From the Pastor's Desk

The Eucharist! The REAL CHRIST!

Cardinal Cupich has been lately focusing on the importance of The Eucharist! Perhaps his thoughts have been inspired by the fact that many, especially young people today have difficulty to believe in the real Christ presence in the Eucharist (also called the Holy Communion).

There maybe many reasons why that fact exists! Sometimes not all young people have enough of the church experience, sometimes it depends on the program and who teaches it and if the teachers believe themselves in a real Christ presence in the Eucharist! (The Catholic Church clearly believe in that).

Sometimes exposure to too many different denominations can be confusing, even toxic to young Catholics. Most of the other Christian denominations (usually Protestants) don't believe in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It is their right, but young Catholics absorb that "view" and often don't ask questions, and grow indifferent or negative toward the Catholic Eucharist! Protestants are more intellectual and practical about their faith. Their churches also don't expect their members to be in church every Sunday. The Protestant culture wins against the Catholic one because of convenience and pragmatism that are appealing to young people today.

Perhaps it is time to take care of what is most precious to us. Ecumenical gestures are fine but at the moment, we need to "filter out" what really needs to be protected. The true Catholic faith is worthy of our protection. The young generations should be regifted, not just with an information but they should experience the true Catholic Church, where people who truly believe and know the true correct Roman Catholic faith, are allowed to teach and represent Christ. The "part or half believers" are not enough, they should try some other professions.

The Eucharist being the most important for the Catholic Church and all Catholics should be "rediscovered" and for sure protected from any doubt that may attack the True Body and Blood of Christ.

We live in very "interesting" times where the modern age is trying to rule over anything that is divine and holy, when often secularism fights with the Church openly or by using political slogans! However, for us Catholics this struggle between belief and doubt should be only inspirational not challenging because we come from Christ!

The Last Supper that lives in Holy Communion can never be minimized or ignored in the Catholic Church. Holy Thursday started the relationship with Christ that since is the same and real. We join in that moment every time we are present at the Eucharist!

Raising young Catholics is not easy, but when parents, grandparents and every one else sets the example of their Catholic Faith, when they care about the Eucharist, the new generation will be able to understand the reason of it and will understand its meaning. The Eucharist is real Christ! He has given us Himself! It is Him, Whom we receive when we are in a procession line for the Holy Communion.

The Eucharist should be enough for any Catholic to believe that we as the Church make complete sense only, when we truly believe that in the Catholic Church, we receive the same Christ who gave us the gift of the Last Supper during The Holy Thursday. The same Christ was betrayed, sent on the Cross, Died and was Resurrected.

Saint of the Day

September 30. Known mostly for his translation of the Scriptures into Latin, Saint Jerome was also an inspiring writer of letters and commentaries. He was known to have had a bad temper, yet he was a man of prayer and penance. A combination of conflicting qualities, Saint Jerome stands out as one of the four great Doctors of the Latin Church.



October 1. Saint Thérèse of Lisieux is perhaps one of the most known and best loved saints in the Catholic calendar. A young Carmelite nun who wanted to go to the missions, she remained within the cloister yet became the patron of the missions. Therese entered the convent at 15 and died at 24 having lived a full life, including serving her community as novice director. Her parents were canonized in 2015.

October 3. Saint Theodora was born in France but came to Vincennes, Indiana, at the invitation of the bishop. Eventually she established a new foundation of her community in the States, but not after suffering many hardships. Saint Theodora is buried at Saint Mary-of-the-Woods, Indiana, the headquarters of the Sisters of Providence.

October 4. Saint Francis of Assisi: founder of the Franciscan family, Patron Saint of ecology, inspiration to thousands, claimed by people of all faiths as well as by those with no particular faith, a truly "catholic and apostolic man." Though born in the 13th century, he belongs to all ages.







St. Hugh Society of Catholic Women

Today's reading from First Timothy sounds almost like a coach getting his team ready for the big game. This coach has much higher goals than a home run or a touchdown. Instead of pursuing a league championship, he seeks faith, love, patience, and gentleness. How about us? Are we in the game or on the sidelines? Let's look at what Coach Paul is talking about.

Faith is a relationship with the Lord in which we imitate Jesus' outlook on life, his teachings, his love of God. We struggle with his commands to love our enemies, to turn the other cheek, to forgive all wrongs, and to take up our cross each day. As Paul would say, we are "competing well for the faith."

We pursue love by listening to the Gospel, in which Jesus tells the parable of the rich man who was only concerned with his own comfort. Jesus says that if we truly understood the prophets, such as our first reading from Amos, we would not spend all our energy and wealth on ourselves.

As we learn to let go of our need to have everything go our way, we become more patient with people who disagree with us, or with frustrations and problems. We learn to see God in our setbacks as well as in our successes. Experiencing the Lord is the championship we want.

Treasures from Tradition

Over the past century, a desire to recover a deep sense of unity among all believers in Christ has grown. The ecumenical movement (from the Greek word meaning the whole inhabited world) began among Protestant Christians, but was given great energy in 1920 with a letter from the Orthodox Patriarch of Constantinople, calling for closer dialogue and cooperation among Christians. In 1960, Pope John XXIII invited Protestant and Orthodox observers to the Second Vatican Council. In 1964, the Council's Decree on Ecumenism named these Christians separated brethren, a huge leap forward from the time of labeling them as outside the Church. A year later, a new pope, Paul VI, and the Orthodox Patriarch officially nullified the condemnations that walled off East from West for nine hundred years.

The pace and optimism of the 1960s has sadly waned, and the signs of progress toward unity are few; yet there are wider agreements on sharing Communion among various Christian denominations, and among Protestants agreements regarding sharing of ecclesiastical life and ministry. Among the success stories of the ecumenical movement are greater cooperation among Christian clergy, a similar Lectionary for Protestants and Catholics, and even experiments in the monastic life and common worship.




