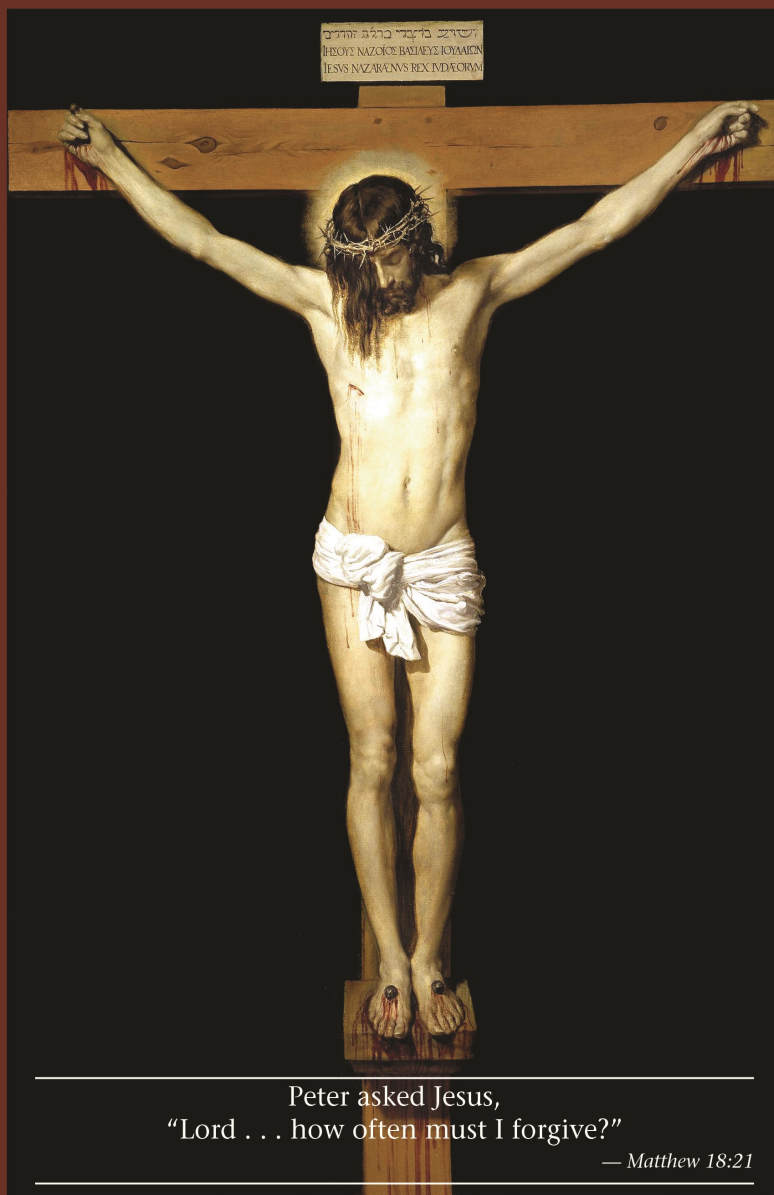

Saint Hugh: it's all about Love!



From the Pastor's Desk

Mt. 18:21-35 Today in the Gospel, Peter asks Jesus, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive?"

September is remembered also as the beginning of WWII month, and maybe we can ask ourselves if the question that Peter asked Jesus in the Gospel could be enhanced? We could ask looking at this country and the world. Lord, if my brother (sister or anyone else) sins against me and/or anyone, how often must I forgive and how much more should I allow their mistakes to be repeated?

The tragedy of WWII was perhaps bigger than any other war tragedy that humankind knows. Not only because during that war so many people died but because Hitler's agenda and "mythology" that he followed to conquer the world. His main idea was to promote and propagate the propaganda that nothing and nobody matters more than Nazi Germany of that time. Of course, the NSDAP (the Nazi Party) had to win to promote all the madness of that time. In the 1930s Hitler had changed the democratic country into the totalitarian one that was only tolerating one ideology and one way of thinking.

