From the Pastor's Desk



Dear parishioners of St. Hugh,

Next weekend we will celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. That celebration to me is always a reminder that Summer time is maturing and that the first

fruits and flowers should be collected and brought for the blessing.

Next Weekend the blessing of the first fruits of the season will be offered in the St. Hugh church during each weekend Mass. Let's be thankful to the Blessed Virgin Mary especially for Her being the mother of Jesus! Christ is the "fruit" that nourishes our souls and blesses our lives.

And as we talk about our blessings we can talk more about St. Hugh Parish being blessed by the blessings that help us to go forward. We are in the "Renew My Church," program! Part of it is to report the state of each parish that is in the program. All is important. I'd like to share some of the work that was done for St. Hugh in the last two years.

As of now;

1. St. Hugh has no debt! Miraculously we have avoided so far, the fate of most parishes of the Archdiocese. We don't have many parishioners, but we have many enough who care for this place. Sometimes we have hard time paying our bills but the last fiscal year (June 2019-June 2020) met the fiscal expectations! (Last 2 years)

2. Our buildings don't have any major problems. In the last 2 years I have been looking at the needs of all the buildings, especially the church building was looked at.

(Church building)

- a. The (East) main altar wall damage was fixed about 2 years ago. The wall fragments damaged by water was replaced and painted over. The A/C unit problem outside that wall caused the (East) wall damage! The Church A/C problem was fixed at that time.
- b. The church boiler System was fixed and set last year. A boiler company together with John worked on it for a while but the boiler system was fixed at that time. It used to shut itself down without coming back on, which used to cause problem because it was hard turn it back on.
- c. The (north) church entrance suffered damage last thanksgiving. Thanks to the insurance the damaged part was rebuilt this summer. Together with that, a part of the roof was fixed as well. The roof is above the religious Ed classrooms.
- d. Our sound system needed some upgrades. Thanks to the speedy financial response of the parishioners, we were able to add a new microphone to the altar. The old wireless microphone has too many issues. The whole system was also professionally tuned up a few months ago. Hopefully, our Mass Celebrations-live and via Facebook/ YouTube are "crisper" and more heard than before.
- e. Our wood floor in church is being now clean and polished by a different product that gives a better protection and shine to the wood.
- f. Someone fixed our stain glass (south) window donating his time and materials to St. Hugh.
- g. The parking "well" (western church parking lot) was fixed a few months ago.

(Our rectory)

- a. The rectory boiler was fixed last fall. Thankfully, that was not a big problem to fix.
- b. The tree by the rectory was trimmed back to protect the roof. Part of the gutters were fixed.
- c. The rectory downstairs rooms were painted and fixed up by John lately. Some things are still to finish but it looks great already!!! (Continued on page 6)

August 11. Saint Clare referred to herself as a little plant. In many ways, she was a strong oak. The first woman to write a Rule of Life for her sisters, she



insisted on the privilege of poverty until her dying breath, getting papal approval of her Rule just days before she died. A model of humility, Clare cared for her sisters even through her own years of illness. Her devotion to Jesus was extraordinary.

August 12. Saint Jane Frances de Chantal was a wife and the mother of six. When her husband was killed, Saint Jane took a vow not to remarry and sought to join a religious community. She was dissuaded by her spiritual director, Saint Francis de Sales. Eventually, she and two others founded a community intended for those who could not join the established congregations. They wanted to actively engage in the works of mercy, but social circumstances forced them to live a cloistered life.

August 14. Saint Maximilian Mary Kolbe, a Conventual Franciscan, is best known for volunteering to take the place of a condemned prisoner in the death camp. But he also worked tirelessly for the spiritual welfare of people through a deep devotion to the Blessed Mother. His whole life seemed to revolve around Mary as the path to God.

Additional Updates from Father Robert

1. Our safety recap;

- We have been following the guidelines of the Archdiocese of Chicago regarding the safety in church during the Covid-19 pandemic.
- a. As you know, the pandemic is still not over. Thank you all who follow the asked guidance. Our volunteers are always there to help and to answer any safety questions.
- b. The rules are uncomfortable to all of us, but they are necessary to keep us all safe.
- c. Please continue the good practices by (especially when in church) using properly face masks, keeping social distancing, allowing us to disinfect your hands when is time or when needed.
- d. Please continue not to congregate in church before or after the or parking lot nearby.
- e. The sacristy is closed for most of the people for now. I miss chatting with you in there but the sacristy is a small place where the social distancing cannot be kept. Masks only reduce potential infections but most of them don't eliminate it. Thanks for your understanding.
- f. Do not bring big bags, suitcases, etc. to church. Large items brought from the outside can bring the virus on them and they are hard to disinfect. Small items are allowed! Of course, anything can bring it in but let's not add to the risk.

2. Receiving the Eucharist In the Catholic Church during the pandemic!

Thank you for being understanding and working with us during these unfortunate times. The Eucharist is very important for us Catholics. As during the pandemic some of the rules have changed, we still respect the Eucharist!

At St. Hugh before receiving the Eucharist everyone who knows that they are allowed to receive it, should come early enough to participate at the Mass Celebration. Preferably enter the church before the Mass starts. Usually the latest moment to come to church during the Mass before receiving the Eucharist is the time before the Gospel reading. But for sure missing the entire Mass and then just asking for communion is usually not acceptable due to the respect that we owe to Christ in the Eucharist. When some people are too late, perhaps it would be wise to look for other options. The Eucharist is not about convenience. This is the living Christ that is being received.

