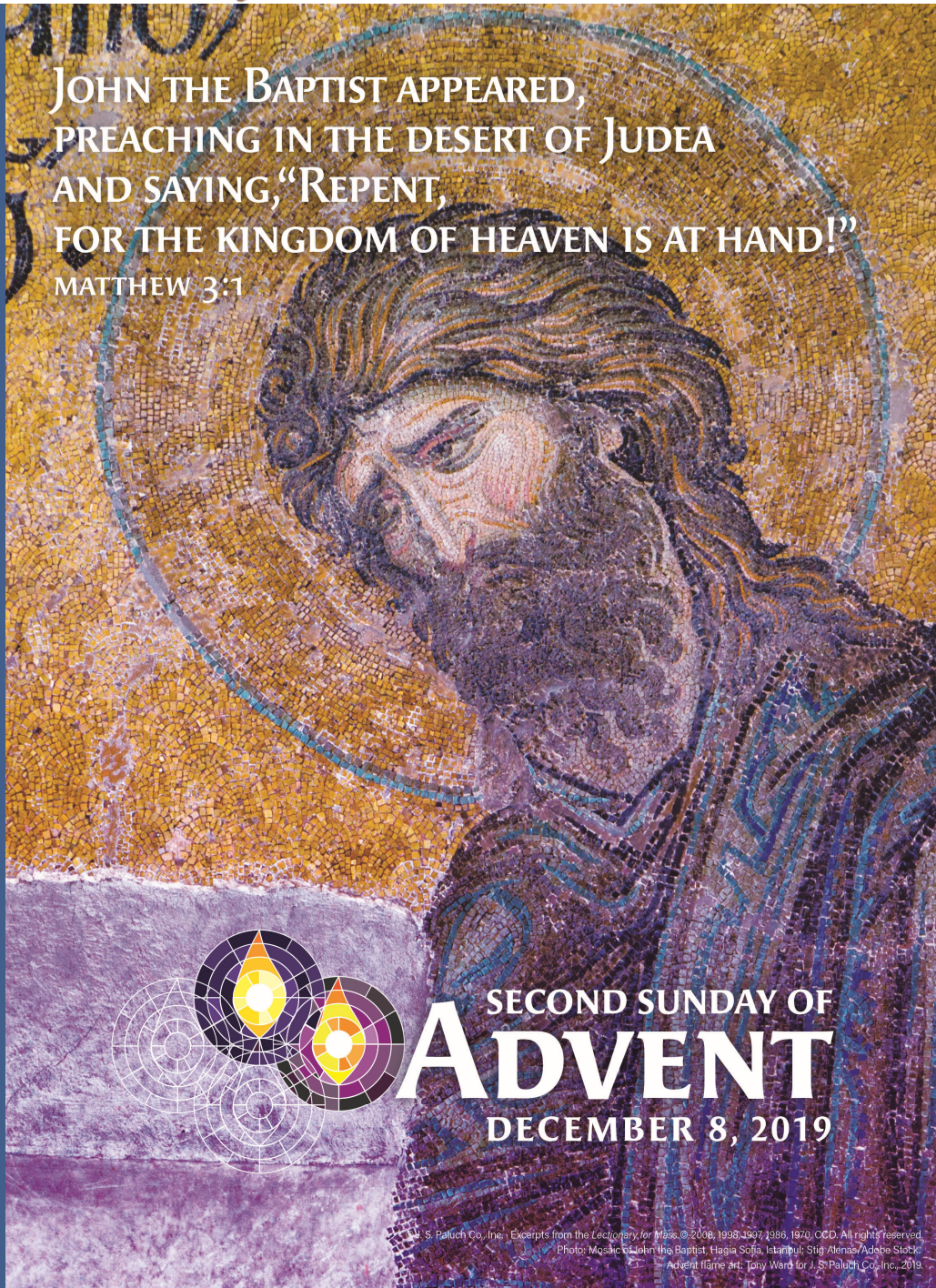

From the Pastor's Desk

Mt. 3:1-12. "Repent for the Kingdom of heaven is at hand!"

John the Baptist is preparing us for the arrival of the Lord! John's clothing was made of camel hair, he matched that with a leather belt, he ate locust and wild honey. A very different kind of "God's representative" than the people of God before him.

