Dear Parishioners of Immaculate Conception and St Joseph!

During my visit home on Mother's Day, my parents and I watched a classic movie entitled, "The Scarlet and the Black." Produced in 1983, this movie depicts the real-life story of Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty, who was an Irishborn priest and Vatican official, credited with saving 6,500 Jews and Allied war prisoners during World War II. The drama depicts the intense difficulties that the Roman citizens and Vatican officials experienced during the Nazi occupation of Rome in 1943. Monsignor O'Flaherty devised many creative ways to outwit the Nazi regime and protect the lives of many innocent victims. This included renting civilian homes, dressing in disguise and securing the secret transfer of the victims. In the end, the movie climaxes with a scene of conversion. The head of the Nazi occupation, Herbert Kappler, is found guilty of terrible atrocities, including the Ardeatine massacre, one of the worst incidents on Italian soil. The movie shows him being questioned prior to his imprisonment. Yet in this moment he experiences an incredible gift of mercy and learns what it means to be forgiven, leading to his eventual baptism by Monsignor O'Flaherty himself.

It is an intense drama. Difficult perhaps to watch, yet very important. The courage and bravery of Monsignor O'Flaherty is matched and surpassed by his intense love and compassion, even by love of his enemies.

In the Acts of the Apostles, we see a similar act of bravery and love depicted by St Paul and his companion Silas. (Acts 16:22) In the city of Philippi, a crowd attacks St Paul and Silas. The leaders of the city then have them stripped and beaten with rods. They are thrown into prison, into its innermost cell. How does St Paul and Silas handle this situation? Do they get upset? Are they filled with rage? No, they sing hymns to God all through the night. They praised the Lord, despite their injuries. God then intercedes. A severe earthquake breaks open the jail and the jailer and his family experience a great conversion, seeking baptism into the Christian faith.

What do you do when things go wrong? Do you praise the Lord? Do you see God's hand in difficult situations? Look to St Paul and Silas. Look to Monsignor O'Flaherty. Do not be overcome by evil or suffering. "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." (Phil 4:4-7) Please do not hesitate to call. You are in my prayers. Trust always in Jesus. SAFE HAVEN-YOU HAVE SAFE CHOICES

Wisconsin Safe Haven Laws allow parents to relinquish an infant under 72 hours old to any first responder, no questions asked. Those first responders could be police officers, 911 emergency medical staff, or hospital staff members. You do not have to give your name or address to the professional accepting the baby unless the baby has been harmed, someone is forcing the parent to give up the baby, or the baby is more than 3 days old. The parent may be asked if they are willing to fill out a form, but it is NOT required; however, it will help providers give the infant the best care. 
