

From the Pastor's Desk

This weekend we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The moment in history when Mary after completing her earthly course of life was taken with her body and soul to Heaven. What it really means is that Mary was a hero that had completed her heroic mission on

earth by following God's precepts and always keeping her faith even when she was witnessing Jesus's death on the Cross.

This weekend is the time when we often bless the first fruits from the gardens, thanking God for many blessings, especially the blessing of the Grown produce. God overlooks our prosperity and lives. The biggest "fruit" that was given us by God was Jesus Christ that was born of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He is the living bread of life. All who eat Him will live forever!

Mary did Her part as it was proclaimed to her by the angel during the Annunciation. Lk. 1:26-38. She fulfilled Her vocation. Her "fruits" are touching us because she said "yes" to Lord completely!!! This Assumption weekend is another time to look at our personal vocations today. We all have a specific role in the church and the roles have specific requirements. God looks at us as his Church but also, he looks at us individually! There are different expectations that he addresses to children and different to adults.

As fruits and flowers in our gardens, we need to grow to give Glory to the Lord. None of us should or try to stop our own growth. The spiritual growth comes with the formation that hopefully, we all receive in the right time of our life!

One of the signs of maturity is to show our care for God's Church. The big Roman Catholic Church and each parish like ours are given to us as a gift through which Christ works and is present!

During the pandemic time, many people have been concerned about the future. I am not addressing this remark and request to those who are financially hurting now. I am addressing the "appeal" to all who have been blessed enough before, during, and after the pandemic and still don't see how blessed they are. Too many people that are well off do not think about "God's house" that much. Maybe they care about their faith, but they don't want to listen about the needs of the Church. Maybe there are different reasons.

Maybe also I am already qualified to talk about myself as an "older generation" but I remember my parents and grandparents always supporting the Church for better and for worse. It was hard especially in old times when things were not so easy and sometimes dramatic because of the moment in that history for those people. But people did it anyway. None dared to give "leftovers" to the Church because giving to the Church is our reflection on how we relate to God!

Therefore I will never understand giving "leftovers" by the people who are serious about their faith. We don't send bills to anyone but if you go to a fast food place anywhere in America, you know that for a "meal" \$10 at least has to be spent. The spending power of the money today is very different than it was several years ago.

I am really grateful to parishioners who go above and beyond to support St. Hugh but there are mostly the same people who give their "best fruits" and who do not give the church "some leftovers." Not many of them are around. Actually less and less are available anymore!!!

As I mentioned, I realize that many people today are challenged because of the situation with the virus, maybe some other setbacks are in their lives, but many simply have not cared financially about the church before as

and surly businesswoman to saint is the story of Saint Joan of the Cross. Her conversion is credited to an elderly

woman whom most people thought was who reached Saint Joan's heart. Saint Joan of the Cross went on to found a religious congregation and several charitable institutions.

August 18. Born into royalty and headed for the throne of his father, St. Louis of Toulouse renounced his status, became a Franciscan, and was named a bishop. It was during the years that he was held hostage and under the tutelage of the Friars, that St. Louis began to realize his call to something other than the throne. He was known for his generosity to the poor.

August 19. Saint John Eudes was a noted preacher and confessor. He founded several seminaries because he saw the need for clerical formation. He also founded a couple of religious communities to address the needs that he saw. Saint John had a great devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart

of Mary. **August 22.** The notion of a *queen* is somewhat foreign to American ears, but this feast of Mary recognizes her role in the Kingdom of her Son, Jesus. If Jesus is king, Mary is certainly queen. And the title—or its surrogate—goes back centuries in the Church, as Mary has been praised for her position in the Church and among the people of God.

Mass Updates and Thank You from Father Robert Our daily and Sunday Mass Celebration during these different times. I am very glad that we at have at least a somewhat normal experience of the daily and Sunday Mass. I have expressed already many times how appreciative I am that our volunteers have stepped up to the challenge of serving us all while making the reopening of the church possible.

We hopefully will keep the freedom to come to church physically from now on. And hopefully we will be open totally soon.

After these last several weeks of the partial reopening I have been observing the process and I have come up with some suggestions.