Everything was supposed to say how the new idea was great. It all had begun slowly and violently. The inconvenient books, materials were publicly burned. Occasions like the "crystal night" (1938) during which many Jewish businesses and synagogues were destroyed. That was a prelude that led to 1939 where Hitler had invaded Poland. The occupants built concentration camps in many places in Europe but the most "memorable" were started in Poland., Auschwitz, and Birkenau! They still exist as museums of that evil era.

Hitler's evil genius was not recognizing the humanity in anyone but the Arian race! Jews, Poles, and many others were not only not recognized by him as nations, but he did not think that they were human. Perhaps that idea had helped him to go where he went in his sick journey to destruction. His followers were "infected" with the same illness that was allowing them to treat the people in the concentration camps as they had no right to live. Many of the victims still live, also in the United States and are living witness to that huge mistake of Hitler and those who saw in him some kind of god.

Eventually, Hitler failed and unfortunately, it was fired back against the German nation, destroying it to the ground. Hitler has a vision change in Germany before he started the war, and he did it by destroying it. Nothing good happens out of hatred and unsupported myths.

We live in a very dangerous historical moment. Some people in the government in the United States try to follow very similar "myths" like the Nazi Party in the 1930s was following at their time. The socialist movements in the U. S. show many similarities to the National Socialists (Nazis)! They often try to manipulate people; they like to destroy whatever is uncomfortable for them. They have nothing in common with democracy but more important, they are dangerous because they use violence that they call "justice!"

We would not like to be in the predicament similar to the 1930s in Hitler's Germany. True democracy is about giving chance and justice to all. No person should be above others. If only one group of people is at power and has the only voice, it is called tyranny! The liberal cities have failed badly this year but not protecting the peace and justice of their citizens. Our "crystal nights" where businesses and buildings are destroyed cannot be justified!

Saint of the Day



September 14. Saint Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine, is credited with having found the cross on which Jesus was crucified. The cross quickly became an object of veneration.

September 15. The principal biblical references to Mary's sorrows are Simeon's prediction about a sword piercing Mary's soul, and Jesus' words from the cross to Mary and to the beloved disciple. The two passages are brought together as prediction and fulfillment.

September 16. Cornelius was elected pope "by the judgment of God and of Christ, by the testimony of most of the clergy, by the vote of the people, with the consent of aged priests and of good men" after a 14 month vacancy in the papacy. Cornelius served as Pope for only two years, but they were years packed with important happenings in the life of the Church.

September 17. Saint Robert Bellarmine was ordained in 1570 during a period when the study of theology was in a weakened state. He dedicated his time and energy to the study of Church history, the Fathers of the Church, and to Scripture, to organize Church teaching and to face the attacks of the Protestant Reformers.

This year Religious Ed will be a little different. The archdiocese is only allowing children to meet in person once a month. Due to this we will structure the program a little differently. We will begin with once a month in person classes for those in First Communion and Confirmation. If all goes well, we will add dates for the rest of the grades.

Every grade will meet three times per month online for 20-30 minutes. There will also be a monthly pickup of program materials. All these details will be sent after registration.

Registration will begin Sunday, September 6 and go through the end of September. Classes will begin virtually on Sunday, October 4. Pickup of program materials will be emailed at a later date.

Our catechists hope to partner with parents during this period where we cannot meet in person and enable and support them in being their child's first catechist while providing fun conversation, games, and activities in our virtual sessions.

There will also be virtual office hours for parents to reach the program Coordinator for help with the program or materials. Our goal for this year is to support parents and families during this time, while providing catechesis.

Renew My Church: The San Damiano Cross Keeps Our Focus

A while back, I shared the story of St. Francis hearing Jesus call to him from the San Damiano cross. Praying before this icon of our Lord, St. Francis of Assisi heard Jesus call to him: “Go repair my Church, which, as you see, is falling completely into ruin.”

At first, St. Francis initially took this to mean he was to repair the church buildings of San Damiano. However, he eventually discerned that Jesus was calling him to rebuild the spiritual life and vitality of the entire earthly Church. Likewise, we must see that the future of the Catholic Church is bigger than any of our parish buildings. This icon of Jesus helps us remain focused on three very important realities as we renew our faith lives, parishes and the archdiocese:



It portrays Jesus speaking to us even though he is dying, which serves as a reminder that we need not be afraid to take up this work even if it costs us something, for Jesus is with us always.

