

Saint Hugh: it's all about Love!



From the Pastor's Desk

Mt.18:15-20. An "art" of forgiveness is well portrayed by Jesus in the Gospel. There should be "steps" before any accusation or lawsuit that anyone likes to make against a company or a person. So many Christians today know this Gospel reading passage, but how many really understand

what it means and what Jesus expects us to do when we are in a difficult situation?

Lawsuits are old like the world because almost every government that we know has had a court system. The popular culture encourages us to sue and not only when we are victimized in any way, but just to be winners; monetarily or just for some kind of satisfaction people are encouraged to call a lawyer ASAP when they can or when they think they could win a case. That's the culture but Jesus teaches us forgiveness!

I hear sometimes the expression "but no one did it before like it or this way." This almost tries to tell me to not do whatever I do but there are moments like that, that need to be conquered with God's help. A judgmental opposition should not be a reason to quit! That's how we go forward. That's when we truly use our God's given vocation. That's how we teach the environment that God is in us and that He expects us to be His Hands by our fearless moves. (That's dedicated ESPECIALLY to pastors who fear criticism for doing good things for their parish. Just do it, the critical and leaned to the past ones may understand "why" a bit later, or even if they don't, all is done for the parish anyway. The criticism today is typical in western countries! I believe that all priests should feed the people with God's food. It is only possible when the feeding ones are free to express their vocation that does not come from any human being but from Christ Himself! The pastors who are able to guide their people in that way are successful already!)

I have met many instances where people try to stop God's way! Some come out of fear of the future, some come out of jealousy because some things can be done just by priests/bishops in the Catholic Church. But really, we should not hang on that so much. God has a plan. Let it be!!! Don't slow it down! Don't modify it so it goes your way! We all have a place in His Church. And because some things are reserved just to ordained priests it does not mean that the rest of the people are loved less by Christ or will mean less in His Kingdom. His love is everlasting and always the same!!!! Only humans can make things that complicated without a reason.

Sometimes when something negative is addressed to me to slow me down, it means that at least I look for different ways to resolve some things where the others may have been afraid to try anything new. The criticism had made them numb and tired.

Jesus teaches us to try new things so we are not stuck on stereotypes and/ or old blueprints of the past that may not work anymore or maybe not enough today. (Remember, only use this rule when legal and permitted. Not all can do what the others do.) Christ's lessons are often very original by how He approaches us and our lives. He always acts out of love but He is also effective and wants us to be successful and to be loving one another!!! More than anything He does not want His priests to be scared and hiding in a corner or under a bed during their assignments! The life of the Church can be at stake. The challenge always will be part of a healthy Church. Many martyrs were priests together with our Head and Founder - Christ Himself!

A newer document written by Pope Francis said (paraphrase) that we all have a place in the Church. But he reminds that pastors are heads of their parishes. They cannot be replaced by any group or anyone. They are

Mass Intentions

When a priest celebrates Mass each day, he offers each celebration of the Eucharist for a particular person, or intention. By doing so he applies special graces from God upon that person or intention.

Remember your loved ones with a Mass Intention. Note - We schedule only two intentions per Mass.

Saint of the Day

September 7. Blessed Frédéric Ozanam proved to be a leader who helped others help the poor. He also formed a newspaper to push the cause of justice.

In 1833, he founded the Saint Vincent de Paul Society, which continues to the present day.

September 8. Affirming the humanity of Jesus, the Church celebrates the birth of Mary, his mother. While Scripture does not record the *birth* of Mary, the apocryphal Protoevengelium of James notes the development of Christian piety around Mary's parents and her birth.

September 9. A native of Spain, young Jesuit *Peter Claver* left his homeland forever in 1610, to be a missionary in the colonies of the New World. He sailed into Cartagena, and began a ministry to the slaves brought there from West Africa, as well as becoming a moral force in the city of Cartegena.

September 11. Saint Cyprian played an important role in the development of Christian thought and practice in the early Church. He was a noted speaker who became a Christian as an adult. He was ordained a priest within two years of his conversion and was then chosen the Bishop of Carthage.

Mass Updates and Thank You from Father Robert
Our daily and Sunday Mass Celebration during these
different times. I am very glad that we at have at
least a somewhat normal experience of the daily and

Sunday Mass. I have expressed already many times how appreciative I am that our volunteers have stepped up to the challenge of serving us all while making the reopening of the church possible.

