## From the Pastor's Desk

Mt. 16:21-27.

Life sometimes brings surprises that no one predicts! Sometimes people are not able to accept change because it is unlike anything they know from their cultural experience.

Today in the Gospel, Peter is not rewarded by Jesus, even though Peter probably thought that he was going to "save" Jesus from the pain of the Cross. Jesus responds to Peter, "Get behind me Satan," because Peter does not understand what Jesus is all about. The mission requires sacrifice and not just being comfortable and away from trouble.

But the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross led to His Resurrection! We can find many lessons in this Gospel reading, but the main one teaches us that our sacrifices pay in the long run. We cannot "top" Christ in His sacrifice but we can look and accept the value of our daily sacrifices. If done properly, those help us follow Christ to be victorious and wise!

This Gospel brings an example that came to me some time ago. A story or various stories of people from the Old European Continent and my old Country, Poland. In a million years, I would not anticipate the recent political situation that directs people from (especially) many European Countries to Poland so they can escape their liberal politically anti-Family countries. As Poland is one of the E. U. Countries at the moment, not only is it ruled by conservatives but also it does not agree with the liberal Family politics that are embraced most of the E. U. Countries today.

The Liberal, in the E. U. version today means often that the government is able to tell the parents what to do with their children. Parents of children with special needs have to be careful, because according to the liberal laws of some E. U. Countries or European counties that are not part of the E. U., they are not fit parents for their children. The children may be taken away by the government and are able to be adopted by anyone that the government feels like.

Liberalism in this form is scary, but many Europeans have been "voting" with their feet already, by leaving their own countries for good or until their children are grown. We of course talk about regular, good families that just want to be together, not looking to be ordered by the government without a reason! So far, many foreign families have asked for asylum in Poland to protect their families. Most of all have been granted one! And thank God.

In this case or cases, sometimes what looks great and protective at first, politically may be dangerous! The liberal society sounds great on the paper! Good values are not often easy to follow but they can protect us from danger like extreme liberalism that kills families and gives rights to mayhem and criminals. Examples from Europe can be followed by researching each case online.

What is frightening, is that previously the children who used to be taken away from their families were given to people not fit for having a family. Many bad things were happening to many children because the liberal governments who worked with evil, liberal doctors were not controlled by anyone! Today, those cases come out and those criminals are judged. But who will take back the evil and pain and who will comfort the wronged children and their real families? Only God can answer that! But we should learn from the mistakes of the others and never let the government become that powerful and invasive like across the Atlantic in some of those countries.

Liberalism and socialism seemingly sound great to many young people in America. They don't know what they often are following. If they think that changing the political system to the extreme would help anyone, they are

St. Hugh's Gloria Maldonado is a living example of her credo to other young people that "It's not the circumstances you are given but how you reap the opportunities around you."

This weekend, Gloria will head to Harvard University to reap a golden opportunity she earned through hard work and servant leadership--a full four-year scholarship to the Ivy League university to pursue her career vision! It was made possible by the Presidential Scholar and National Hispanic Scholar awards she won. This summer she graduated summa cum laude from Morton West High School, where she was Student Council president.

At Harvard, Gloria will pursue her passion in public policy as well as civic education, social activism, and international politics. She will double-major in Government and Spanish. She's particularly excited about a class taught by Steven Levitsky, PhD, a noted professor of government and a political adviser.

As a Mexican-American, Gloria grew up bilingual and viewed the ability to communicate in another language as an asset. For a time, she volunteered as a translator at the Mexican Consulate in Chicago. She saw it not only as helping people there but, in a larger way, as being a liaison between countries.

Gloria will be on Harvard's Cambridge, Mass., campus, but her classes will be online for now. She plans to join the student council and Raza, Harvard's Latino organization.

Her ultimate career goal? "Go to law school, come back to my community, serve it and create change, and be a diplomat or political adviser to the U.S.," she said.

At St. Hugh, she served as secretary of the Society of Catholic Women for the past two years. She has been a catechist, lector, Girl Scout, and Youth Group leader, encouraging her teen peers to get involved in their parish as well.

Within her community, Gloria initiated a Fight Apathy campaign. She has hosted voter registration drives, served as an election judge, and volunteered with the Street Samaritans homeless outreach.

Gloria is a first-generation college student, and her three younger sisters are proud and happy for her. She plans to keep in touch with St. Hugh and come to Mass whenever she's in town.

Our daily and Sunday Mass Celebration during these different times. I am very glad that we at have at least a somewhat normal experience of the daily and Sunday Mass. I have expressed already many times how appreciative I am that our volunteers have stepped up to the challenge of serving us all while making the reopening of the church possible.

After these last several weeks of the partial reopening I have been observing the process and I have come up with some suggestions.

Please:

1. Let us all be on time before any Mass Celebration starts. Being "on time" means these days at least to enter the Church 5-10 min before the planned start of the Mass. We only use the ramp door to enter the church at this time.

This process can be compared at the moment to a plane boarding. Where normally the passengers cannot just get to the plane because the crew has to let them in during any boarding! We almost try to do the same here at St. Hugh until the pandemic is over. Being at the door early enough helps the volunteers and helps us all to start the Mass Celebration on time! Late walk ins interrupt the Mass because the ramp door closeness to the altar.