Jesus is surrounded by others, highlighting the fact that, as we take up the challenge of renewal, our unity should not be diminished but strengthened.

Jesus is also featured as the Risen One at the top of the cross – a sign of hope to us that in this renewal, which will require us to die to ourselves and familiar patterns, Jesus is offering us new life and vitality for the future.

Allow the image of St. Francis hearing Christ call to him from the San Damiano cross to guide your own prayer for Renew My Church as we take up the work of renewal together.

(c. 344-407) September 13

"Speaking truth to power" may have become just another cliché, but doing precisely that cost John "the Golden Mouth" (Chrysostom) his diocese and, after exile and a forced march, his health and life. "Renowned for eloquence, heroic in suffering" (Sacramentary), John's scriptural insights still comfort and challenge. Mystical theologian, he bids Eastern Christians, whose principal Divine Liturgy bears his name, to lift up their hearts to "God ineffable, beyond comprehension, invisible, beyond understanding, existing forever, always the same." Model pastor, he warns Roman Catholics in the Liturgy of the Hours not to neglect God-in-the-flesh: "Would you honor Christ's body? Do not scorn his nakedness, honoring him here in church with silken robes, while neglecting him cold and naked outside. What use to burden Christ's altar with golden chalices, while Christ himself starves to death? What use dressing the altar with gold-woven cloths, while denying the shivering Christ the clothes he needs? Do not adorn the church while ignoring your needy brother: he is the most precious temple of all!" (Saturday, Twenty-first Week in Ordinary Time).

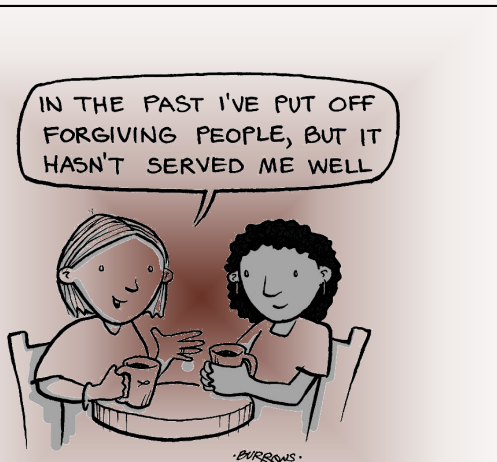

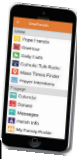

TIPS FOR ALL WORSHIPERS — What to Expect

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE — ☀️ Check your temperature: if you have one, please do not come to church. ☀️ Stay home if you are ill. ☀️ Make sure you have a face covering to bring and wear. ☀️ Make sure to register by calling the office or registering online..

WHEN YOU ARRIVE — ☀️ Enter only in marked doorways. ☀️ Wait patiently to be checked in by greeter. ☀️ Keep your face covering or mask on at all times except for receiving Communion. ☀️ Sanitize your hands as directed by greeter. ☀️ Observe social distancing at all times (look for marks on the floor). ☀️ Ushers will direct you to pews with markings showing where to sit. ☀️ Since there will be no passing of baskets for your offering please leave your offering in the boxes provided at the entrance and exit areas.

DURING THE SERVICE — ☀️ Do not change seats during a service. ☀️ There will be no passing of offering baskets. ☀️ No physical sign of peace will be exchanged during Mass. ☀️ Follow instructions for Communion: • Leave your seat only when directed by usher or greeter. • Maintain six feet social distancing in the Communion line – look for marks on the floor. • When 12 feet or two people away from the priest, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces. • Approach the priest only after you are called forward. DO NOT remove your face covering. • Extend a single hand to receive the Host. • After moving six feet to the right or left, remove your mask and consume the Host. • Replace your face covering or mask. • Follow instructions to return to your pew.

AFTER THE SERVICE — ☀️ Please take any worship aids you may have brought with you. ☀️ You will be dismissed by pew or seating area. Follow the instructions of the greeter or usher. ☀️ Use only the designated exit doors. ☀️ Do not congregate outside the church doors. ☀️ Continue to wear your face covering or mask until you leave the area where worshipers are.

While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 any time they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.
