

Dear Parishioners of Immaculate Conception, St Joseph, and St John Cantius! We continue to live with restrictions. During the month of April, I may have travelled more distance on my bicycle than in my car. It is indeed a strange time. We pray that a normalcy can return. This past week Bishop William Callahan shared with us that he and the other Bishops of Wisconsin are in discussions regarding our return to church and to the public celebration of the sacraments. For the time being, however, the guidelines of the past month remain in effect. I am able to provide Confession. Likewise small gatherings of less than ten people are permitted to occur within the church. This has provided opportunities for adoration and the distribution of communion. You are welcome to make use of these opportunities. Please call or check the bulletin for details.

One of the first actions Bishop Callahan took in March was the dispensation of the Sunday Mass obligation. I am sure this leaves a huge spiritual hole in your Sunday mornings. Perhaps even a holy sadness has emerged. This is a good sign. It demonstrates your true love of Jesus and your desire to be with him. I pray that we can sometime soon return to Mass. However, I pray that this yearning for Mass is also awakening new ways to live your faith in your home.

Though our Sunday obligation to attend Mass is temporarily removed our permanent obligation to honor the Sabbath remains. God spoke to Moses and said, "Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day." This statement of Our Lord is enshrined as the third of our 10 commandments.

So what does it mean to keep Holy the Sabbath? Well God answers this question in Exodus chapter 20. "Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the LORD, your God. No work may be done then either by you, or your son or daughter... In six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them; but on the seventh day he rested. That is why the LORD has blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy."

May God bless you on this Sabbath. May it be a time of rest and encounter with our Lord. I am here if you are in need. Please do not hesitate to call. You are in my prayers. Trust in Jesus during this difficult time. Fr Dan Thelen
