SUMMER SERIES

In the summer, everyone's life gets busy. There are things to do and places to go. I am no different than you. Now that I feel like I am getting settled, I plan to take it a little easier. So instead of writing "new" articles, I am going to share with you a series of articles that I had written based on the "Ten Commandments". So unless something more earth shattering happens in the upcoming weeks, I will share with you my thoughts on the commandments and how we can put them to use as we continue in this millennium. The series is called: *"Living in Y2K, a Catholic Perspective"* I hope that you enjoy them!

FIRST COMMANDMENT:

"I am the Lord your God, thou shall not have any false gods before me."



Ever since the television came into the American home, help with occupying a child's time has been significantly covered. Cartoons, Mr. Rodgers and Captain Kangaroo were my playmates as early as I could remember. Then the invention of home video games raised the bar for entertainment. Now, toddlers have the TV and the pre-teens have their videos. The computer and the Internet can entertain our teenagers and occupy hours of their time safely under our roofs. No more worries about hanging out on the street corners or in the local malls.... No, they are satisfied to just go to their room and explore the world. The concern though, has always been: "Is it entertainment or idol worship?" The hours, the dedication, the priority that children show toward the images on the screen is almost cultic....

She's 13, but she dresses and looks like twenty-five. Her dream is to be a model, so looking like Barbie is more important than playing with Barbie. Mom and Dad think it's great. Maybe a little too much so soon, but what could it hurt.... She is only thirteen.



In today's world, God is whoever we want to serve that will bring us what we desire most. For Alicia Kozakiewicz, her beauty was her love and the computer was her God. It was the means to her salvation. At the shrine in her room and through the intercessory power of the Internet, the worship took place with her parents respecting her privacy. Under the e-mail address of **goddess of all @yipee.com**, you could read her profile, see pictures of her and even get a map to where she lived. In chat rooms she shared her desire to be a model and to be discovered. Perhaps she even expressed the fact that her parents thought she was too young... but one look at her pictures would make you believe otherwise. Perhaps it was a simple affirmation from Scott Tyree, a complete stranger, who promised to help her career to get off the ground. Even if she wasn't convinced that it was possible, he already had a map to her front door. Persuasion, in person, is always much more convincing. So they were off together, not to fulfill Alicia's dreams, but to fulfill his.

I cringed when I heard of this story on the news some time ago, and I prayed when I saw how clueless the parents were about what the Internet made available to their daughter. This is an extreme case, but nevertheless, it raises awareness for all concerned and loving parents. (Today, we have more Internet sites like Facebook.com and myspace.com that has caused many more cases of child kidnapping).

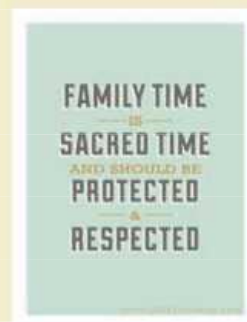
Supervision and Control - I remember my mom putting the television on PBS, and then removing the tuner dial so that when she left the room, we could not select one of the other three stations. The amount of time and what we watched was up to her and not us. These rules need to be established at a child's young age. Saint Paul said that all things are good in moderation. It is the indulgence of TV, video games, and the Internet that changes it from entertainment to worship.

Stick your nose where it belongs - All teenagers need their privacy, but not to the extent that it limits you in your ability to parent. Know whom your children talk to on the Internet. Know how to read their profile and the information that they put out to others. Know the web sites that they visit. Learn how to use the Internet and how to access downloaded data.



Would you allow your children to spend time with a stranger?

- 1) The computer should be in a public room of the house. If not, frequent the room where it is kept unannounced.
- 2) Ask what they are doing at any particular time while on line.
- 3) Limit the time and use of the computer.
- 4) Teach your child that it is a privilege to be on line rather than their right.
- 5) Always make yourself available to talk and listen.
- 6) Make them play with Barbie dolls and not look like one until they are 25.
- 7) Count on my prayers and support.

On Wednesday, September 8th, 9th grade students from the parishes of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton and Immaculate Conception will be confirmed by Bishop Kulick.

What is the Matthias Project?

The Parishes of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton and Immaculate Conception announced a new Confirmation program in 2019 for 8th grade students under the name: ***“Matthias Project.”***

The program focuses on the call of Saint Matthias to take the place of Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Jesus, and become the Faithful 12th Apostle of Christ!

The election of Saint Matthias takes place in the Acts of the Apostles 1:12-26. Recognizing that the role of the 12th apostle must be filled, Peter, lead by the Holy Spirit, calls for the election based on some very important criteria:



“Therefore, it is necessary that one of the men who accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day on which he was taken up from us, become with us a witness to his resurrection.”

The criteria of becoming an Apostle is the same for those who desire to be fully initiated into the life of Christ through the Holy Spirit. This is what Confirmation means: To “raise” up those who, through their life time, have been followers of Jesus (through baptism) and formed by His word, nourished in the Eucharist in hope of the resurrection. These members are called to be empowered by the Holy Spirit so that they may “act” in His name.

