REFLECTIONS FROM FR. ROSS



Happy New Year! It almost sounds funny, but it's true. We are at the beginning of another Church year with the arrival of this First Sunday of Advent. That means that Christmas is very near. I'm always a little concerned in that in the voices of many people I speak with about the approaching Christmas

Season, there appears to be a tone of semi-dread and almost a lack of looking forward to it. I often hear, "There's so much that I have to do: Christmas cards and gifts, get the house ready, all that cooking, etc."

For a while now, with the financial situation we are facing, we hear in the business that there is a lot of downsizing going on. It's an attempt to simplify and cut back so that a company or operation might become more efficient and productive. Perhaps we all need to downsize our approach to Christmas so that we will be able to participate in the true spirit of Christmas which is to celebrate the wonderful gift of God's love, shared with us and given to us in the birth of His Son, Jesus. Folks, this is what it's all about. If that's not at the heart of what we do, forget it. It becomes just one more thing to make our busy schedules even busier.

Part of Advent for me is to re-form and adjust my vision for the future as individuals, as members of families and as members of the Faith Community. We formulate that vision in the light of our relationship with God and in the light of truly knowing ourselves and where we are in our life's journey. As we attempt to fine-tune that vision, the following might prove helpful:

- -Funny how a \$10.00 bill looks so big when you take it to church, but so small when you take it to the store.
- -Funny how big an hour serving God looks and how small 60 minutes are when spent playing golf, fishing, or playing cards.
- -Funny how we get thrilled when a football game goes into overtime, but when a sermon is a few minutes longer that ususal.

- -Funny how laborious it is to read a chapter in the Bible and how easy it is to read 200-300 pages of a best-selling novel.
- -Funny how we believe what "others" say, but question what we are told in the Bible.
- -Funny how people scramble to get a front seat at any game, but scramble to get a back seat at church services.
- -Funny how we need 2 or 3 weeks to fit a church event into our schedule, but can adjust it for a social event at the last minute.
- -Funny how much difficulty some have memorizing a gospel passage to share with others, but how simple it is for the same people to understand and explain some "juicy" gossip about someone.
- -Funny how easy it is to point out the sins of others, but how difficult it is to remember our own since our last Confession of a year ago.
- -Funny how people are so consumed with what others think about them, rather than what God thinks about them.
- -Funny how everyone wants to go to heaven, provided they don't have to believe, or to think, or to say, or to do anything that will be difficult or demand a sacrifice.

The beginning of the Liturgical Year is a good time to make that New Year's resolution. What do I need to change? What is bothering me about me? As I look at my life honestly, what's really wrong? Am I trying to convince myself that my attitude and/or habits are really not that bad? What direction is my life really taking? Where is it really leading I? What are my life's goals? At the beginning of this Advent Season let us all take some time to look at our lives in the light of God's

love for us. True change begins with one change. It's important to remember that the only person we can change is ourselves, and, when we change ourselves, we really change the world. Again,