He was the "voice" that was not always easy to listen to and John himself was not easy to look at, especially when the lookers had something in them that needed to be dramatically changed. When he addresses the Pharisees and Sadducees in the Gospel today, he criticizes them for all their spiritual misgivings and he wants them finally to "produce good fruit" as evidence of their repentance. It is important to be sorry for what happens but a second step is to create the plan that will help to do better. This Advent we all are called to do better and all can get better with God's help.

Blessed are those that are on the right path with the Lord! And those who are not there yet are called by John the Baptist to healing and fruition! A good tree brings good fruits but we are much more in God's eyes than just trees. We can change our spiritual "DNA" regardless of our past and many obstacles that come with it. A void that comes from the dark world today is not what God wants for us, it is what we create ourselves for ourselves.

The worldly darkness falsifies the light too often, it makes us believe that we should forget the light. But God sends us tools and people like St. John the Evangelist to come back to Him. With this help we should prosper and not be cut down. A change is always possible and welcomed! Getting better is in God's plan for all the people in the world. Let's stick with the plan this Advent!

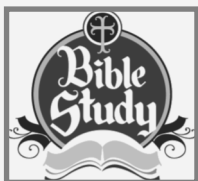

Saint of the Day

December 8. Under the title of the *Immaculate Conception*, the Blessed Virgin is the patron of the United States. Thus this is a major feast --in fact a Holy Day of Obligation--for the United States of America.



December 9. The fact that Our Lady appeared to a simple peasant has been viewed as a sure sign of Mary's care for the "little people" of society. *Saint Juan Diego* played a major role in the recognition of the apparitions of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Without his courageous witness few people would have known of her love for the indigenous peoples of Mexico—and elsewhere.

December 11. *Saint Damasus* was highly praised by his secretary, Saint Jerome. This adulation must have been much appreciated, as Saint Damasus faced the trials of the papacy in his day. A fearless leader, Saint Damasus did not always achieve victory in this life.

December 12. The Blessed Virgin's appearance at Tepeyac to Saint Juan Diego in 1531, was the beginning of a beautiful story of God's and Mary's love and care for the peoples of Mexico. As *Our Lady of Guadalupe*, the Blessed Virgin was named patroness of all of the Americas in 2003.

December 13. Little is known about *Saint Lucy* except that she had taken a vow of virginity, and that she was martyred in 304. Yet devotion to her sprung up in the early Church, and she is mentioned among the martyrs in the First Eucharistic Prayer

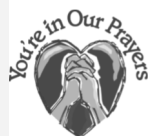

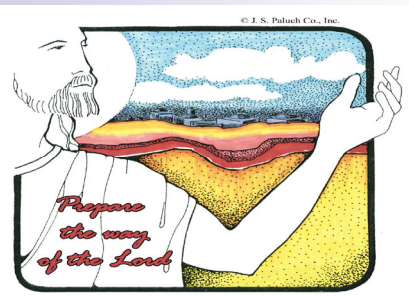

Gifts of the Spirit

Part of Isaiah's hopeful description of the Messiah contains the traditional seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. As we prepare to celebrate the birth of the Messiah, and looking forward to his coming in glory, let us take a look at those gifts and see how we can use them. Wisdom is the gift of seeing God in creation. It means that we value the things of this world only as they help us to know and love God more. The second gift, understanding, follows from wisdom. We understand what God expects of us in dealing with creation and other people. This gift helps us know how to act in a world that seems to ignore God.

Counsel follows from understanding as the gift of making correct judgments on how to act. For example, understanding can lead us to love others; counsel guides us to love them in appropriate ways. Strength, or fortitude, is the gift that enables us to do those things inspired by understanding and counsel, even if they are difficult. John the Baptist displays that gift in the Gospel. Fortitude gave him the courage to die for his faith. Knowledge is similar to counsel in that we begin to see what God wants for us in this world.

Knowledge leads us to deeper revelations of the truths of our faith. This can lead to the sixth gift, piety (seventh in Isaiah's text--"delight in the Lord"), a willingness to worship and love God, a desire to be close to God in prayer.

The final gift, fear of the Lord, is the awe and wonder of recognizing how great God is, how much God loves us, and how much we want to stay close to God. And the desire to be close to God circles back to the wisdom with which we see God in creation.
