From the Pastor's Desk

"You are the Christ the Son of the living God" Mt. 16:13-20.

In the Gospel today, Jesus asks; "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" He hears all kinds of answers until Peter says the famous words, "You are the Christ the Son of the living God." Jesus blesses Him because the words don't come from just any human being, through his mouth they come from God.

Peter to recognize Jesus like this had to be on the right "track" and he had to be close with the Lord! He is able to see that Jesus is not just the one who walks with them every day, but He is divine!!! To acknowledge Christ in our lives means to put Him in the right category. He is accessible and reaching out to us, He is the Lord at the same time! For recognizing the Lord, Peter is rewarded by Jesus with the Keys to the Kingdom of Heaven.

Perhaps our final reward comes when it is time for it. But at this time there is so much more to do to make this world acceptable for Jesus. Christ has to be recognized by all Christians again!!!

These hard months that started in March 2020 for many of us are also challenging because of the political and economic unrest. The "wave" of the trouble has been making many people in the world wondering about the future of everything. The "groups" of extremists (often financed by strangers and often supported by liberal governments) that have been destroying American cities, have been connected with the others like them in Europe and elsewhere!!!

1. Very disappointing news comes from Germany, where the anarchists are occupying many buildings in cities like Berlin. At the most part, the rebels feel careless, free to do whatever they want to do:

- Stay in apartments, not paying anything.
- They fight with the "system" by destroying anything they can.
- They have regular training and they look for new recruits.
- The liberal government there does almost nothing.
- The regular citizens live in fear as of now.

2. If number 1 sounds familiar, you are right. It does.

Thankfully, the problem that was going on in Seattle is mostly over. Not because the also liberal government there is so thoughtful but because the business owners have been suing the mayor of Seattle! "The summer of love" was canceled because of the lawsuits!

There still are more cities like New York that deal with lawlessness still. Where murders have been skyrocketing because the liberal Mayor has decided to defund police and side with the people that have no human or God's values on their minds. Chicago is in the equation too. The only thing that those criminals still want to pursue on the two sides of the Atlantic is to destroy everything!

Some European countries have been trying to break away from the Main E. U. because of the danger that comes from the more liberal countries like Germany and France. Officially and unofficially several countries have made their steps.

Saint of the Day

August 27. Perhaps Saint Monica is best known as the mother of Saint

Augustine—a pretty noble label. But

Saint Monica was also the mother of two other children, and is known as a woman of great prayer. We know that she prayed for the conversion of her son, and her prayers were heard. She also prayed for and obtained the conversion of her husband and mother-in-law.

August 28. Saint Augustine is a giant in many ways. He had a powerful and forceful personality which he used both before and after his conversion. He had a passion for whatever he did, and this showed up in his theological teachings. Yet he also was a man of great love, as is evident in his sermons to his priests. And he had a deep love for the Lord.

August 29. The martyrdom of John the Baptist is one of the most gruesome stories in the New Testament. Yet it is the story of the victory of faith and loyalty over cowardice and hate. A king makes a careless promise and does not have the courage or integrity to do the right thing when his jealous wife takes advantage. This is one of those blunt stories of what living faithfully is all about. August 30. Canonized in 2009, Saint Jeanne Jugan had a history of helping the elderly and the poor. She founded the Little Sisters of the Poor to help her with her work, and by the time of her death they numbered 2,400. Her life included a few obstacles, but Saint Jeanne was a woman of determination and vision and she got it done.

Mass Updates and Thank You from Father Robert
Our daily and Sunday Mass Celebration during these different times. I am very glad that we at have at least a somewhat normal experience of the daily and Sunday Mass. I have expressed already many times how appreciative I am that our volunteers have stepped up to the challenge of serving us all while making the reopening of the church possible.

We hopefully will keep the freedom to come to church physically from now on. And hopefully we will be open totally soon.

After these last several weeks of the partial reopening I have been observing the process and I have come up with some suggestions.

Please:

1. Let us all be on time before any Mass Celebration starts. Being "on time" means these days at least to enter the Church 5-10 min before the planned start of the Mass. We only use the ramp door to enter the church at this time.

This process can be compared at the moment to a plane boarding. Where normally the passengers cannot just get to the plane because the crew has to let them in during any boarding! We almost try to do the same here at St. Hugh until the pandemic is over. Being at the door early enough helps the volunteers and helps us all to start the Mass Celebration on time! Late walk ins interrupt the Mass because the ramp door closeness to the altar.

2. Please be grateful to the volunteers for what they do for all of us, especially by keeping us all safe!

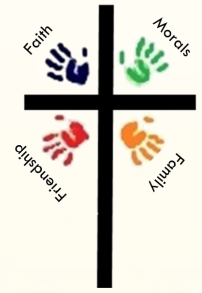

Renew My Church: History of St. Mary Parish, Riverside

St Mary parish began around 1873, when there is evidence of an active Catholic community in the area. In 1874 land at the present 45th and Joliet Rd. in Lyons was donated for the first church. Father Austin Morini was the first pastor, followed by several more Servite priests. Parishioners were from Berwyn, Clyde, Lyons, Riverside and Summit.

The parish grew! In 1899, pastor Father Joseph Lamb purchased land for a new church on Blackhawk Road in Riverside and he helped the parishioners of Summit to secure land for their own church. A mission was established in Berwyn and in 1923 it became St Leonard parish. In 1925, parishioners from Lyons dedicated their own church, St Hugh. In 1926, a new St Mary church and school on Herrick Road were dedicated. In 1949, the growing number of Catholics in North Riverside joined the St Mary Mission of North Riverside. In 1953, that mission became Mater Christi Parish with the dedication of their church.

