Dear Parishioners of Immaculate Conception and St Joseph!

This last week we celebrated the Feast of St John Vianney, the patron saint of priests. Because of poverty and his inability to learn Latin, St John Vianney struggled greatly in becoming a priest. Thus, following his ordination he was placed in an obscure and insignificant town located in an extremely rural part of France. This small town, called Ars, would be his home for the remainder of his life.

As pastor he had a simple pastoral plan. His goal was that every single person in Ars go to Mass every single Sunday. Every. Single. Person. Every. Single. Sunday. To implement this plan, he acquainted himself with everyone, fasted and prayed, taught, and heard multiple hours of confessions every day. And he preached, unremittingly, about the punishments of sin. Because of the French Revolution, many individuals in France had lost a fear of sin and the corresponding desire for God. His total commitment to his priestly state, his purity of life, and his moral uprightness; however, brought an incredible change to the people to whom he ministered. There was also that special something which only a saint has. St John Vianney had it. Like body language, which everyone can read but no one can explain, holiness surrounded him in all that he did.

Crowds of people started coming to Ars just ten years following his move there. The nearest large city, Lyon, added trains to and from Ars to accommodate the crowds. Father Vianney himself was the destination of these pilgrimages. People were physically healed and Father Vianney could read souls, especially in Confession. But his greatest gift was his own example of holiness. The lines seeking his counsel and his ministry in the Confessional were so long, that he was made a nearly constant inhabitant of the sacramental box. Father Vianney converted his parish one soul at a time, using the perennial tools of the Church: prayer, fasting, the sacraments, and preaching.

May the example of Saint John Vianney, his dedication to prayer and the sacraments provide an example of holiness to all parish priests and to their parishioners so that they may embody the fundamental spiritual truths of our faith.

I am here if you are in need. Please do not hesitate to call. You are in my prayers. Trust greatly in Jesus as we continue through this difficult time. St Joseph, Patron Saint of the Universal Church – Pray for Us

Missionary Fraternity of Mary

Next weekend, Aug. 15 & 16, we will be hosting Fr Jaime Charuc, who will talk to us about his mission, the Missionary Fraternity of Mary. We will have envelopes available, so please use them for the mission, as they will go in the collection basket in the aisle. Pease be generous.
Since only part of the parishes comes to Mass each week-end, we will have envelopes the next weekend as well, for those who are not here the weekend Fr Charuc is with us.

Father Jaime Charuc was born in San Pedro Yepocapa Chimaltenango in Guatemala on November 15, 1977. He began his formation at the Fraternity in January, 1994, and was ordained as priest in Venezuela on March 20, 2004, by his Excellency, the Most Reverend Jose Valero Sôtero Ruz.
Father Jaime has served as pastor in the missions in both Venezuela and in Kenya. In Kenya he was also the Diocesan Director of the Pontifical Mission Societies and the Director of vocations in the Diocese of Malindi.
For four years he was the Vice-director of formation in the Major seminary of the Fraternity in Guatemala City.
At this time, he is the Director of Development for the Fraternity and the Mission Appeals coordinator in the USA and Canada. I hope that you will be satisfied with our presence and that a deep and lasting communion will be established between our Fraternity and your parish.
He speaks Spanish, English, and Kiswahili.

SUPPORT FORMATION PROGRAMS FOR SEMINARIANS IN GUATEMALA, CENTRAL AMERICA

The Missionary Fraternity of Mary is a Society of Religious Life with diocesan right located in Guatemala City, Guatemala. The Fraternity offers young men ages 17 and beyond a chance to become agents of change within society as missionary

There are 160 priests of the Missionary Fraternity of Mary working in 11 countries (Panama, Peru, Venezuela, Ecuador, Guatemala, Belize, Honduras, Italy, Kenya, Canada and the United States). Actually, the Fraternity is supporting the formation of 75 seminarians in different levels of formation. Most of the young men in the seminary coming from very poor areas in Guatemala, they cannot afford tuition. Our challenges are many, since we don't have any monthly or yearly financial support from any institution in Guatemala, we continue to relay on the support of the MCP to fund our formation programs at the seminary in Guatemala. The annual cost of formation is \$3,000/year per seminarian. The Fraternity also provides youth ministry to educate young men and women, prepares them for Church and community leadership. Over 6,000 young men and women have experienced a spiritual retreat called Exodista's Retreat. The retreats prepare and empower youth in ministry, to go forth and to continue the mission in their own communities.

Together we can offer hope for a more meaningful life, not only for the young men ordained as missionary priests but for the people we serve worldwide.

Support the Missionary Fraternity of Mary in its mission to continue providing opportunities for those with a true vocation to the priesthood. Any contribution will benefit directly the formation programs for the seminarians of the Missionary Fraternity of Mary in Guatemala.
