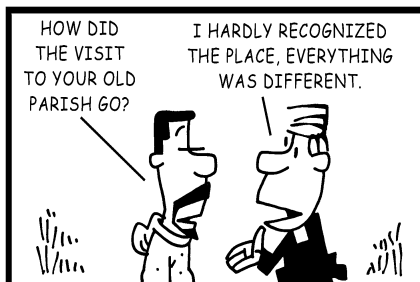
A Prayer for Memorial Day