2. Please be grateful to the volunteers for what they do for all of us, especially by keeping us all safe!

## Renew My Church: History of Mater Christi Parish, North Riverside

Mater Christi Parish is a close cousin to two other parishes in our grouping, St Mary and St Hugh. Our relationship is not only geographically, but because of our history. Both grew from the community that first gathered at St Mary church in Lyons. It was in 1949 that Father Timothy Lyne, then associate pastor at Saint Mary, conducted a survey of the Catholics in North Riverside. Father William Murphy, pastor of Saint Mary, petitioned the Chancery to begin Saint Mary's Mission of North Riverside. The priests, Father Murphy, Father Lyne, Father Shirey, and Father Wisniewski served the Mission of North Riverside and Saint Mary.



Cardinal Stritch dedicated Mater Christi church on June 28, 1953. Father A.H. Menarik became the first pastor. Mater Christi was now a canonically established of the Archdiocese.

On Mother's Day 1956, the magnificent Italian sculpted Carrara marble Mother of Mothers Shrine at Mater Christi was dedicated. The statue depicts Mary, Mother of God, and the Christ Child gazing lovingly at a modern-day woman and child. The shrine has drawn visitors from around the globe to pray to Mater Christi, Mother of Mothers.

The lovely white marble statue of Mary which has graced the entrance to the church throughout its history still watches over the people of this faith community.

We know Mary, Mater Christi, will guide us through the Renew My Church process together with our cousin parishes and St Pius X.

## Renew My Church: History of St. Pius X, Stickney

St. Pius X Catholic Church was founded in 1954 to fulfill the growing religious needs of the Stickney and Forest View communities. The members were mainly of the Eastern European ethnic background. Today, however, we are a diverse community of Eastern European, Hispanic, Asian, and other ethnic groups. Being a small community enables us to come together as a family in Christ by knowing, loving, and serving one another.

Taking the call to holiness from the newly canonized St. Pius X (May 1954) whose motto was, "Restore all things in Christ," we offer many ministries, activities and opportunities to grow in faith and love of God and service to others.

We are a welcoming community of faith. We make every effort to grow in our faith as followers of Jesus and become a living witness of God's love, by our words and actions. Being a stewardship parish, we believe that our time, talents and treasure are God's gifts to us. Our stewardship is using those gifts to serve one another in His name. We are currently witnessing stewardship in action as our parish family members come together to meet the needs of others during this pandemic that we are all experiencing.

Since the founding of St. Pius X countless men, women and children have been introduced to the Catholic faith, have celebrated the sacraments here and have found friendships and encouragement from the people that make up the St. Pius X parish family whose goal is to praise and thank our Lord.

St. Paul states, "It is not enough to know Christ; we must introduce him to others". We welcome all who wish to join our parish family, as we pray and work together to share God's love and restore all things in Christ.

## St. Gregory the Great

(540-604) September 3

Imagine, fourteen hundred years after death, boasting a best-selling CD! Yet outside the Church and within, Gregorian chant is enjoying a renaissance. Still, the timeless sacred music that bears his name is but part of Gregory's legacy. Renouncing civic service for monastic life, Gregory's administrative and diplomatic skills prompted continual summons from the cloister. Papal ambassador and advisor, he was eventually elected pope himself, renowned as a wise steward of the church's material possessions, generous benefactor of the poor, sponsor of missionaries, and promoter of monasticism. His liturgical enrichment of the Church endures not only in Gregorian chant, but in eloquent homilies still gracing the Liturgy of the Hours, the "Gregorian Canon" (Eucharistic Prayer I), and his spiritual classic, Pastoral Care, once presented to new bishops at ordination. Of countless impressive papal titles—Supreme Pontiff, Vicar of Christ, Successor of Saint Peter, Prince of the Apostles—the title still so cherished that it heads official documents is the one Gregory coined to describe his papal ideal: Servant of the Servants of God. Together with being designated "the Great," a fitting epitaph.

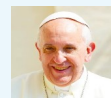

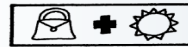

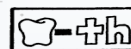

## TIPS FOR ALL WORSHIPERS — What to Expect

**BEFORE YOU ARRIVE** — ☀ Check your temperature: if you have one, please do not come to church. ☀ Stay home if you are ill. ☀ Make sure you have a face covering to bring and wear. ☀ Make sure to register by calling the office or registering online..

**WHEN YOU ARRIVE** — ☀ Enter only in marked doorways. ☀ Wait patiently to be checked in by greeter. ☀ Keep your face covering or mask on at all times except for receiving Communion. ☀ Sanitize your hands as directed by greeter. ☀ Observe social distancing at all times (look for marks on the floor). ☀ Ushers will direct you to pews with markings showing where to sit. ☀ Since there will be no passing of baskets for your offering please leave your offering in the boxes provided at the entrance and exit areas.

**DURING THE SERVICE** — ☀ Do not change seats during a service. ☀ There will be no passing of offering baskets. ☀ No physical sign of peace will be exchanged during Mass. ☀ Follow instructions for Communion: • Leave your seat only when directed by usher or greeter. • Maintain six feet social distancing in the Communion line – look for marks on the floor. • When 12 feet or two people away from the priest, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces. • Approach the priest only after you are called forward. DO NOT remove your face covering. • Extend a single hand to receive the Host. • After moving six feet to the right or left, remove your mask and consume the Host. • Replace your face covering or mask. • Follow instructions to return to your pew.

**AFTER THE SERVICE** — ☀ Please take any worship aids you may have brought with you. ☀ You will be dismissed by pew or seating area. Follow the instructions of the greeter or usher. ☀ Use only the designated exit doors. ☀ Do not congregate outside the church doors. ☀ Continue to wear your face covering or mask until you leave the area where worshipers are.

***While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 any time they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.***
