Dear Parishioners of Immaculate Conception and St Joseph!

The prophet Isaiah provides us with one of the most profound insights into the moral life. Some of the greatest minds in the church, from the Fathers of antiquity to the scholastics of the Middle Ages have contemplated the meaning of Isaiah 11:2. It is in this verse that we are given the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. These gifts, revealed in the Old Testament, are applied prophetically to Christ. Christ was seen to have all seven gifts. We are called to be Christ -like. Therefore, we too should daily ask for these seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, to live a life of moral virtue. In the Middle Ages St Thomas Aquinas provided an extensive commentary on the close connection between the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit and the cardinal and theological virtues. His reflections remain just as profound to this day.

The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are, according to Catholic Tradition, heroic character traits that Jesus Christ alone possesses in their fullness but that Christ freely shares with the members of his mystical body (i.e., his Church). We are first endowed with these gifts at our baptism, they are nurtured by our prayer and the practice of moral virtue, and then are sealed in the sacrament of Confirmation. They are also known as the sanctifying gifts of the Spirit, because they serve the purpose of preparing us to be docile to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, helping us to grow in holiness and making us fit for heaven.

The gifts of the Holy Spirit help us to grow in virtue. So what is virtue? A virtue is the habit of doing the good. Just like an athlete trains their body to excel at scoring a goal, a virtue is the habit of doing the good. This habit allows the person not only to perform good acts, but to give the best of themselves. The virtuous person pursues the good and chooses it in concrete actions. The ultimate goal of a virtuous life is to become like God, according to St Gregory of Nyssa.

The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. They belong in their fullness to Christ. According to the catechism, they complete and perfect the virtues of those who receive them. They make the faithful docile in readily obeying divine inspirations.

May this Advent Season prepare you for the joy of Christ's presence in your life. I am here if you are in need. Please do not hesitate to call. You are in my prayers. Trust greatly in Jesus as we continue through this difficult time. St Joseph, Patron Saint of the Universal Church – Pray for Us