Please:

1. Let us all be on time before any Mass Celebration starts. Being "on time" means these days at least to enter the Church 5-10 min before the planned start of the Mass. We only use the ramp door to enter the church at

This process can be compared at the moment to a plane boarding. Where normally the passengers cannot just get to the plane because the crew has to let them in during any boarding! We almost try to do the same here at St. Hugh until the pandemic is over. Being at the door early enough helps the volunteers and helps us all to start the Mass Celebration on time! Late walk ins interrupt the Mass because the ramp door closeness to the altar.

2. Please be grateful to the volunteers for what they do for all of us, especially by keeping us all safe!

Renew My Church: The San Damiano Cross Keeps Our Focus

A while back, I shared the story of St. Francis hearing Jesus call to him from the San Damiano cross. Praying before this icon of our Lord, St. Francis of Assisi heard Jesus call to him: "Go repair my Church, which, as you see, is falling completely into ruin."

At first, St. Francis initially took this to mean he was to repair the church buildings of San Damiano. However, he eventually discerned that Jesus was calling him to rebuild the spiritual life and vitality of the entire earthly Church. Likewise, we must see that the future of the Catholic Church is bigger than any of our parish buildings.

This icon of Jesus helps us remain focused on three very important realities as we renew our faith lives, parishes and the archdiocese:

It portrays Jesus speaking to us even though he is dying, which serves as a reminder that we need not be afraid to take up this work even if it costs us something, for Jesus is with us always.

Jesus is surrounded by others, highlighting the fact that, as we take up the challenge of renewal, our unity should not be diminished but strengthened.

Jesus is also featured as the Risen One at the top of the cross – a sign of hope to us that in this renewal, which will require us to die to ourselves and familiar patterns, Jesus is offering us new life and vitality for the future.

St. Pius X

(1835-1914) August 21 Presidential vetoes we understand. But imagine vetoing a papal election! Yet in the conclave of 1903, the Archbishop of Cracow (ironically, a predecessor in that office of Karol Wojtyla, the future John Paul II) vetoed the leading candidate on the order of the Austro -Hungarian emperor, Instead, the cardinals elected Giuseppe Sarto of Venice as Pius X, the first pope, after a succession of nobles and diplomats, to hail from humble origins. Nor did the papacy alter his endearing simplicity. Tailors eventually made his cassock cuffs detachable because he absentmindedly wiped his fountain pen on them, forgetting that his old black cassock had been replaced by papal white! Taking as his motto "To restore all things in Christ" (Ephesians 1:10), Pius condemned the theological innovations called "modernism," yet dramatically altered the thencommon practice whereby people rarely received Communion for fear of unworthiness, mandating early First Communion and urging everyone to frequent reception. Refusing to bless troops assembled in Saint Peter's Square—"I bless peace, not war!"—he died brokenhearted as World War I engulfed Christian Europe despite his peacemaking efforts.

TIPS FOR ALL WORSHIPERS — What to Expect

<u>BEFORE YOU ARRIVE</u> — *Check your temperature: if you have one, please do not come to church. *Stay home if you are ill. *Make sure you have a face covering to bring and wear. *Make sure to register by calling the office or registering online..

<u>WHEN YOU ARRIVE</u> — #Enter only in marked doorways. #Wait patiently to be checked in by greeter. #Keep your face covering or mask on at all times except for receiving Communion. #Sanitize your hands as directed by greeter. #Observe social distancing at all times (look for marks on the floor). #Ushers will direct you to pews with markings showing where to sit. #Since there will be no passing of baskets for your offering please leave your offering in the boxes provided at the entrance and exit areas.

DURING THE SERVICE — *Do not change seats during a service. *There will be no passing of offering baskets. *No physical sign of peace will be exchanged during Mass. *Follow instructions for Communion:

Leave your seat only when directed by usher or greeter. • Maintain six feet social distancing in the Communion line – look for marks on the floor. • When 12 feet or two people away from the priest, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces. • Approach the priest only after you are called forward. DO NOT remove your face covering. • Extend a single hand to receive the Host. • After moving six feet to the right or left, remove your mask and consume the Host. • Replace your face covering or mask. • Follow instructions to return to your pew.

<u>AFTER THE SERVICE</u> — Please take any worship aids you may have brought with you. You will be dismissed by pew or seating area. Follow the instructions of the greeter or usher. Use only the designated exit doors. Do not congregate outside the church doors. Continue to wear your face covering or mask until you leave the area where worshipers are.

While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 any time they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.
