"The Four Loves"

As Americans we tend to use love loosely. We say that we love a lot of things such as food, cars, sports, guns, the farm, even some say they love the Vikings. But what do we really mean by love? If we take a look at the Greek language, they had four different words for love which are: Storge, Philia, Eros, and Agape. Storge is liking someone through familiarity. An example of this would be the natural love of a parent for their child. Philia is the love between friends. This friendship is built off of sharing common values, interests, or activities. Eros is a type of romantic love between two people. It's the sense of "being in love" or "loving" someone. The greatest love anyone can experience is Agape, which is the love that exists regardless of changing circumstances. This is considered as the unconditional "God" love. As we can see clearly now, love is much more than just a word that we throw around and use. It's easy to fall into this trap based on my own experiences. I'm sure you can relate at some level. If you would like further reading, and a better explanation, there is a book by C.S. Lewis called "The Four Loves."

With that foundation I would like to share with you what's been on my mind in prayer these last few weeks. The Lord has really been working on my heart a lot and love has been a constant theme as of late. There can be days where I struggle loving the Lord, i.e. putting Him first throughout my day. What struck me was how He responded to me as I was reflecting on this struggle. He mentioned that I can't love Him very well without loving myself. There's a lot of truth to this. If we struggle loving ourselves it will be difficult to give love to others. I have a tendency to be self-critical and harsh on myself if I make a mistake. I don't always love myself in ways that I should. I'm so quick to forgive others but not to myself. Moving forward the Lord is calling me to a deeper love. He wants me to experience the Agape love that C.S. Lewis talks about in his book. The unconditional love that only God can give us. Let us pray for the grace to see ourselves through the eyes of Christ so that we to may treat ourselves with gentleness, compassion, and patience.

Bishop Callahan is graciously allowing public Mass to

resume again on Sundays.

There is no obligation to attend. The following guidelines will be helpful for those who plan to come.

Schedule

May 24th

- 9am FacebookLive Mass as usual (No Public Mass)

May 31st

- 8:30am - Mass at St Joseph (at 25% capacity)

- 10:15am - Mass at Immaculate Conception (at 25% capacity)

- 10:15am - FacebookLive Mass

Several points for May 31st

1) We will still continue the Live Stream Mass. Starting May 31st the time of the Live Stream will change to 10:15 am

2) The Sunday Mass obligation is not in effect. So it is not a 'sin' to miss Mass during this present time. However, you are still required to honor the Sabbath by setting that day aside for prayer and rest.

3) When Mass resumes on May 31st we will only be able to allow the churches to filled to 25% capacity. To accomplish this at St Joseph we will have half of St Joseph parish come one Sunday, and the other half come the following Sunday. To accomplish this at Immaculate Conception we will do the same thing: half of the parish will come one Sunday, and the other half the other Sunday. Thus you will be able to attend Mass every other week.

4) Seminarian Alex and I will flip a coin on Facebook Live at 7pm Wednesday, May 27th. The coin will determine which alphabetical group goes to Mass on May 31st. (We will not do the coin flip after this first time. The alphabetical groups will just rotate. Thus each group will be able to attend Mass every other week.)

5) Ushers will meet you at the front door and guide you to your pew. They will ensure proper spacing.

6) Masks are encouraged but not required. You can bring your own from home if you have one, or you can get one at Mass

7) Gloves can be worn. But they must be removed when you receive Communion.

8) If it is not your week to attend Mass, you can still come and wait in your car. If the 25% limit is not filled, the ushers will invite you into the church