The Matthias project is the process for our students to understand the important role of the 12th apostle. The students, in the face of so many unfaithful baptized, must desire to meet the challenge of becoming witnesses to the love of Christ and His Church. They are training to embrace the Call of the Holy Spirit to be extraordinary in Faith and Holiness.

The Meaning of the Matthias Project Symbols

- ✚ The Matthias Breast plate symbolizes how St. Matthias lived and died
- ✚ The book of the Gospels represents the preaching that he did to spread the word of God’s Love
- ✚ The F of Fire and the Dove are Signs of the Holy Spirit.
- ✚ The Hatchet is the instrument of death that was used to behead this great Saint
- ✚ Our Students will become aware, over time, how important the Holy Scriptures will be in their instruction
- ✚ The Gifts of the Holy Spirit will, in turn, empower them to share the Good News to others
- ✚ The hatchet will be a reminder of the courage it takes to be faithful to the TRUTH in the midst of adversity



The Flaming M¹²

No, it is not a new element on the periodic table but it represents that Saint Matthias will be the patron Saint of the Class. The 12th power represents the students who will be forever linked as one (as a class) to the call of discipleship through the power of the Holy Spirit. Each member of the class will choose their confirmation name and share the name of Matthias with their classmates as a second name to identify with each other and this very important call to follow Christ.

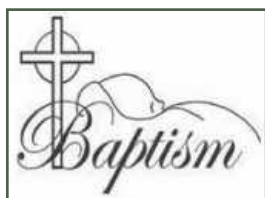

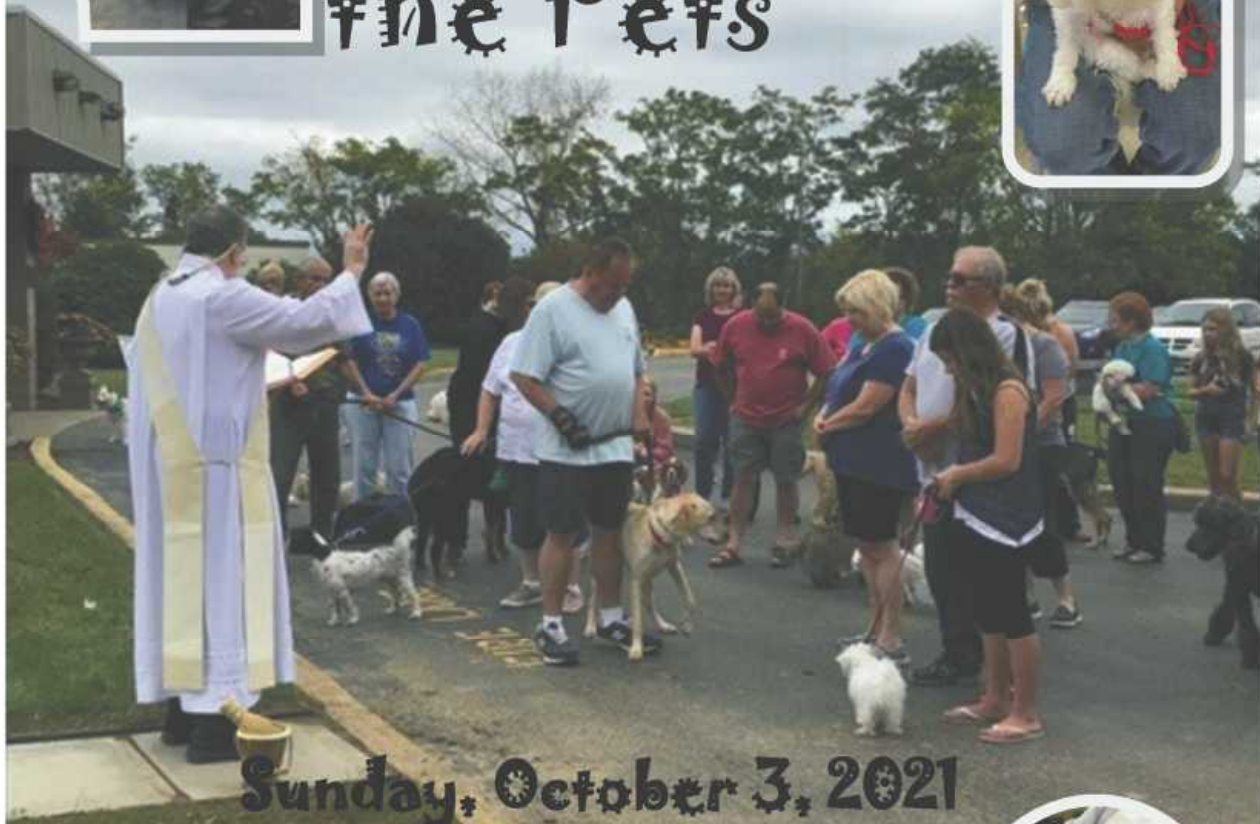
