Watershed Public Charter School finds a building in Baltimore County



<u>Christina Tkacik Contact Reporter, The Baltimore Sun</u> A new charter school in Baltimore County is one step closer to becoming a reality. The founders of Watershed Public Charter School say they have found a building for their school in Woodlawn.

"Our new building has plenty of green space and lots of potential!" a spokesman wrote on Facebook. The space is at 6946 Dogwood Road in Windsor Mill, formerly home to John Paul Regional Catholic School, which was closed by the Archdiocese of Baltimore last year. According to its website, Watershed will open in fall 2019, serving grades kindergarten through third its first year and adding additional grades each ensuing year.

Charter schools are publicly funded and privately operated schools. Watershed will be <u>only the second to exist in Baltimore County</u>. Securing the proper location is a watershed moment for the fledgling school. In September, the Maryland State School Board reversed a decision by the local board to deny the school a charter to operate.

The local board had voted against giving the school a charter because it had not signed a lease for a facility to house the school. Watershed's leaders said they couldn't sign a lease or get a bank loan to renovate the space until the school had a charter to operate. The state school board said the county school system had put the school in an impossible situation — without the financing they couldn't get a charter but without the charter they couldn't get the financing.

The state board ordered the school system to give Watershed a charter to operate, but said it could deny the charter later if it failed to find a facility and secure the financing. The founders of Watershed Public Charter School say they will emphasize hands-on learning, creative expression and outdoor experiences. They envision a school with a working farm where children learn about plants and animals.

A new charter school in Baltimore County is readying to welcome its first classes of kindergarten, and first, second and third grade students by next September.

Watershed Public Charter School has found a 10-acre site in Woodlawn and is customizing the grounds to fit its specific mission. It will open next fall at the former John Paul Regional

School site at 6946 Dogwood Road. It is a major step forward for the school, which fought to gain its charter to operate earlier this year.

<u>Jessie Lehson</u>, the school's executive director, said Watershed plans to welcome up to 176 students in K-3 classes its first year. Each grade will have two class sections, with up to 22 students per class. There will be eight classroom teachers, up to four specials teachers, and special education or English as a second language teachers as needed.

"We will grow a grade each year thereafter until we get to eighth grade," Lehson said.

Any student that resides in Baltimore County is eligible to attend the new school, regardless of the public school zone they live in. If more students apply then there are spaces available each year, Lehson said Watershed will award spots based on lottery system.

Watershed is able to open due to a decision by the Maryland State School Board. The Baltimore Sun reported in September the state board reversed a vote by the local school board to deny the school its charter until it found real estate. The state board said the vote had put in an impossible, as it was not able to sign a lease or secure renovation financing without first receiving its charter.

Now that the school has identified a suitable operating site, it is using state grant funding to renovate and update the property. There is an existing functional school building on the site that needs some repairs, Lehson said, as well as a small wooded area and a stream. Watershed also plans to add a micro farm and outdoor classroom space.

Lehson noted the site fits well with Watershed's intended focus on outdoor space and experiential learning. The non-profit charter school was conceptualized by a group of parents and educators in Baltimore County that wanted kids to have access to ample physical activity during the school day, and hands-on learning that incorporates the outdoors. Watershed hopes it unique curriculum will improve students' academic performance and attitudes toward school and learning.
