Dear Parishioners of Immaculate Conception and St Joseph!

I often base my bulletin columns on the readings from the Tuesday daily Mass. The first reading from this past Tuesday was the passage from Ephesians regarding Christ and his Church. The modern world often rejects any difference in the sexes. Catholics believe, just like the world, that man and woman are equal. Each gender, according to St Paul, are equally granted salvation through Jesus Christ. Catholics, however, believe in complementarity between the sexes. Each gender has a special gift to provide each other. The feminine genius provides one gift. The masculine genius provides another. Together, both man and woman complement each other. There is not competition between the sexes, rather there is complementarity.

The letter from Ephesians is challenging as it speaks about how a wife should be subordinate to her husband. A husband in turn should lay down his life for his bride. The word subordinate is coming from the Latin 'subjecta', which literally means, 'under the mission'. The relationship between husband and wife is most perfectly demonstrated by the spousal union of Christ and the Church. The Church is under the mission of Christ, meaning that the Church always carries out the mission of Christ. Christ in turn sacrifices all for his bride, even to the point of dying for the salvation of the Church. Thus, husbands you are called to live the Gospel of Jesus and die for your bride. Wives you are called to unite in the mission of your husband, to be under your husband in your shared mission of living the Gospel of Jesus.

Having just tackled one difficult topic, I will also wade into the pressing topic of elections. Those who lead our nations are ultimately servants of all. Let us pray that our leaders will seek to help all people, especially those most vulnerable. Power, as we know, has a corrupting influence. Just listening to political ads is akin to me sitting in the confessional box. However, unlike confession, the political opponents are always confessing everyone else's sins but never their own. The political landscape has always been tainted by corruption. Only by the grace of God is progress made. No. 2270 of the Catechism states, 'from the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person'. All other rights, from the right to vote, the right to liberty, the right to due process are dependent upon this one fundamental right, the right to life. Once again in 2019 the U.S. bishops reaffirmed that the "threat of abortion" remains the "preeminent priority" for U.S. bishops. Please, as you cast your ballot, listen to this guidance from our bishops.

I am here if you are in need. Please do not hesitate to call. You are in my prayers. Trust greatly in Jesus as we continue through this difficult time. St Joseph, Patron Saint of the Universal Church – Pray for Us