Also the other parishes offer different options but either way the "Mass time" before receiving the Eucharist is required.

There are different rules for the sick and dying during the Covid-19 but not every priest is designated at this time to make such visits. The Archdiocese has organized a special "department" to serve the sick at this time. Please call the rectory for details.

We also have to remember that our volunteers who help us during the pandemic and take part during the Eucharistic procession to the altar, cannot be always on watch so let's respect their time as well.

Mass Updates and Thank You from Father Robert

Our daily and Sunday Mass Celebration during these different times. I am very glad that we at have at least a somewhat normal experience of the daily and Sunday Mass. I have expressed already many times how appreciative I am that our volunteers have stepped up to the challenge of serving us all while making the reopening of the church possible.

We hopefully will keep the freedom to come to church physically from now on. And hopefully we will be open totally soon.

After these last several weeks of the partial reopening I have been observing the process and I have come up with some suggestions.

Please:

1. Let us all be on time before any Mass Celebration starts. Being "on time" means these days at least to enter the Church 5-10 min before the planned start of the Mass. We only use the ramp door to enter the church at this time.

This process can be compared at the moment to a plane boarding. Where normally the passengers cannot just get to the plane be-cause the crew has to let them in during any boarding! We almost try to do the same here at St. Hugh until the pandemic is over. Being at the door early enough helps the volunteers and helps us all to start the Mass Celebration on time! Late walk ins interrupt the Mass because the ramp door closeness to the altar.

2. Please be grateful to the volunteers for what they do for all of us, especially by keeping us all safe!

Renew My Church: Our Grouping Process Timeline

Creating vibrant parishes requires that we evaluate the business structures (how we operate), buildings, facilities, and financial requirements of existing parishes to assess where we can more prudently apply our resources to support and strengthen key ministry leadership roles, programs and activities. Ultimately, we must be good stewards of the gifts we have today to ensure they're able to support the faith lives of Catholics both today and in the future.

To that end, the Grouping Feedback & Discernment Team will meet from now through the Fall to discuss and prayerfully discern the ministerial and operational strengths and challenges of the parishes and schools within our particular grouping. Eventually the team will provide feedback and information about its grouping for archdiocesan leadership to review and present recommendations to Cardinal Cupich so he can make final decisions regarding potential changes to school and parish structures.

Along the way, there will be opportunities for everyone in our own parish to learn about the details of those conversations, ask questions, and share their own points of view on the strengths and concerns of any potential changes.

St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein)

(1891 - 1942)August 9 "Come," Edith gently whispered, taking her sister Rosa's hand, "let us go for our people!" These were Edith Stein's last words as the Nazis, enraged at the Dutch bishops' condemnation of their genocide, took into custody all Catholic converts from Judaism. Born Jewish, but non-practicing from her teens, Edith's search for truth led to a doctorate in philosophy, a brilliant career as professor and author and, finally, to the Autobiography of Saint Teresa of Avila, which she read in one sitting, then declared, "That is the Truth!" Baptized on January 1, 1922, observed then as the feast of Jesus' initiation into the covenant of Abraham, confirmed on February 2, the feast of Jesus' Presentation in the Temple, Edith entered the cloistered Carmelites in Cologne, transferring to a convent in Holland when she realized that, because of the Nazi persecution of the Jews, her presence could imperil the safety of the other nuns. She died in the gas chambers of Auschwitz as a daughter of Israel and of the Church.

TIPS FOR ALL WORSHIPERS — What to Expect

<u>BEFORE YOU ARRIVE</u> — *****Check your temperature: if you have one, please do not come to church. *****Stay home if you are ill. *****Make sure you have a face covering to bring and wear. *****Make sure to register by calling the office or registering online..

<u>WHEN YOU ARRIVE</u> — #Enter only in marked doorways. #Wait patiently to be checked in by greeter. #Keep your face covering or mask on at all times except for receiving Communion. #Sanitize your hands as directed by greeter. #Observe social distancing at all times (look for marks on the floor). #Ushers will direct you to pews with markings showing where to sit. #Since there will be no passing of baskets for your offering please leave your offering in the boxes provided at the entrance and exit areas.

DURING THE SERVICE — #Do not change seats during a service. #There will be no passing of offering baskets. #No physical sign of peace will be exchanged during Mass. #Follow instructions for Communion: Leave your seat only when directed by usher or greeter. • Maintain six feet social distancing in the Communion line – look for marks on the floor. • When 12 feet or two people away from the priest, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces. • Approach the priest only after you are called forward. DO NOT remove your face covering. • Extend a single hand to receive the Host. • After moving six feet to the right or left, remove your mask and consume the Host. • Replace your face covering or mask. • Follow instructions to return to your pew.

<u>AFTER THE SERVICE</u> — *Please take any worship aids you may have brought with you. You will be dismissed by pew or seating area. Follow the instructions of the greeter or usher. Solution with the designated exit doors. Do not congregate outside the church doors. Continue to wear your face covering or mask until you leave the area where worshipers are.*

While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 any time they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.