We hopefully will keep the freedom to come to church physically from now on. And hopefully we will be open totally soon.

After these last several weeks of the partial reopening I have been observing the process and I have come up with some suggestions.

Please:

1. Let us all be on time before any Mass Celebration starts. Being "on time" means these days at least to enter the Church 5-10 min before the planned start of the Mass. We only use the ramp door to enter the church at this time.

This process can be compared at the moment to a plane boarding. Where normally the passengers cannot just get to the plane because the crew has to let them in during any boarding! We almost try to do the same here at St. Hugh until the pandemic is over. Being at the door early enough helps the volunteers and helps us all to start the Mass Celebration on time! Late walk ins interrupt the Mass because the ramp door closeness to the altar.

2. Please be grateful to the volunteers for what they do for all of us, especially by keeping us all safe!

Religious Education

Religious Ed registration has begun. Please check your email or the parish website for more information.

This year Religious Ed will be a little different. The archdiocese is only allowing children to meet in person once a month. Due to this we will structure the program a little differently. We will begin with once a month in person classes for those in First Communion and Confirmation. If all goes well, we will add dates for the rest of the grades.

Every grade will meet three times per month online for 20-30 minutes. There will also be a monthly pickup of program materials. All these details will be sent after registration.

Registration will begin Sunday, September 6 and go through the end of September. Classes will begin virtually on Sunday, October 4. Pickup of program materials will be emailed at a later date.

Our catechists hope to partner with parents during this period where we cannot meet in person and enable and support them in being their child's first catechist while providing fun conversation, games, and activities in our virtual sessions.

There will also be virtual office hours for parents to reach the program Coordinator for help with the program or materials. Our goal for this year is to support parents and families during this time, while providing catechesis.

St. Peter Claver

(1581 - 1654)September 9 Nearly two hundred years before the Declaration of Independence proclaimed "that all men are created equal," two hundred fifty years before the Emancipation Proclamation mandated an end to slavery, three hundred fifty years before Martin Luther King's "I Have a Dream," and four hundred years before the election of an American president boasting African heritage, Peter Claver left his native Spain behind to volunteer for the Jesuit missions in Colombia. There, he was horrified both by slavery as an institution and by the inhuman brutality inflicted upon the slaves. He solemnly vowed to become "the slave of the slaves," and lived that vow heroically for close to forty years. Not knowing their language, Peter began his ministry among the slaves by using the universal language of practical charity, providing medical care and a tangible though wordless assertion of their human dignity: "We spoke to them not with words but with our hands, kneeling beside them, bathing their faces and bodies, encouraging them with friendly gestures" (see Liturgy of the Hours, Volume 4, p. 2018). 



TIPS FOR ALL WORSHIPERS — What to Expect

<u>BEFORE YOU ARRIVE</u> — *Check your temperature: if you have one, please do not come to church. *Stay home if you are ill. *Make sure you have a face covering to bring and wear. *Make sure to register by calling the office or registering online..

<u>WHEN YOU ARRIVE</u> — #Enter only in marked doorways. #Wait patiently to be checked in by greeter. #Keep your face covering or mask on at all times except for receiving Communion. #Sanitize your hands as directed by greeter. #Observe social distancing at all times (look for marks on the floor). #Ushers will direct you to pews with markings showing where to sit. #Since there will be no passing of baskets for your offering please leave your offering in the boxes provided at the entrance and exit areas.

<u>DURING THE SERVICE</u> — *Do not change seats during a service. *There will be no passing of offering baskets. *No physical sign of peace will be exchanged during Mass. *Follow instructions for Communion:

Leave your seat only when directed by usher or greeter. • Maintain six feet social distancing in the Communion line – look for marks on the floor. • When 12 feet or two people away from the priest, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces. • Approach the priest only after you are called forward. DO NOT remove your face covering. • Extend a single hand to receive the Host. • After moving six feet to the right or left, remove your mask and consume the Host. • Replace your face covering or mask. • Follow instructions to return to your pew.

<u>AFTER THE SERVICE</u> — #Please take any worship aids you may have brought with you. #You will be dismissed by pew or seating area. Follow the instructions of the greeter or usher. #Use only the designated exit doors. #Do not congregate outside the church doors. #Continue to wear your face covering or mask until you leave the area where worshipers are.

While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 any time they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.
