## 2022 Lenten Fish Fry Recap

I want to begin by thanking all of our wonderful volunteers that gave their time and talent to help make our Annual Lenten Fish Fry a big success. We were able to offer a luncheon and dinner for 6 weeks through Lent. Without our fabulous fryers, preppers, servers, and everyone that brought in desserts week after week, we would not have been able to offer this fundraiser for our parish, school and community. A special thanks to those volunteers that came every week, your dedication to our parish and school is much appreciated!

For unknown reasons our last couple of weeks were much slower than previous weeks and from what was expected. But even with that decrease, I am pleased to report that our sales for the luncheons and dinners totaled \$14,459. We received a monetary donation of \$1,500. Total Expenses would have been \$7,233., but \$2,031. of those expenses were in kind donated supplies. In the end, we were able to profit \$10,768. in the 2022 Lenten Fish Fry Fundraiser!

Once again, thank you to all our school parents, and parishioners that work towards the betterment of our congregation and school for any and all fundraisers throughout the year. I look forward to working alongside each of you at the Ice Cream Social next!
