# From the Pastor's Desk

The Assumption of Mary!

The Catholic Church teaches us the dogma, that Mary after fulfilling her earthly duties was "assumed" to Heaven with her body and soul. The doctrine was dogmatically defined by Pope Pius XII on November 1st 1950. So what we celebrate on this holy day of obligation is the Blessed Virgin Mary being taken to Heaven as well as the belief that she has physically never died. Mary is victorious over sin and death through Christ, the new (perfect) Adam. Christ is also the perfect fruit that brings us the new Life.

The old tradition of bringing "the first fruits from the fields and gardens" encourages the practice of bringing baskets filled with such "fruits" to the church on that day. They are being blessed by the presiding priest sometimes during the Assumption Mass. Usually "the first fruits" are understood as fruits, vegetables and wine. Those can be consumed later when brought back home. The time of the year is the time of "first fruits" that we collect this Summer. To the people who lived in the rural settings this time was drawing a line because of the seasons changing. The harvest time was starting.

Today, even thou, we live in a different reality, we still can talk about the beginning of the harvest. The month of August is a perfect time to start summarizing our progress virtually in anything. The "fruits" that we look for around this Assumption, hopefully are especially spiritual.

But this is time to look at our lives from as many perspectives as possible. Do our efforts bring a fruition? If yes, is it a good one? Are our efforts inspired by Christ? What else can be done to make them better or more successful? The gift of Jesus the true fruit of Mary, reminds us that our work brings an outcome. Sins Christ knows all the answers, we have to trust him completely with our lives and our work.

The seasons change but they are never securing only once. The cycles never stop, they are moving forward. They are given to us by God who overlooks His people and Who wants to be part of our lives. He gives us all that is necessary for our lives on earth and for our salvation. God is perfection that we have to learn from not only to survive but how to step up and become similar to Him. Looking at Mary, we see that all is possible. God had entrusted Her with Christ Himself. We always have reasons to thank God and to ask Him for more. ## Saint of the Day

**August 11.** *Saint Clare* referred to

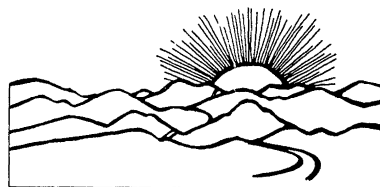
herself as a little plant. In many ways, she was a strong oak. The first woman to write a Rule of Life for her sisters, she insisted

on the privilege of poverty until her dying breath, getting papal approval of her Rule just days before she died. A model of humility, Clare cared for her sisters even through her own years of illness. Her devotion to Jesus was extraordinary.

**August 12.** *Saint Jane Frances de Chantal* was a wife and the mother of six. When her husband was killed, Saint Jane took a vow not to remarry and sought to join a religious community. She was dissuaded by her spiritual director, Saint Francis de Sales. Eventually, she and two others founded a community intended for those who could not join the established congregations. They wanted to actively engage in the works of mercy, but social circumstances forced them to live a cloistered life.

**August 17.** Transformed from greedy and surly businesswoman to saint is the story of *Saint Joan of the Cross*. Her conversion is credited to an elderly woman whom most people thought was crazy, but who reached Saint Joan's heart. Saint Joan of the Cross went on to found a religious congregation and several charitable institutions.

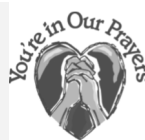

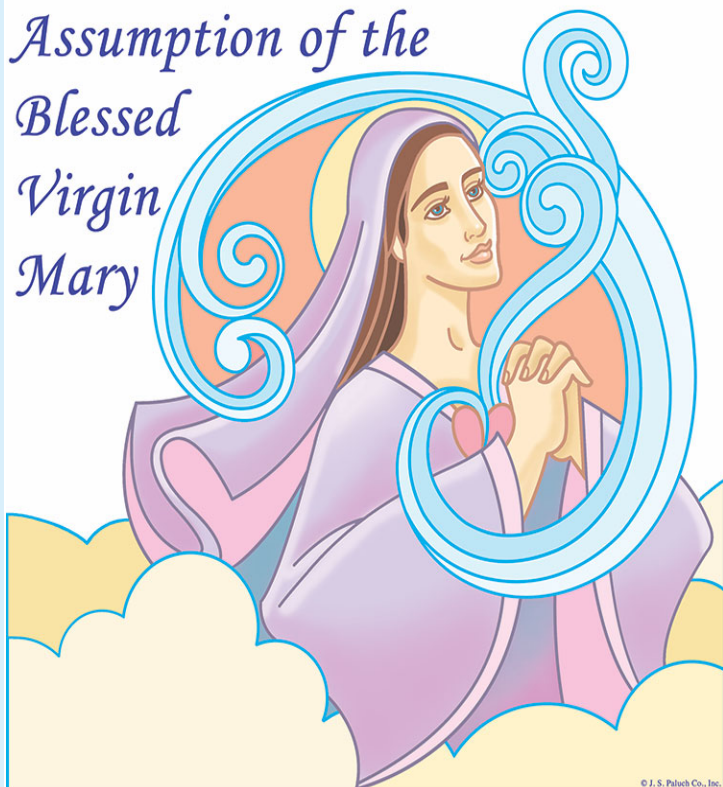

## Question of the Week



Considering that the end may come at any time, am I prepared? What can I do to prepare myself for my end time?

## Are You Talking To Me?

In today's Gospel Jesus talks about being prepared, using the parable of the servants waiting for their master's return from a wedding. Parables usually have a surprise twist and this one is no exception. Jesus pictures the master coming back at a late hour and finding the servants ready for him. The master is so pleased that he begins to wait on the servants--he serves them a meal. (I can almost hear the disciples saying, "No way!")

Perhaps Peter was thinking, "Surely we will be prepared when Jesus comes again. He must be talking about the rest of the people." To answer Peter's question, Jesus warns that the servant who knew his duties would be punished more than one who was ignorant of those expectations. Peter and the disciples should have seen themselves as the servants who knew what was expected.

That warning is one for us to hear also. We may look down on non-Christians or wonder if they will get to heaven. But the Lord doesn't expect as much from those who don't know God. Instead of judging them, we would be better off looking at ourselves. Am I serious about my faith, serious enough to show it in my actions? Has my good example ever brought a non-believer to the Church?

There are examples of this even in your own parish. If you have been in the parish for many years, you could be expected to notice a newcomer more readily. How do you welcome them? "So how much does Jesus expect of me?" The answer could be in how well you know Jesus.

## Treasures from Tradition

When Pope Pius XII died in 1958, there was the usual buzz of speculation about likely successors. Cardinal Agagianian, Patriarch of the Armenians, was highly thought of as a likely choice. This took many Catholics by surprise, since he had never celebrated the same liturgy as Pope Pius, but followed ancient Armenian customs according to the Eastern Church, which veils the Eucharistic liturgy from sight by a series of curtains, and in which the priest kneels while the people stand for Communion.

In the years that followed, the Second Vatican Council would affirm the dignity and independence of the Eastern Churches, in complete union with Rome, yet different in patterns of life and worship. We have the same faith, the same sacraments, and the same pope. Yet everywhere in the world our separate Churches are combined into families held together by the ministry of bishops. All of this serves as warning: If you ever say, "But we've always done it this way," you are on very thin ice indeed!
