Dear Parishioners of Immaculate Conception and St Joseph!

This past Tuesday were the feast days of two unique saints. The first was St Louis, for whom the city of St Louis, Missouri is named after. St Louis was a king in France during the thirteenth century. Do any of you have children or grand-children that are twelve years old? Well Saint Louis became King of France at the age of twelve. Could you imagine your little one being a King or Queen of a country at the age of twelve? His mother helped him rule until he was eighteen. So he didn't have to do it alone. :)

Saint Louis was a fair and good king for both the lowest peasant and the richest vassal. He was in many ways an ideal Christian ruler for his justice and his moral integrity. Later in life, he wrote a deeply spiritual letter to his son, a letter we can still read to this day. The following is a small section from this letter, "Dear son, the first thing I advise is that you fix your whole heart upon God, and love Him with all your strength...shun everything which you believe to be displeasing to Him...no matter what may happen and you should permit all your limbs to be hewn off, and suffer every manner of torment, rather than fall knowingly into mortal sin...Dear son, have a tender pitiful heart for the poor... and I pray our Lord Jesus Christ, by His mercy, by the prayers and merits of His blessed Mother, the Virgin Mary, and of angels and archangels and of all the saints, so that after this mortal life we may be able to be together with Him in the eternal life, and see Him, love Him, and praise Him without end. Amen"

The other saint we celebrated Tuesday was Saint Joseph Calasanz. Saint Joseph Calasanz is most well-known for creating the first public school for the poor. He offered education free of charge. For all of the children who are starting school right now, you can blame Father Joseph Calasanz that you have to get up and go to school. Before his time only wealthy children got to go to school. All children had to pay for their schooling, and no one had free education. The international organization UNESCO also praises St Joseph Calasanz and recognizes him as the first individual to offer free education to the poor.

St Joseph Calasanz was himself well-educated and had many offers to do more important work. However, he said, "In Rome I discovered the best way to serve God-by helping these poor children. Nothing in the world could bring me to change my course." Thus St Joseph Calasanz followed a Christian path and did not choose positions for fame or fortune. He is a great model for all of us. We should likewise, serve first
