Dear Parishioners of Immaculate Conception and St Joseph!

The prophet Ezekiel speaks about water flowing from the right side of the temple. (Ez 47: 1-9, 12) He describes the water growing ankle-deep, then knee-deep, then waist-deep, then finally so deep that it could not be crossed. Wherever the water flows, everything became fresh and life abounded. You may ask, what is this temple? The initial reference was to the Jerusalem temple, but it refers even more importantly to a future temple, to Jesus himself.

On a Friday afternoon in March of 33 AD a man was pierced through his side. Out came blood and water. The soldier who thrust the lance cried out, "Truly this was the Son of God." In this moment Christ, who had been pierced, established the Church of the New Covenant. From the side of Christ came all sacramental life. The water for Baptism, the Blood for Holy Eucharist. In a forgotten corner of the Roman empire Jesus hang dead on a cross. It would seem that history would forget about this man. Nearly all his disciples fled. Only his mother and a few friends remained. Yet from the side of this Holy Man came a stream. This stream has never stopped. This stream has led to the Baptism of billions of people over the course of 2000 years. It has led to the grace of God rushing into the brokenness of our fallen humanity, bringing spiritual healing and health to all who receive this water. All seven sacraments indeed are as this river: ankle deep, knee deep, waist deep and now so deep that none can cross. The grace from all the sacraments flow from the wounded side of Christ, the origin of the Church. As Eve came from the side of Adam, so does the bride of Christ, the Church, come from the side of Jesus.

The power of sacraments are like the gentle flow of a stream. The busy persons of the world pay no attention. Yet the stream flows, bringing freshness to all who receive these waters. I want to share a grace that happened this last week, but that often happens as a priest. I was invited to celebrate the Anointing of the Sick for a woman. The invitation came by way of several connections. The charity and persistence of all made the anointing possible. As I called the facility, a friendly voice answered. As I explained my wish to come for an anointing, the staff person asked, "Is an anointing a religious thing?" Though the caretaker was unaware of the importance of the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, she was very welcoming. As I arrived, the women in the facility seemed like angels. I have never been so welcomed at a nursing home before in all my priesthood. They led me to the room of the dying woman. She was alone. Just a sole crucifix above her and a teddy bear at her side. She was breathing heavily. I anointed her, prayed the prayers of the dying and a Divine Mercy Chaplet. I left in silence. She passed 20 minutes later, having received every sacrament and blessing the Church can provide. This woman was faithful to prayer in life, God was faithful in her passing, bestowing upon her the sacraments, the river of life flowing from the wounded side of Christ on Calvary and now running ankle deep, knee deep, and waist deep throughout every nation.