St Mary is still on Herrick Road, but so much is not the same! The years have seen many changes. Today our pastor is Father Tom May and we serve approximately 1100 families from 37 different communities. Our parish school has 357 students and our Religious Education program has 300 students.

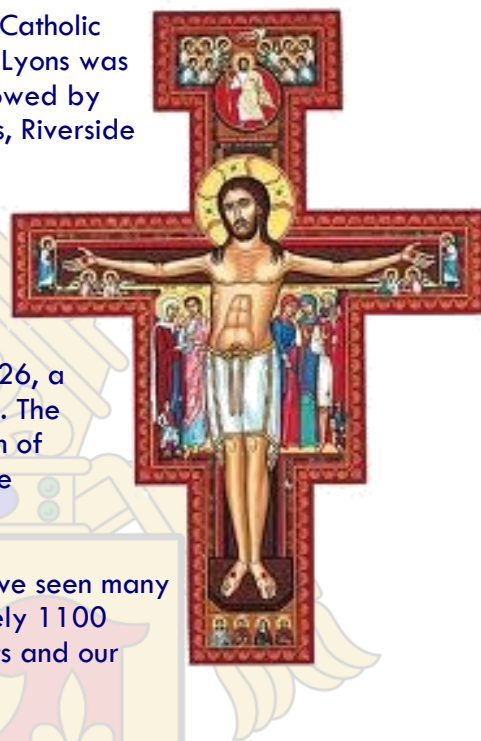
A variety of organizations and ministries work together to welcome all and to serve the needs of parishioners and the communities beyond. Our website, stmaryriverside.org, provides current information and resources for growth in faith, live-stream Sunday Mass and daily reflections.

Our newest facility, the Parish Pastoral Center, is at 40 E. Burlington. Being on the main street of Riverside, it is convenient for parishioners and accessible to those who may be seeking the Lord. We are proud of our history, but prouder that we are a parish of people who are open to the Holy Spirit and responsive to the Spirit's work in our midst.

(332-387) August 27

She had smiles for the neighbors, though her husband found her religion and the charity it inspired annoying. She made tearful prayers in private for a son, outwardly self-assured but, as his mother knew, inwardly restless, and whose girlfriend of a dozen years had borne his child out of wedlock. Though not the first or last such mother and son, Monica and Augustine are the Church's most famous, so we keep their feast days back to back, with Monica's, fittingly, first. To Rome she followed Augustine, then to Milan, where years of prayer—and nagging—finally bore fruit in his conversion by Saint Ambrose. For six months, mother and son enjoyed the blessing of rediscovering each other. Just in time! On the way home to North Africa, Monica took sick and died near Rome. No child who has mourned a parent can read, unmoved, Augustine's tender account, in his Confessions, of Monica's last days. At this time of the year, when parents watch apprehensively as children leave for school, may Monica's perseverance and Augustine's long-prayed-for conversion ease anxiety and kindle hope.

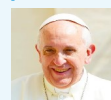

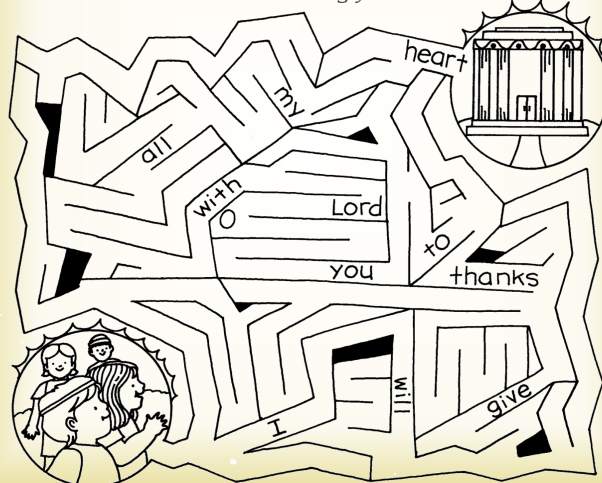

TIPS FOR ALL WORSHIPERS — What to Expect

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE — ☀ Check your temperature: if you have one, please do not come to church. ☀ Stay home if you are ill. ☀ Make sure you have a face covering to bring and wear. ☀ Make sure to register by calling the office or registering online..

WHEN YOU ARRIVE — ☀ Enter only in marked doorways. ☀ Wait patiently to be checked in by greeter. ☀ Keep your face covering or mask on at all times except for receiving Communion. ☀ Sanitize your hands as directed by greeter. ☀ Observe social distancing at all times (look for marks on the floor). ☀ Ushers will direct you to pews with markings showing where to sit. ☀ Since there will be no passing of baskets for your offering please leave your offering in the boxes provided at the entrance and exit areas.

DURING THE SERVICE — ☀ Do not change seats during a service. ☀ There will be no passing of offering baskets. ☀ No physical sign of peace will be exchanged during Mass. ☀ Follow instructions for Communion: • Leave your seat only when directed by usher or greeter. • Maintain six feet social distancing in the Communion line – look for marks on the floor. • When 12 feet or two people away from the priest, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces. • Approach the priest only after you are called forward. DO NOT remove your face covering. • Extend a single hand to receive the Host. • After moving six feet to the right or left, remove your mask and consume the Host. • Replace your face covering or mask. • Follow instructions to return to your pew.

AFTER THE SERVICE — ☀ Please take any worship aids you may have brought with you. ☀ You will be dismissed by pew or seating area. Follow the instructions of the greeter or usher. ☀ Use only the designated exit doors. ☀ Do not congregate outside the church doors. ☀ Continue to wear your face covering or mask until you leave the area where worshipers are.

While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 any time they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.
