Dear Parishioners of Immaculate Conception and St Joseph!

This past week we celebrated the Feasts of the Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Rafael on Tuesday and then on Friday the Feast of our Guardian Angels. Thus the past week was filled with the celebrations of the angels.

The Greek word ἄγγελος or "angelos" means messenger or angel. Angels are purely spiritual beings that do God's will (Psalm 103:20, Matthew 26:53). The following is a brief list of the appearance of angels in the New Testament. An equally long list can be made of angels from the Old Testament.

1. An angel of the Lord appeared to St. Joseph in three separate dreams. First to announce that the child conceived in Mary was by the power of Holy Spirit, secondly to flee with the Holy Family to Egypt, and finally to return to Nazareth (Matthew 1:18-2:23).
2. Angels announce the birth of the Christ Child to the shepherds (Luke 2:14), minister to Christ after his temptation in the desert (Matthew 4:11), comfort Jesus in his agony in the garden (Luke 22:43), and proclaim his resurrection from the dead (John 20:12).
3. Jesus Christ stated the angels of little ones continually behold the face of the Father (Matthew 18:10).
4. Angels will come with Christ on the Day of Judgement (Matthew 24:31), and the angels will separate the wicked from the just on the Last Day (Matthew 13:49) (Mark 13:32).

Regarding the archangels, we know of three in particular. St Michael is considered the "Prince" of the heavenly hosts. He appears three times in the Book of Daniel (10:13, 10:21, and 12:1) and is the only one in the Bible referred to specifically as an Archangel (Jude 1:9). He serves a major role in Chapter 12 of the Book of Revelation. The angel Gabriel first appears twice to Daniel (Daniel 8:16 and 9:21), but is best known for the Annunciation to Mary that she would be the Mother of Jesus, the Son of God (Luke 1:26-38). The Book of Tobias (Tobit 12:15) names Raphael as "one of the seven who stand before the Lord." Raphael also demonstrates that angels can take on human form as seen in his encounter and journey with Tobias.

St Thomas Aquinas was a great medieval theologian, and is known as the "Angelic Doctor" for his writings in the Summa Theologica. This title gave rise to the name of the university in Rome where I learned my theology, the Angelicum University. Quoting Scripture, St Thomas Aquinas named nine choirs or orders of angels. They are placed in three groups. The highest hierarchy includes the Seraphim (Isaiah 6:2), Cherubim (Genesis 3:24, Ezekiel 10:1-22), and Thrones (Colossians 1:16); the middle hierarchy being the Dominations (Colossians 1:16), Virtues (First Peter 3:22), and Powers (Colossians 1:16); and the third hierarchy being the Principalities (Colossians 1:16), Archangels (First Thessalonians 4:16), and Angels.

SAVE Moms and Babies Act (H.R. 4399 / S. 3072)
 A rising threat to the lives of unborn babies is the chemical abortion pill. The number of chemical abortions in the US has gone up dramatically, while the overall number of abortions has decreased. COVID-19 is expected to only make the problem worse, with more women (and teen girls) seeking chemical abortions at home—even illegally, by mail and without a doctor's prescription. This is especially scary because chemical abortion can be more painful, traumatic, and risky for women than surgical abortion. But there is hope: a new bill has been introduced that could help protect mothers and babies from chemical abortion.
 The Support and Value Expectant (SAVE) Moms & Babies Act ([H.R. 4399 / S. 3072](#)) could help improve regulation of chemical abortion pills. The SAVE Moms & Babies Act would codify current FDA (Food and Drug Administration) safety regulations requiring physicians to dispense the pills, prevent providers from dispensing these drugs remotely, by mail, or via tele-medicine, and prevent the (FDA) from approving new chemical abortion drugs or from making labeling changes to existing abortion drugs.
 Please TAKE ACTION NOW to urge your Senators and Representative to co-sponsor and work to enact S. 3072 or H.R. 4399 or to thank them if they have already done so.
