

Thou shall not use the Lord our God's name in vain





He shook his dad, until he awoke from his slumber, and his father, looking at his son exclaimed, "Jesus Christ, what do you want now!?!?!?" Point well made!






Saint Paul made his point clear too: "Though He was in the form of God, Jesus did not deem equality with God something to be grasped. Rather he emptied himself and took the form of a slave, being born in the likeness of man. He was known to be of human estate, and it was thus that He humbled himself, obediently accepting even death on a cross. Because of this, God highly exalted Him and bestowed upon Him the name above every other name, so that at Jesus' name, every knee must bend in the heavens and on the earth and every tongue proclaim to the glory of God the Father: JESUS CHRIST IS LORD!"

In Y2K+17, we must be a witness of the counter culture and be very careful in our speech. If the name of God is used as a common fourletter-word in anger or frustration, what message does this send to our children? Make it a practice to bow your head at the name of Jesus. Teach your children to do the same. Don't express your anger and impatience by renaming loved ones or with the intention to send objects and others to eternal damnation. By keeping His name holy, others will be exposed to holiness and be lead to the love of our God who only desires us to be one with Him in heaven.




