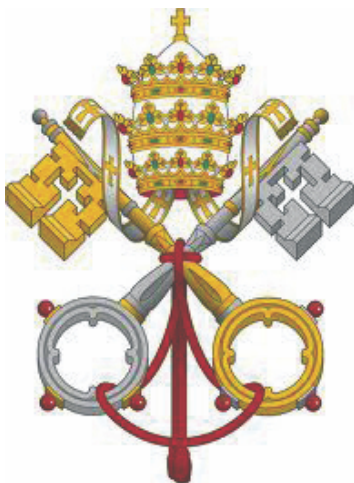
Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

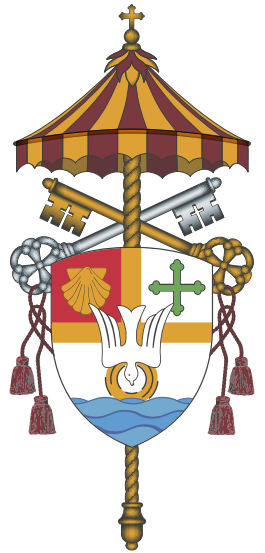

Catechesis

To display the Papal Keys and to have a special Coat of Arms are the final physical signs of a minor basilica. The Papal Keys, which are engraved at every entrance of the Basilica of St. John the Baptist, are made up of the papal tiara and the two keys of Peter, crossed over each other like an X. This is a symbol of the Vatican and the Pope himself. This same symbol adorns the white and gold flag of the Vatican City State, which hangs in both of our churches. The Coat of Arms of the Basilica,



which you can find hanging near the Altar of the Blessed Virgin Mary, has much beautiful imagery. Above the shield, you will find the ombrellino and the crossed keys, which are a sign of our basilica status. In the top right hand corner, as you face the shield, you will see on a green cross on field of white, which was taken from the Coat of Arms of the Diocese of Youngstown, which in turn took this same cross from the Diocese of Cleveland. This recalls our rich history in both dioceses as one of the first parishes established in Northeast Ohio. In the top left corner, you will find a golden seashell on a field of red. This is taken from the Coat of Arms of Pope Benedict XVI, who raised St. John's to a Minor Basilica in 2012. It is the custom to borrow a part of the coat of arms of the pope who elevates the church to a basilica for the new arms. The shell was selected because of Baptism, during which it is customary to use a seashell to pour the water over the head of the child. Below this we find the Holy Spirit descending in the form of a dove over the waters of baptism. This is to remind us of the work of our patron, St. John the Baptist, who saw the Holy Spirit descend upon Christ following His baptism by John in the Jordan River.
